## *We Had Fun in '61*

The school year of 1961 was interesting to say the least. There were many new faces at Southwest when the doors opened in September, but they soon blended with the familiar and a unified student body emerged. Although the world was visibly shaken by many events—the Congo crisis, Castro's Cuba, and Khrushchev's capers—the students were comparatively unmoved in their own Southwest environment. They did not completely ignore the outside world, however. For several months they were divided over the election of a President of the United States; but when the results were in and it was learned that John F. Kennedy had narrowly beaten Richard M. Nixon, Southwest students, like the rest of the nation, patched up their differences and gave their support to the new administration.

Several new ideas were accepted wholeheartedly by the students; among them were Sa-Mo-Ja-Bar, the spring carnival, and the

*Sachem* queen. There were three foreign exchange students and nine National Merit Scholarship finalists, and the basketball team captured first place in the pre-season Interscholastic League Tournament. The top eleven people in the senior class had grade averages over 4.0, with the highest being 4.582, all due to the extra point system. On the economic side of Southwest life all departments, clubs, and publications were in a financial pinch due to the low income from the activity ticket. But in spite of some trials and some failures, everyone—the eighth graders who return next year to join their favorite clubs and organizations, the freshmen who come back to be joined by their counterparts from Bingham, the sophomores who return to begin the long, hard, final race to college, the juniors who reappear as seniors with their many plans to reform the school, the seniors who leave never to return physically as participating students but many times through fond memories—yes, everyone had some fun in 1961.

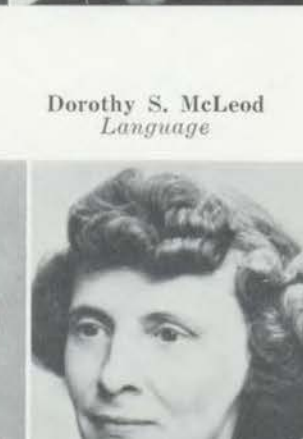
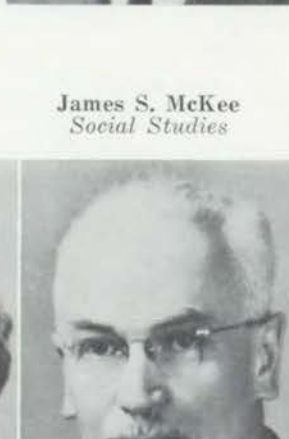

The class of 1961 brought many laurels to Southwest High School. Scholastically, they attained the highest level: nine seniors were chosen finalists in the National Merit Scholarship program. Athletically, they could not have asked for a more spirited group of players than those who bore the traditional school colors of orange and black onto the Interscholastic League playing fields. Several senior lettermen were chosen to become members of the All-City or All-District teams. Artistically, they earned many accolades: the speech team captured

first place in the University of Kansas City Speech Festival, and several students were awarded high honors in the annual Regional Scholastic Art Exhibition. In leadership, seniors were elected to the All-City Student Council and the All-City Red Cross Council. Probably the most significant accomplishment was the realization of a well-organized activities program from which all students benefited. These honors have added to the reputation of Southwest as one of the most outstanding high schools in the nation.

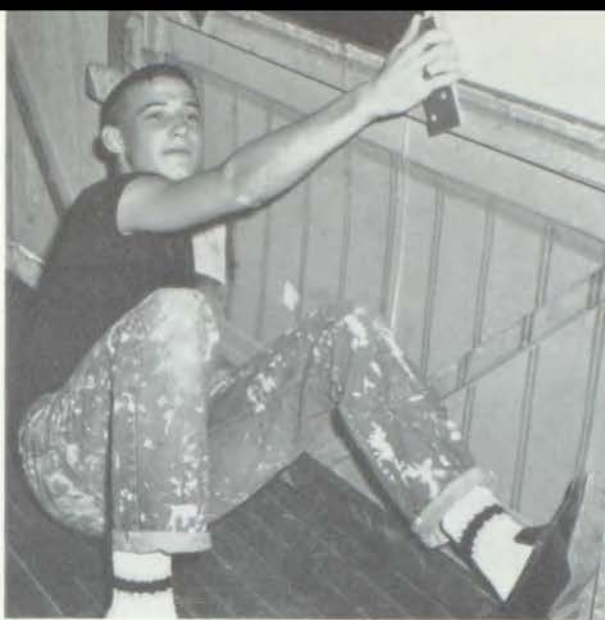

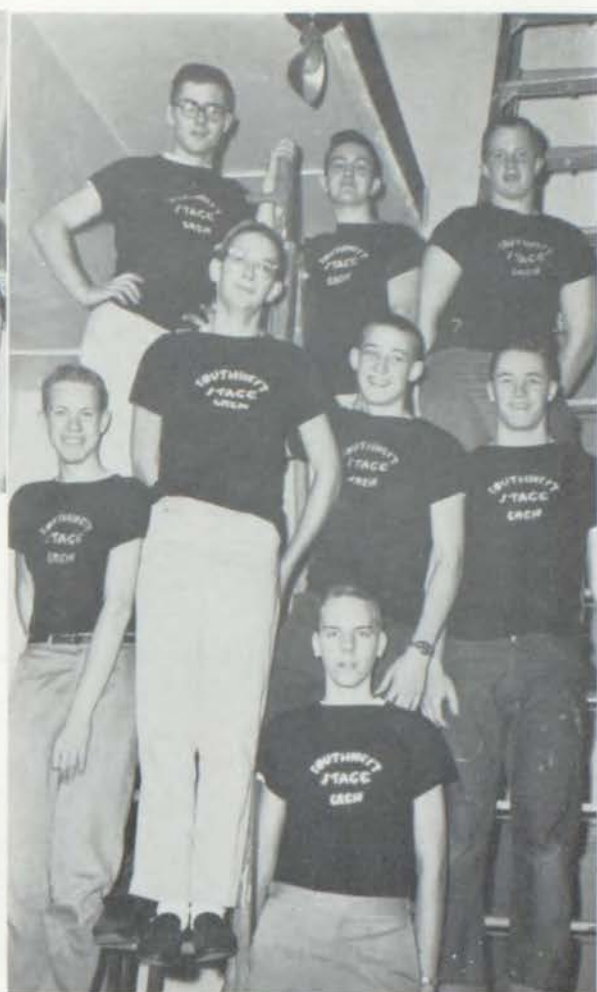

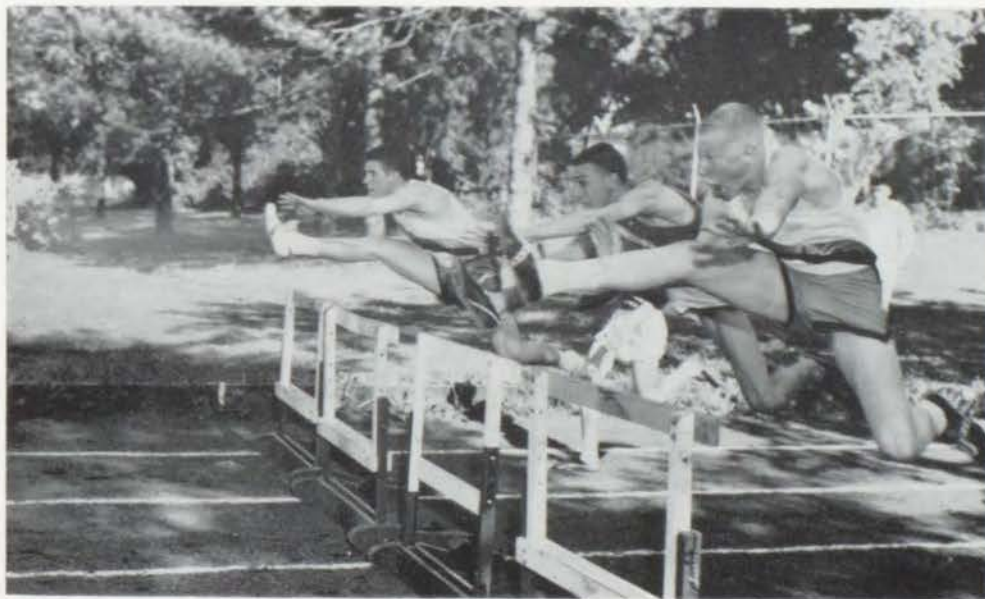

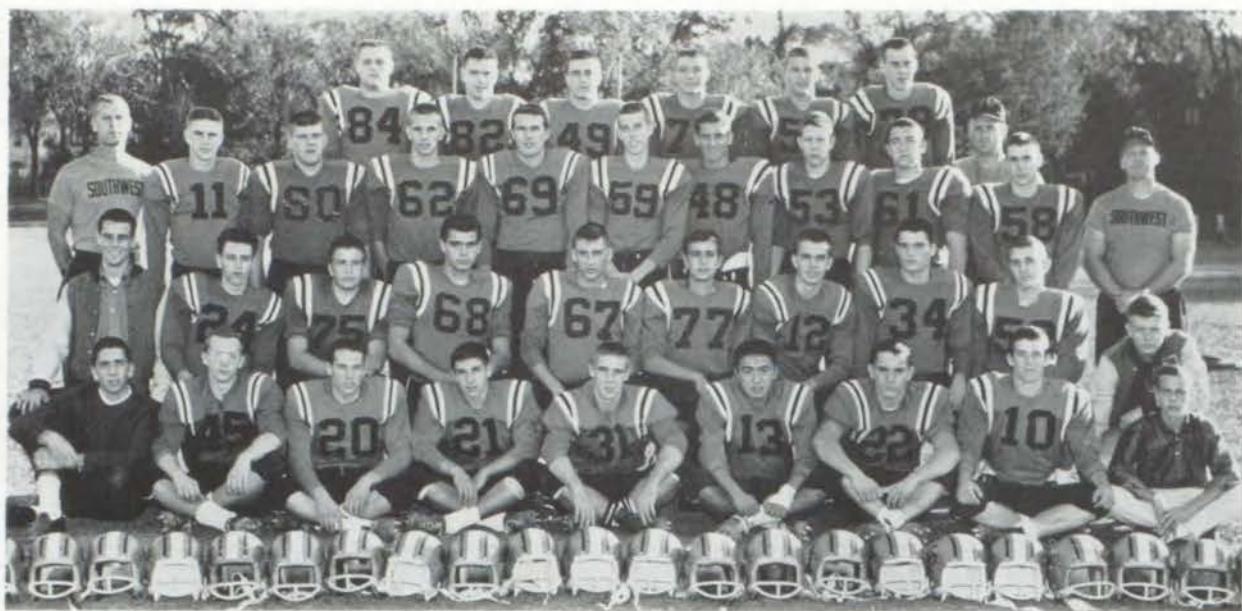

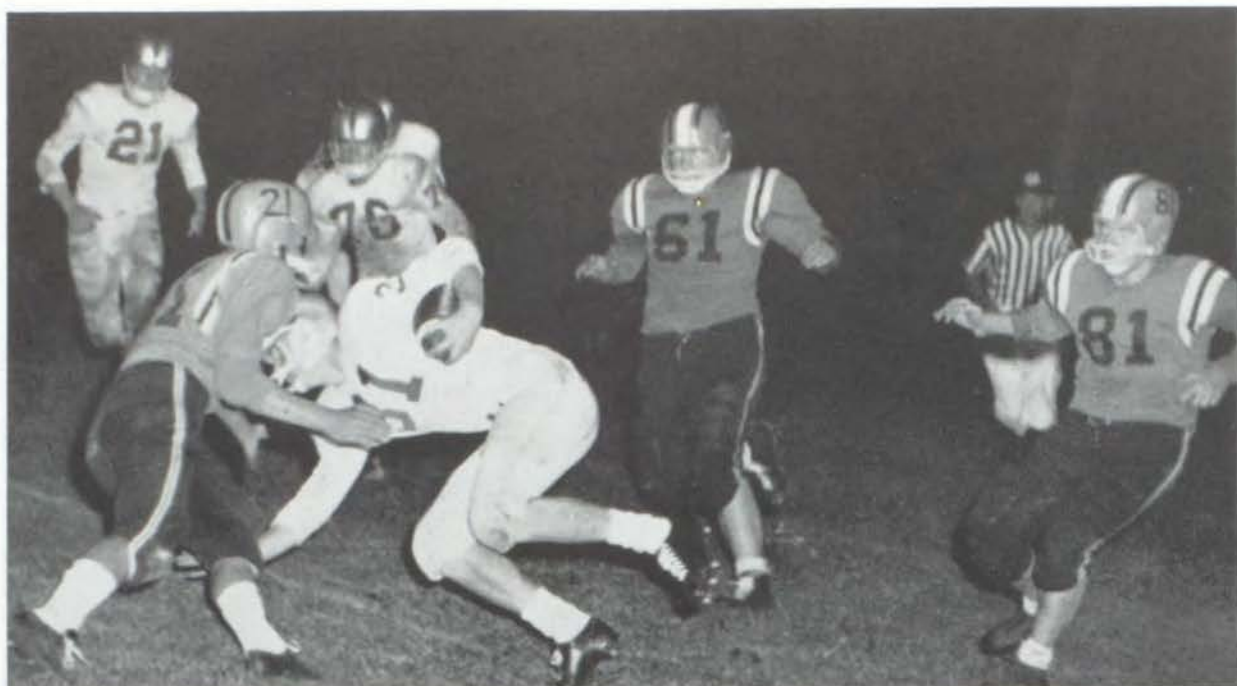

A completed pass leads to a touchdown.

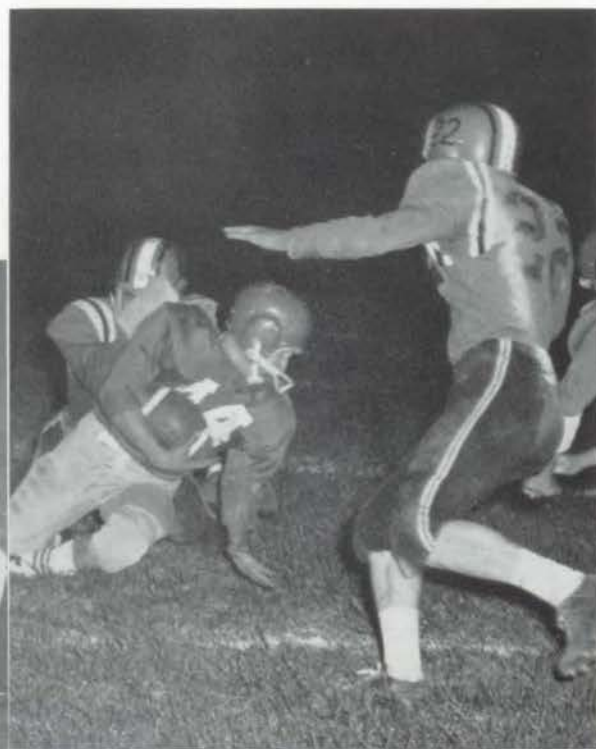

## *Roundballers Enjoy Fine Season*

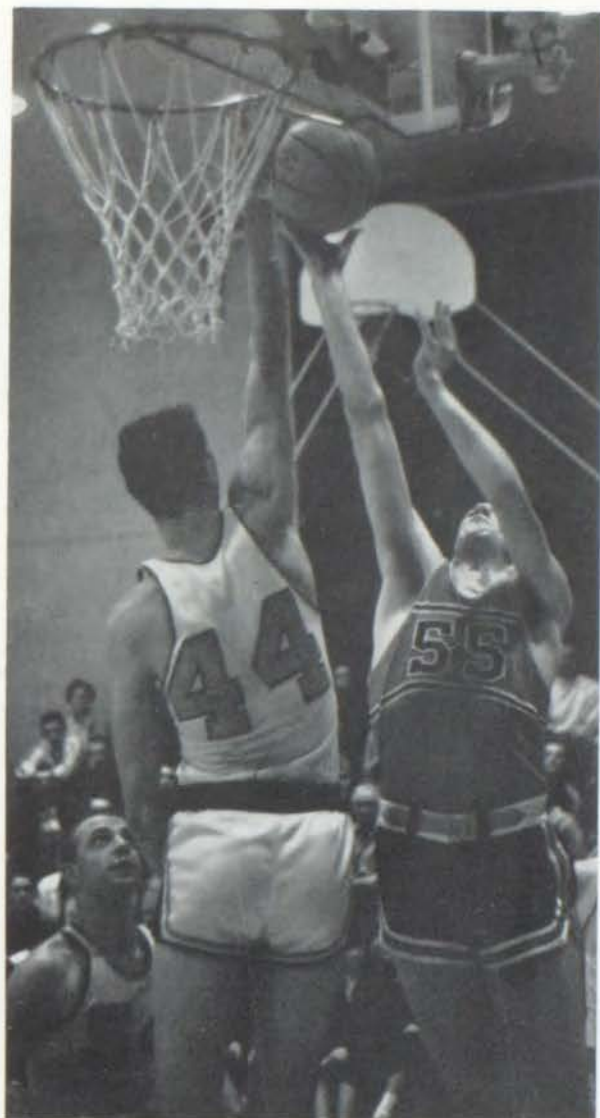

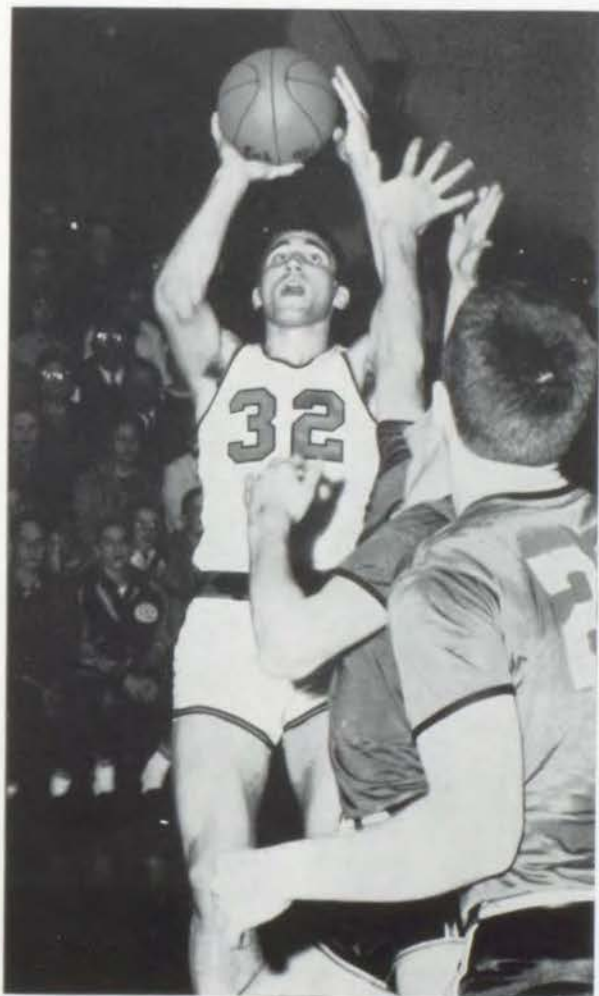

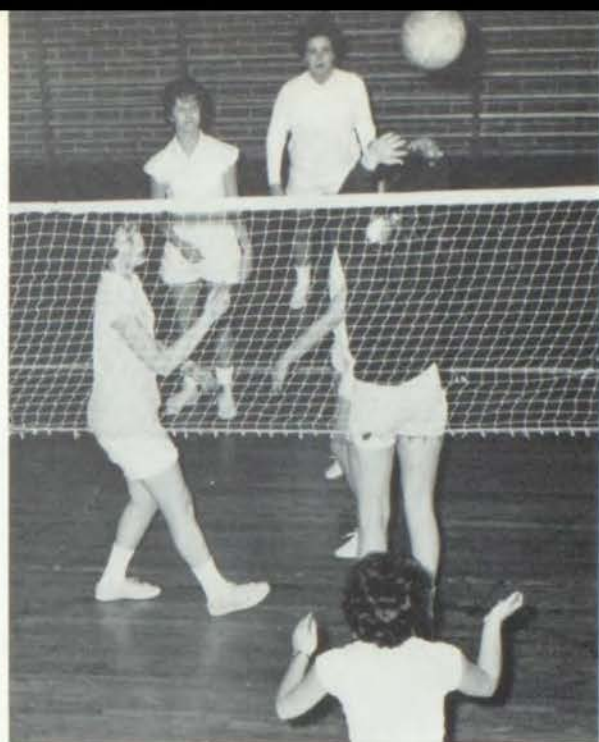
