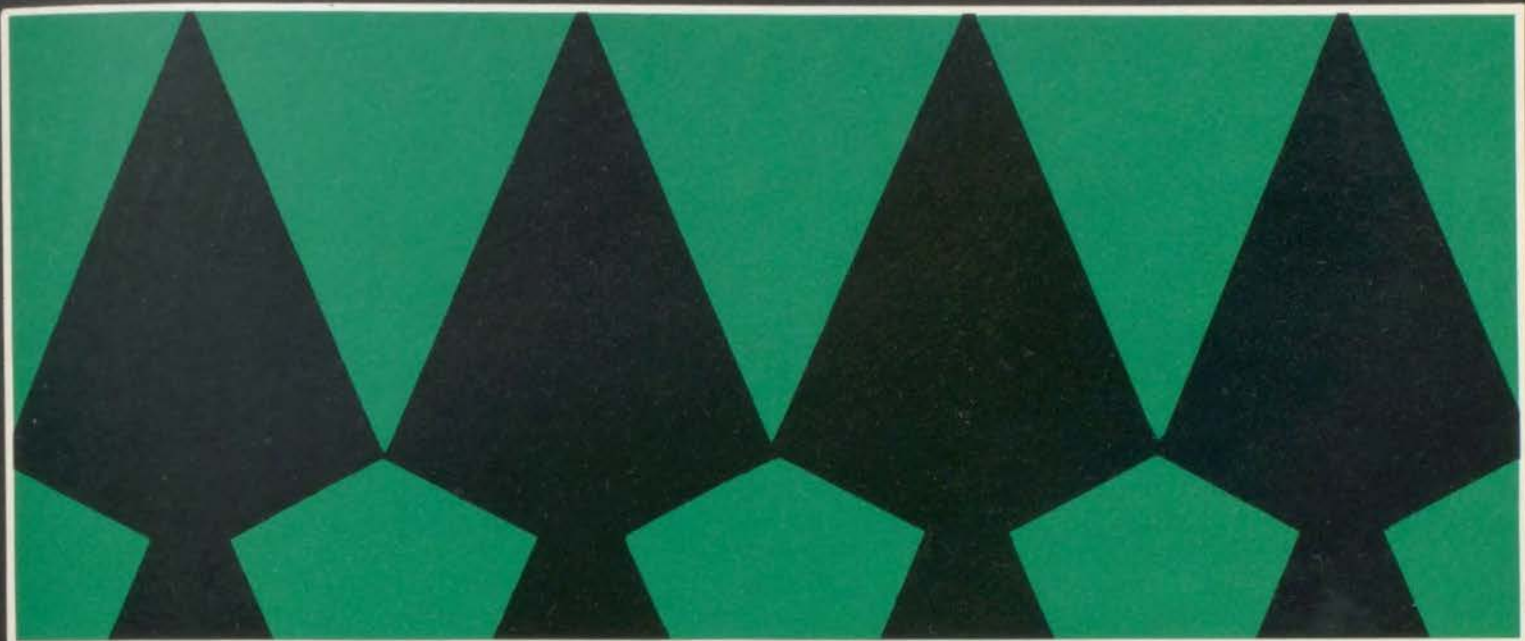

The 1973-74 team followed but one of the above. Their final record of 10-13 overall, and 3-6 in league play keeps the fifteen wins intact. As for a slow start, this is where the team went wrong. At Christmas, Southwest was the proud owner of a 6-3 record which included two tough losses to Paseo and Central. After a twenty-four day period with no games in a row, Southwest was seeded third in the Center hard to come by, as the next fourteen games produced only four victories.

The season started as Southwest finished second in the Turkey Tournament, losing to St. John's for the championship. The League Tournament was held Dec. 3-8 in which the Tribe was seeded sixth. The Indians were pitted against Central in the quarterfinals, as a result of trouncing Van Horn 62-44. Southwest was stopped here, but this proved to be the most exciting game in the Tournament. The real bright spot in the season came when Southwest met Central again January 30. At the time, Central had a 13-1 record, was ranked No. 1 in the city and also state. Led by Senior Mike Mazon and Junior Roger Schmitt, Southwest captured the major upset of the season, 56-47. This was only the second time in ten years that the Indians have prevailed over the Blue Eagles. After losing four games in a row Southwest was seeded third in the Center Regional. Many of those losses were extremely close and went down to the last second. The season stopped in the first game of the Regional as Center nipped the Tribe 55-52.

Had it been for more accurate shooting, many more games would have been won. Only a few times was Southwest ever blown off the court. A tight man-to-man, three-two zone, and the full court press saved many a game for the squad. Hopefully, next year will produce fifteen wins, because four starters will be returning next season.



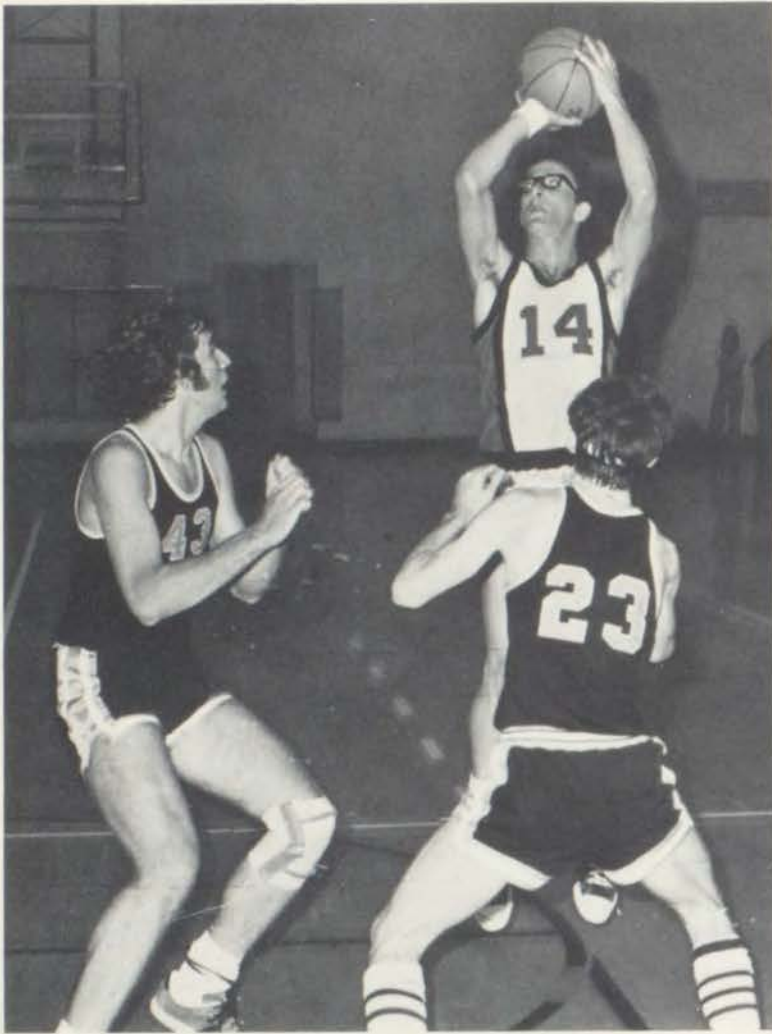

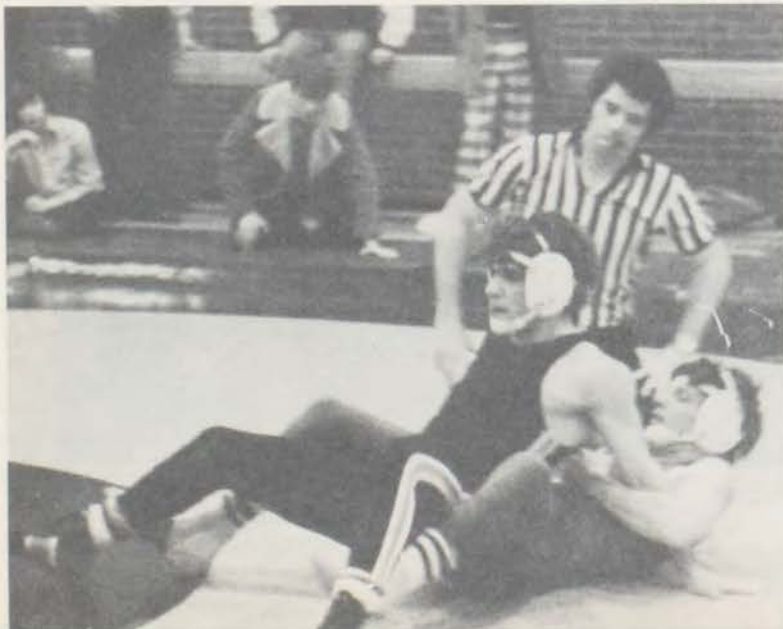

At this point, all Coach Robinson has left to offer Charlie Newell is advice.

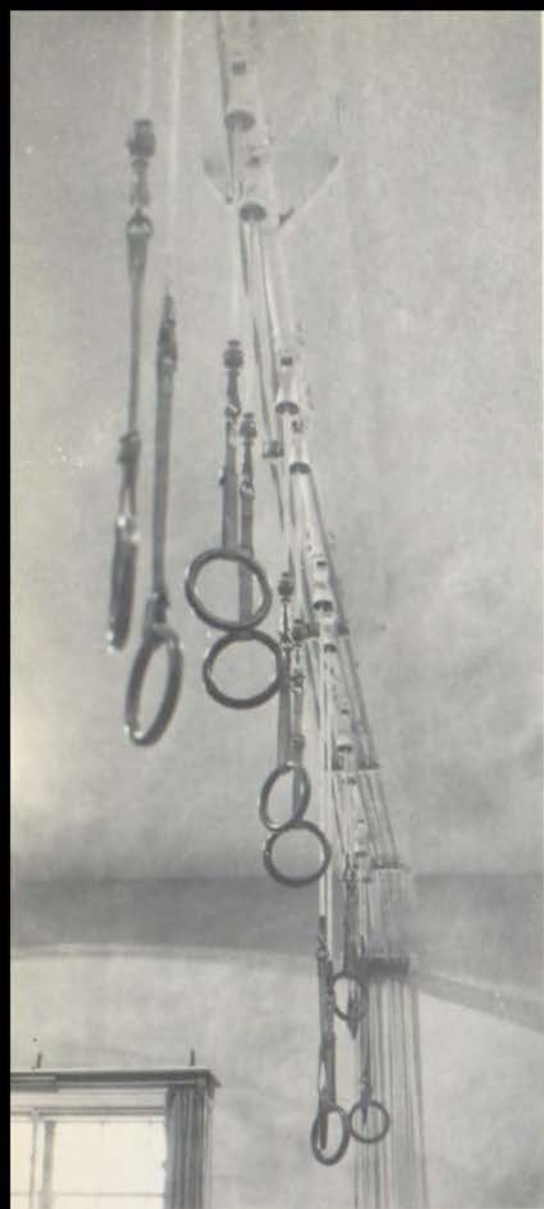




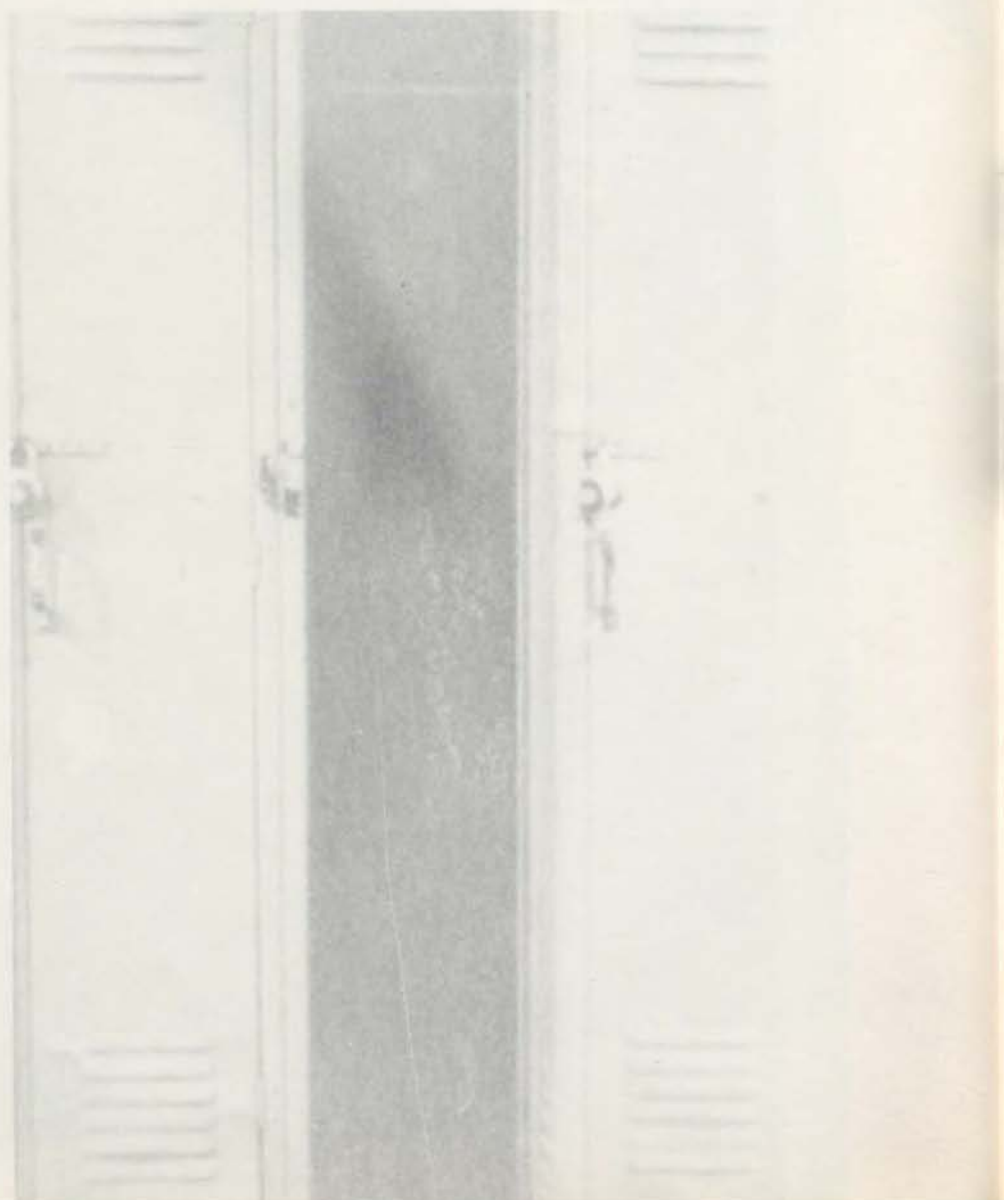

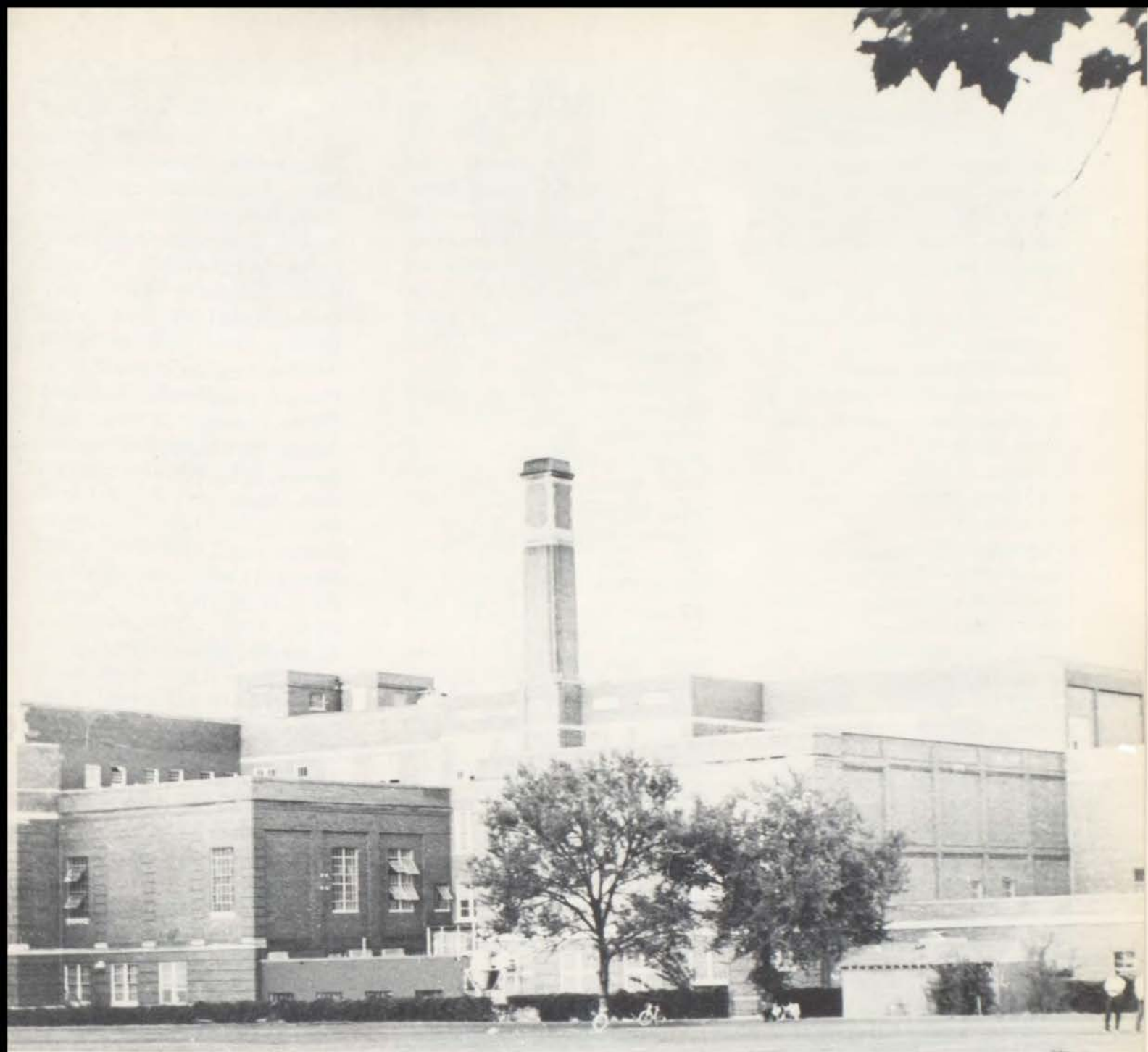
