Ambassadors of Good Will



For several years Southwest has been proud, and justly so, of its outstanding foreign language department. Offering a wider and more comprehensive selection of courses than any other Kansas City high school, our language department this year introduced into its curriculum a course in Russian. Even though the study of the difficult tongue proved hard work for twenty-seven Indians, the enthusiasm inspired by this rather unusual innovation remained undimmed. A new aid to learning German, as shown below, was the practice of recording passages and then replaying them to detect the mistakes in pronunciation and inflection. As usual, Caesar's campaigns and Cicero's oratory offered a challenge to the Latin classes, while contemporary literature captured the interest of French and Spanish students. Surely every Southwest student should take pride in the outstanding advances of our excellent language department.

Several of Miss Guyer's American history students will have a decided advantage over other college freshmen next fall. The fortunate seniors who participated in Southwest's first Advanced Placement class may receive up to five hours of college credit for successful completion of the enriched course. Wide reading, frequent discussion, and individual research into varied topics give the students in this class a more thorough understanding of the subject than they would receive in a regular high school course.

This challenging type of work has proved to be not overly difficult; on the contrary, every student has thoroughly enjoyed a stimulating course taught by an excellent teacher. Doing college work in high school is indeed a rare privilege; it is hoped that in the future the program will be expanded at Southwest in order to give this valuable educational opportunity to a greater number of students.












Debby Young ROTC Queen














One of the high spots in the Revels is provided by the Male Octet.



Two players, Charles Hess and Dan Schmelzinger, won berths on the All-City Squad. With several lettermen returning, we can expect a better season next year.







The Southwest cindermen of 1957 were tagged by many as the "finest track team in the history of the school," but the speedsters of 1958 were no less than fabulous. The returning lettermen, bolstered by a group of great new stars, streaked through the season undefeated. They came in far ahead of the field in both the State Indoor and Outdoor meets. Then, for diversion, the thin-clads turned in winning performances at the St. Joseph Relays and the City Meet.

Coach Ewing, voted "Coach of the Year" by local sports writers, deserves special praise for guiding the Indians to their third state championship in four years. In the State Outdoor competition, the squad scored forty-two points, which gave them a twenty-two point margin over second place Ladue High School of St. Louis. The fleet-footed 880 relay team, timed third in the nation, easily broke the state record in that event. In the final triumph of the undefeated season, the Indians were tremendous, scoring 115 points at the City Meet. Without a doubt the '58 tracksters were the finest team in the history of the Southwest.

Southwest Romps Through Track Season

It is impossible to speak of the 1958 track team except in superlatives. By the season's end, they were known as the best team in the region, possibly the best in the nation. The key to such a reputation lies in the excellent team balance.

First, the Indians had an invincible strength in track events. The dash men, led by Stu Paterson, were consistent winners. Jim Baker and John Laing garnered points in the 440 yard dash, an event in which Baker holds the state record. Throughout the season Southwest's teams broke record after record in the relays. The Indians excelled not only on the track, but also in the field. Paterson and Jack Prather in the broad jump usually placed high, often first and second, while in the pole vault and shot-put, the Indians won still more points. Even with such talent, a great coach is necessary to produce a championship team. Southwest was fortunate to have Coach Ewing, who ably brought the team together. Hence, it was inevitable that the 1958 track champions should reach the pinnacle of success and renown.







Monsees, who died on May 13, 1958, will long be remembered not only as the first principal of Southwest but also as a friend and counselor. In his capacity as an educational administrator, he touched the lives of thousands of young people. Southwest's nation-wide recognition as a school of high scholastic attainment may be attributed, in a large degree, to the man who established and directed its policies for twenty-five years. He was a man of high ideals and integrity of character, dedicated to his profession, esteemed by all who knew him.
