For four years the seniors looked forward to their final year of high school, their stepping stone to life. Twenty-two seniors led the football team to its first Interscholastic League championship since 1951. The whirlpool bath, so long awaited by the athletic department, was finally purchased. Senior Day was initiated, and all enjoyed its varied activities. **The Unsinkable Molly Brown** proved to be unsinkable with two sellout crowds. Southwest's candidate was chosen mayor for City Hall day. In the field of scholarship, the class of '65 was by no means lacking, as there were fourteen National Merit Scholarship finalists, two of whom were chosen Scholars. Many of these things are transient and will pass away; others are intangible. But each of them will continue to live in the minds of those who helped to bring them about—the seniors of the class of 1965.

Literary Contest

When the laughter, cries, and confusion subsided, one club stood alone at the top. With five points, Aurora gained sole possession of the coveted cup, at least until next year when the hard-won position must be defended.

Southwest was ranked high in the 1964-65 pre-season ratings, and the Indians were out to prove this was justified. They got off to a flying start in the season opener against Center. Southwest showed that, along with an exceptional offensive line, it had a sparkling defensive unit as the Indian defenders recovered two fumbles, blocked a punt, and stopped the Yellowjackets from scoring from the one yard line.

The next game, against Central, was the Interscholastic League opener. This was expected to be the key contest of the season for the championship. After a stalemate for the first half, Central scored in the third quarter. A pass from Bill Hess to Harry Coe tied the game with 4:04 left in the contest, to keep the two teams even.

Northeast, Westport, and Southeast, the tribe's next three opponents, fell by the wayside to the surging Indians. Southwest put two long scoring drives together, against Northeast's one, to gain its first league victory. In their next game, against Westport, the offensive and defensive lines worked beautifully, coming up with the key plays when they were needed, as the tribe scored its second league victory. The cross-town rivalry came to a head in the Southeast game. Bill Robinson sparked the Indians to victory by a thrilling 67-yard scoring play. Two key pass interceptions were turned in by Mike Briggs to assure a Southwest victory. The Indians received their biggest scare of the season in the day game with Manual. The Redbirds fought hard and led Southwest going into the fourth quarter. With only 2:21 left in the game, Dennis Rains scored both a touchdown and the extra point to keep Southwest without a loss. The Indians next stormed by Paseo in a display of power football. Harry Coe scored 19 points and rushed for more yardage than the entire Pirate offense.

A "must" win was the final league game against upset-minded Lincoln. Southwest scored the first 3 times it had possession of the football; however, it took 3 pass interceptions in the fourth quarter by Harry Coe, Trey Bean, and Neil Sloman to give Southwest the victory and the Interscholastic Championship. Dennis Rains took scoring honors in this game with 20 points to his credit, half of the Tribe's total score.

Since this was the first unbeaten team since 1951, there were, of course, many standout players on both offense and defense. Dennis Rains was selected for the third team in the state and the first team at both the city and district levels. Gaining recognition by being placed on the second team in the city and also the second district team was Harry Coe. Mike Callahan and Pete Cortelyou achieved the first team in the city and honorable mention in the district selection. Bill Hess, Van VanOsdol, and Alan Potter gained honorable mention on both the city and district teams. Mike Briggs, Jim Caskey, and Maurice Rosga made honorable mention on the city team. While all these boys were standouts individually, it was the working together of all players that produced a great team—unbeaten, Interscholastic League champions, and the best team that Southwest has ever had!

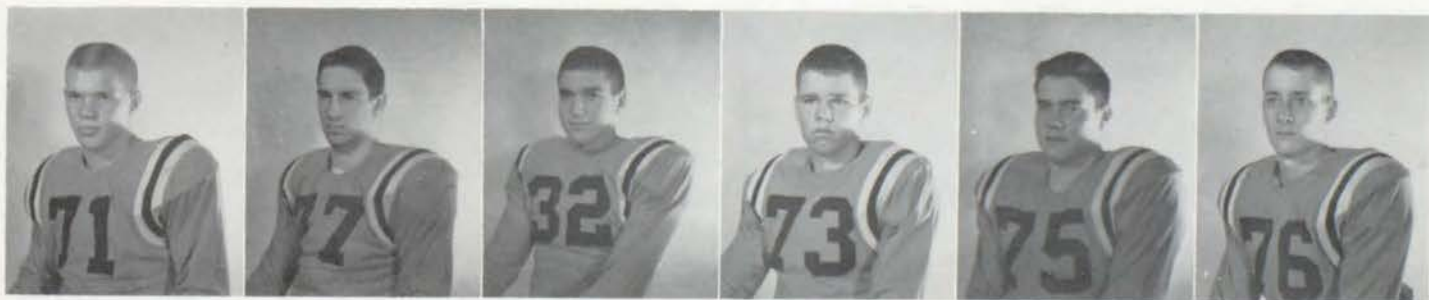

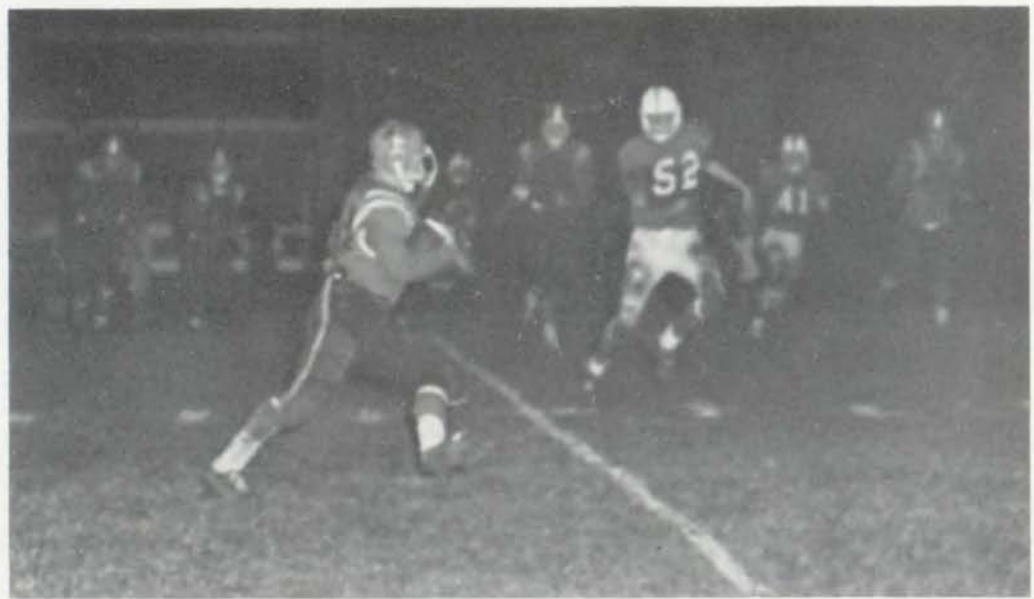

Basketball

The 1964-65 basketball season held much for the fighting Indians who fought through the season for a 10 win-10 loss record. The team opened the season with a fourth place finish in the Pem-Day Tournament and then began to prepare for the league opener against Lincoln.

The game was a terrific see-saw battle between the two squads as the lead changed hands many times. With five seconds left in the game, Johnny Young sank two free throws for Lincoln to edge Southwest by the slightest margin. Invading the team next were the Eagles from Central. The tribe could do no better than one field goal in the opening quarter, yet fought hard the rest of the way to try to overtake Central's insurmountable advantage. In the third game, against Van Horn, the Indians put together a balanced scoring attack and a decisive rebounding advantage to gain their first league victory.

Traditional rival, Southeast, winless against Southwest in any sport this year, again fell by the wayside in the fourth game. By hitting 31 of 41 shots from the foul line and controlling both backboards, the tribe led 44-38 at half time. Southeast started scoring in the second half, but the Indians rose to the occasion and kept the Knights at a distance with a tremendous display of teamwork. A hustling, pressuring defense and a hot shooting offense spelled victory for the tribe in the next game against Manual. Fritz Ziegler and Bruce Davis combined for 48 points while the defense constantly made Manual take the bad shot. The tenth rated Tigers from Westport were crushed in a power display in the tribe's seventh game. By hitting fifty per cent of their shots, picking 24 rebounds off the Westport backboard, and harassing the Tigers in a deadly man-for-man defense, the team dominated the game from the outset. In the next game, against Paseo, the two teams were evenly matched in the first half as the scoreboard showed Southwest leading by a scant 9 points. Paseo switched to a zone defense for the closing half and stopped the Indians' offense cold. For the last game, against Northeast, Southwest played flawless ball in notching its fifth victory. For every four rebounds off the backboards, the Indians came down with three of them. Although Fritz Ziegler hit the hoop for a stupendous 33 points, the tribe worked together so well that the Vikings couldn't do anything right.

Fritz Ziegler was selected for the first team in all-league consideration and the second team in all-district ratings, being the sole junior on both coveted teams. Bruce Davis made all-league second team, and Jack Rowe and Bill Hess gained honorable mention in all-league selection.

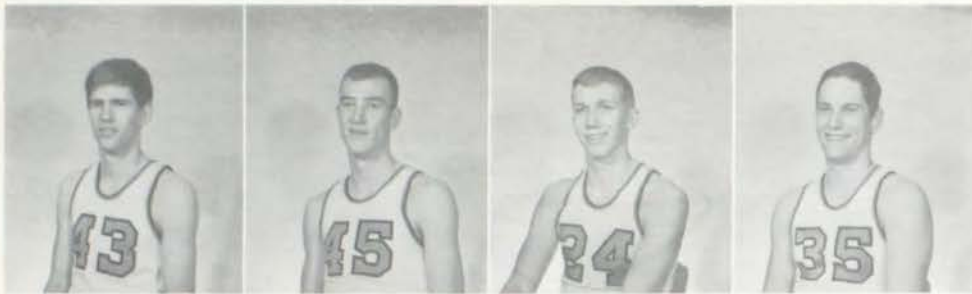

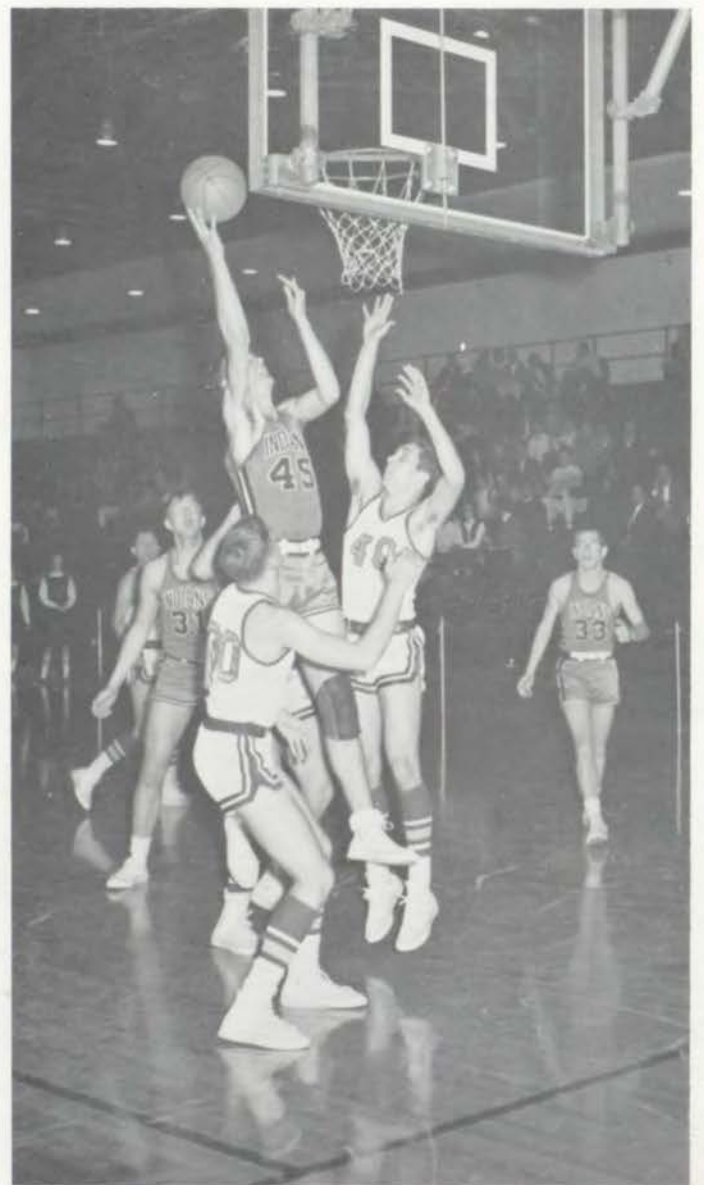

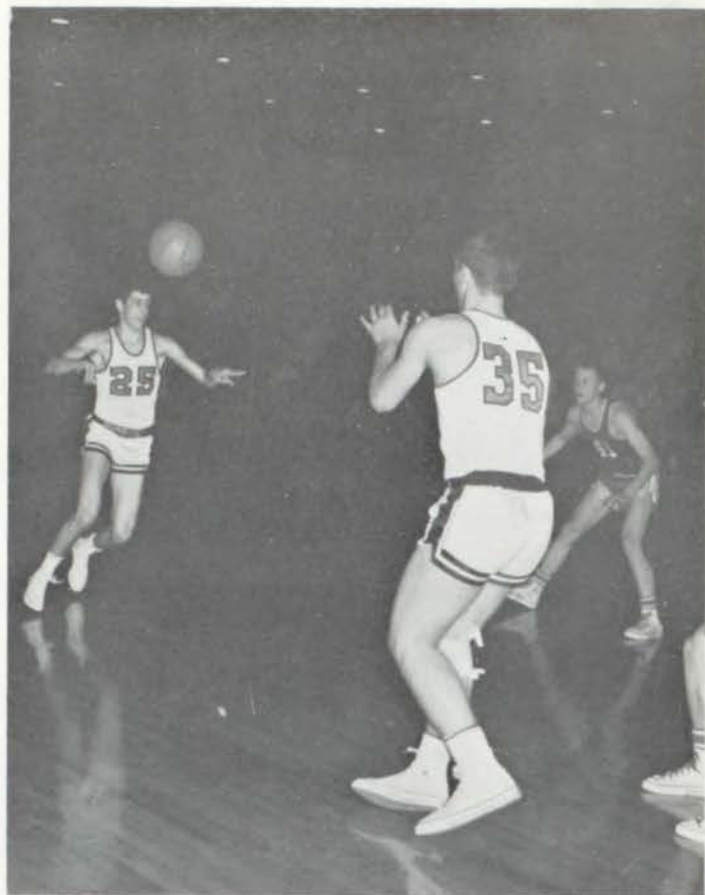

The 1965 track squad was a threat as the team gave everything it had in every meet.

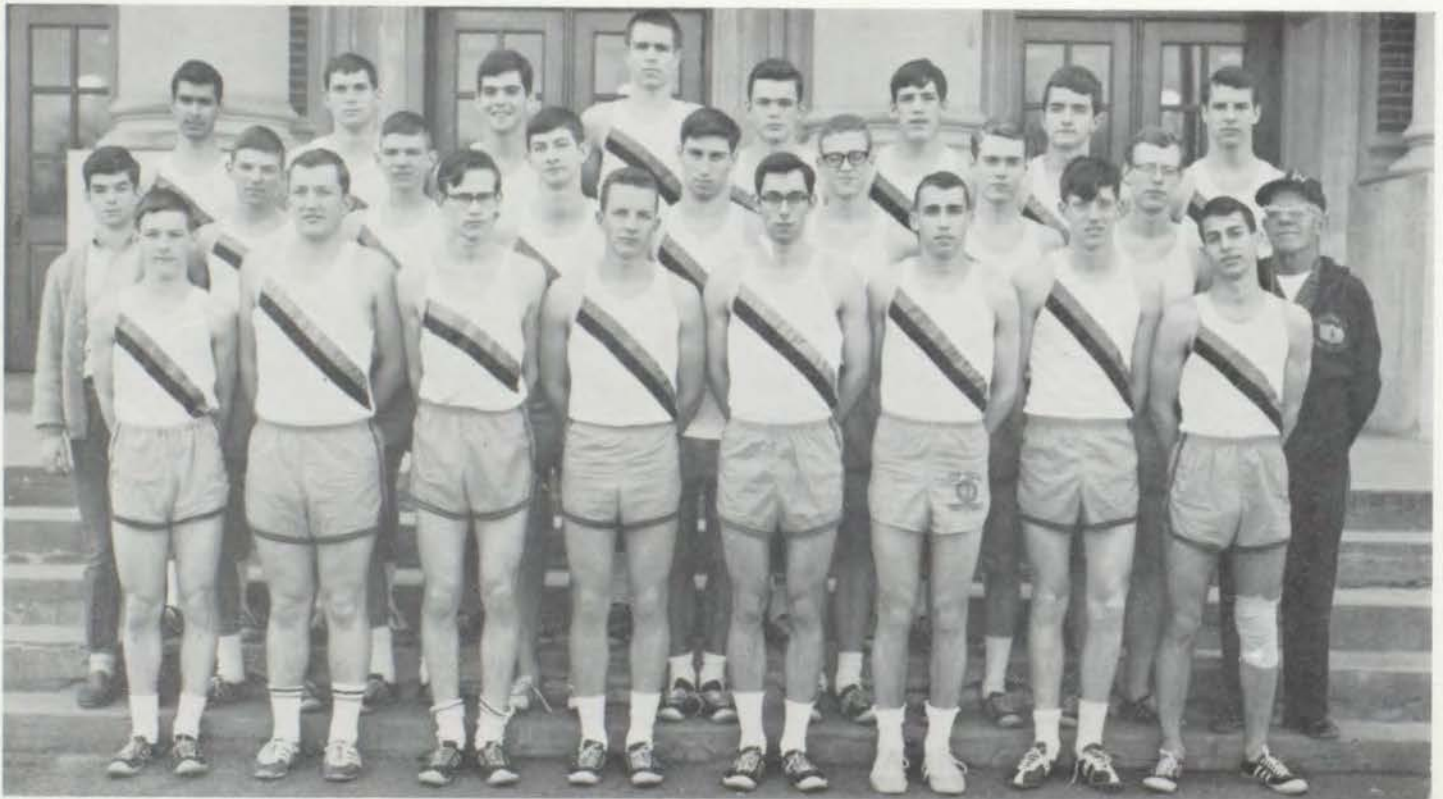

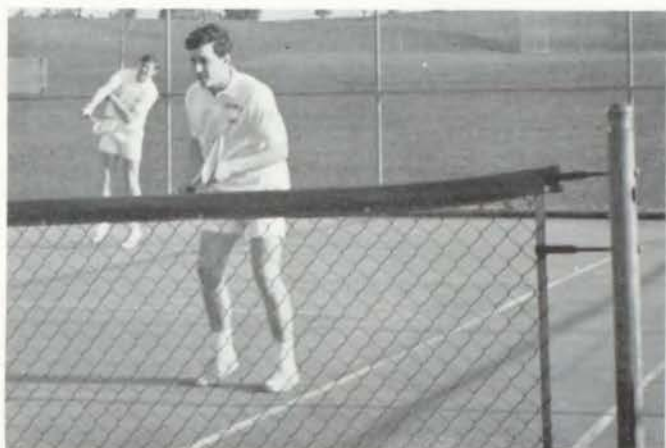

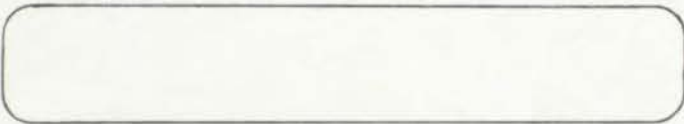
