There were solid victories against Interscholastic League teams which balanced out the dissappointing losses. The season ended quietly with no repeat of the previous year but with high hopes for the next season.













This year marked the beginning of the boys' soccer team at SW. Yes, after all the petitions and hard work, SW finally had a boys' soccer team!


The team consisted of 18 goal-hungry guys and their dedicated coach, Tim McCray.


There is always hope, though, and with a little of that famed SW spirit, 88-89 should prove to be a great year!

Homecoming





# JROTC Ball



### Prom






