There usually has been a pattern which Southwest Basketball follows. For the third year in a row no varsity team has won fifteen games. In the past ten years, 15-10 has been the best record Southwest has accumulated. Secondly, the squad starts off slowly, and after Christmas gains momentum.

The 1973-74 team followed but one of the above. Their final record of 10-13 overall, and 3-6 in league play keeps the fifteen wins intact. As for a slow start, this is where the team went wrong. At Christmas, Southwest was the proud owner of a 6-3 record which included two tough losses to Paseo and Central. After a twenty-four day period with no games in a row, Southwest was seeded third in the Center hard to come by, as the next fourteen games produced only four victories.

The season started as Southwest finished second in the Turkey Tournament, losing to St. John's for the championship. The League Tournament was held Dec. 3-8 in which the Tribe was seeded sixth. The Indians were pitted against Central in the quarterfinals, as a result of trouncing Van Horn 62-44. Southwest was stopped here, but this proved to be the most exciting game in the Tournament. The real bright spot in the season came when Southwest met Central again January 30. At the time, Central had a 13-1 record, was ranked No. 1 in the city and also state. 






final reflections

Orchestra President Jim Imbeau devoted his senior year to sampling a new lifestyle, one that shall be ignominiously unnamed.






