

For many years, the main service organization at Southwest has been the Red Cross. During the 1970-71 school year, the Red Cross became greatly involved with the inner-city and the problems of the needy. Members expressed their concern for the city's needs by tutoring children living in the inner city, passing out Human Rescue cards in the Westport area, participating in the National Council of Christians and Jews, and collecting food for people left hungry by the costly construction strikes. Two highlights of the year were the Christmas and Easter parties which Red Cross members shared with the children at Yates Elementary School, located in the inner-city.

The financing of Red Cross activities came as the result of two dances, the Baby Doll held in October and the Sadie Hawkins in the spring. As the year came to an end, it was comforting to know that the world was a little better due to the efforts of the Southwest Red Cross.

This year was the fourth year since ROTC was reinitiated into the Southwest curriculum. The senior cadets of this year had the opportunity to exercise leadership that no previous group of cadets had possessed. This leadership was used in the areas of organizing, training, and conducting classes.

Student leadership helped to maintain the tradition established by the Southwest ROTC Battalion. Southwest cadets competed in all-city competition and brought honor to themselves and the school. Three years of high school ROTC also had the benefits of higher pay and advancement possibilities.

The 1970-71 school year proved to be a year in which ROTC cadets upheld a tradition of education in military science. Cadets left Southwest better prepared to serve themselves and their country.



VARSITY FOOTBALL

For the third consecutive year, Southwest captured the number one position in the Interscholastic League. This year's varsity squad depended on hard hitting, good coaching, and above all, teamwork to achieve its goal.

As always, the Indians began their season against Rockhurst. Southwest controlled the ball in the first half, but was unable to score until early in the fourth quarter. Quarterback Wayne Kosman kept the ball and scrambled thirty-two yards for a touchdown. Rockhurst then scored on a fumble recovery and the game ended in a 7-7 tie. The next game, against North Kansas City, proved to be a disappointment as Southwest was defeated 14-9. The Indians ended the pre-season schedule with a 19-0 triumph over Shawnee Mission East.

Southwest began league play against the Manual Cardinals. The opponents scored on a quick touchdown in the opening minutes, and after a successful 2-point conversion Manual led by eight points. In the second quarter, the Indians recovered a Manual fumble, and two plays later were on the scoreboard. The conversion was good as the quarterback connected with Tom Hulsey in the end zone. Southwest came alive in the second half and scored three touchdowns to demolish Manual 27-8. Early in the next game, Peter Bastoe, a Southwest foreign exchange student, kicked a 38-yard field goal against Van Horn. Before the half, Walt Kosman scored on a 2-yard sweep. In the final game Southwest met Northeast in a battle for high rank in the league. The game ended in a 38-12 victory for the Tribe, clinching a tie with Southeast for the championship.









Special recognition should go to senior David Harrington, who finished the season with a 16.6-point average. David proved to be the backbone of the team, and was one of the top scorers in the League.












