The Student Council began planning during the summer months for the first semester of the 1968-69 school year. A little early effort on the part of the Summer Activities Council produced an informative INDIAN GUIDE to be distributed on Orientation Day and THE PATH which was mailed to students late in August.

Several of the dances first semester were sponsored by the Student Council. They included the Back-to-School Dance on September 6, victory dances following some of the winning football games, and the Christmas Dance.

This year's Student Council organized one of the most successful fund-raising campaigns Southwest has ever had. By selling 20,000 boxes of candy, interested students earned approximately \$10,000 for the Student Activities Fund which helps finance the Southwest Foreign Exchange Program.

The First Semester Student Council can be credited with some lasting accomplishments.

Combining with the Lettermen's Club, the Red Cross sponsored the "Dress-Down Dance" on Thanksgiving Eve. First semester the organization selected a local nursing home to aid, hoping to make this practice an annual project. Extending their interest in others, the Red Cross helped make 1968 a happier year for everyone.

### STUDENT COUNCIL



It has been said that the R.O.T.C. program's objective is to train "citizens and men, not just soldiers." In doing this the R.O.T.C. program has become one of the most varied courses in the school. Subjects range from drill, map reading, and American military history to hygiene and first aid. Advanced classes include the teaching of the psychology of leadership and military tactics.



# CAMELOT

As the curtain opens on CAMELOT, King Arthur is seen hiding in a tree, afraid of the idea of his forthcoming marriage. However, spying Guenevere running from her carriage and listening to her pleas to St. Genevieve convinces Arthur that he should indeed woo his queen. The royal couple returns to Camelot, Arthur promising to become the greatest king that ever reigned. From this point on, the King must meet his destiny without the counsel of his teacher, Merlin, who has been bewitched by the fairy, Nimue.

Acknowledging the senselessness of knights killing peasants, Arthur creates the Round Table where might is used only for right. One of the first knights to be attracted to the new order is Lancelot du Lac, an incredibly virtuous Frenchman. On his way to Camelot, Lancelot mistakenly knocks the King off his horse; but through this combat they become close friends and allies. Arthur obtains another counselor when King Pellinore, lost in search of the Questing Beast, wanders into Camelot.

Lancelot is introduced to Guenevere and the gentle folk while they are celebrating the Lusty Month of May. His ideals of perfection make everyone find him very pretentious and overbearing. Guenevere arranges for him to joust with the three best knights in Camelot to shake his lofty ego. Lancelot, however, defeats the first two and kills the third. The court discovers that the Frenchman really can work miracles for he brings Sir Lionel back to life.

Just before Lancelot is knighted that evening, he and Guenevere confess that they have fallen in love with each other. Arthur senses what has happened, but sacrifices his jealousy for the sake of his court and country.

Several years later, Lancelot and Guenevere still think Arthur knows nothing of their illicit affair. Not only does Arthur know, so does his illegitimate son, Mordred. Mordred comes to Camelot to undermine the Round Table in order to make his inheritance come more quickly. He raises dissension among the knights and to speed up his plan, persuades his aunt, the wicked fairy Morgan Le Fey, to build an invisible wall around Arthur as he hunts in the forest. Mordred returns to the castle, the trap set.

Unable to resist the temptation caused by the King's absence, Lancelot goes to Guenevere's bedchamber. He begs her to run away with him and she refuses, but suddenly Mordred and his men burst into the room. Lancelot escapes to Joyous Gard; Jenny is convicted of treason and must burn at the stake.

As Arthur is still deciding whether to "kill the Queen or kill the law," minutes before the execution Lancelot returns to rescue Guenevere. He solves Arthur's dilemma, but the battle is bloody and the Knights of the Round Table want revenge. Arthur takes his forces to Joyous Gard, his new order of chivalry completely destroyed. Lancelot and Guenevere go to Arthur, seeking to pay for their sins, but it is too late—Guenevere returns to the convent which is to be her home, and Lancelot to his army.

Just before the battle, Arthur discovers a young lad, Tom of Warwick. Reminded of himself when he was a boy, Arthur commands the youth to return to England and tell the story of Camelot, hoping that the ideals of the Round Table will be revived someday.





# VARSITY FOOTBALL

Among high schools, competing for the honor of being the best has long been uppermost in the minds of the students. Sporting events, which are a part of this competition, demand teamwork, all-out effort, natural ability, stamina, desire, and good coaching. The 1968 Southwest football team acquired and demonstrated these skills, and in doing so won the Interscholastic League Championship. The team scored more points than any other team in the area, rated second out of fifty-one teams in the final KANSAS CITY STAR poll, was named first in the final WHB Coaches' Poll, ranked fifth in the Star state-wide poll, and ended up as the only undefeated team in the area. Mr. Cannon called the 1968 football team the best in Southwest's history.

The team began working out twice a day August 15, and practice continued until the opening game against Rockhurst. Though Southwest controlled the game, the team failed to cross the goal line a second time to break a 7-7 tie. However, the next week the team showed what it was made of by demolishing Springfield Parkview 65-6. In the last non-league game, against arch-rival Southeast, Southwest reclaimed the Southside Trophy by defeating the Knights 44-7.


League play then began with an extremely muddy 76-0 victory over East. The next game, against Westport, was very tense. Southwest scored first, but after three vicious quarters of football, Westport led 14-7. The Indians could only rally in the fourth guarter to tie the game 14-14, although the Tribe controlled the statistics in all phases. The Homecoming game disappointed no one but Northeast with Southwest dominating the game more than the 20-6 final score indicated. Lincoln's Blue Tigers were next to fall, with the final result 46-6. The next game was one that would either make or break the team. The Tribe was up against Central, ranked first in the area and second in the state. The game was very close with no scoring made in the first half. In the third quarter Central scored first, but Southwest overcame a first and thirty-one to drive for a touchdown and extra point. However, on the following play the Eagles ran back the kickoff for an additional six points. Their conversion failed. The score stood 13-7 deep into the fourth quarter; then the Indians, containing the Eagles, drove to the Central 40 and scored on a Bruegging to Gifford pass. Reeve's extra point put Southwest in the lead for good, 14-13. In the next game Manual fell easily, 54-0. The last game started out badly with Van Horn scoring first on a safety, but the Tribe soon made up for it and beat the Falcons to claim the League Championship and become the only undefeated team in the area.

On top of the personal satisfaction that the players felt, there were many individual honors received. Bruegging's fine season earned him a place on the All-Metro, All-District, and All-State First Teams. Reeve and Brody made Second Team All-Metro. Southwest placed six players on the All-League Offense and Defense, and ten earned honorable mention.

In an outstanding year for football in Kansas City, Southwest was the best. Teamwork, all-out effort, natural ability, stamina, desire, good coaching—Southwest Football—1968.




















