Dedication: In Honor of 65 Years





TOUCHDOWN TO WIN

Football season has rolled around once again at Southwest, this year with a different twist. The team is headed by two new coaches, Bill Culpepper and Jeff Gourley. Both are science transition teachers at Southwest as well as being football coaches. The new coaches have tried to instill a positive attitude in the team that they hope will be effective.

The Indians got off to a rocky start this season with three consecutive losses, but things are steadily looking up. Southwest finally got on the scoreboard when the Indians scored a touchdown in a 33-6 loss to O'Hara on Sept. 29. On Oct. 6, the Indians were victorious with a 12-0 win over Lincoln Prep. The Southeast Knights were the Indians' next opponent on Oct. 14. SW got a touchdown early in the fourth quarter on a pass from quarterback Brian Hodges to James Robinson. The Knights prevailed, however, and the final score of the game was 12-7 SE. Next up for the Indians was Westport on Oct. 20. Southwest was victorious with a score of 7-0.


The next game for the Indians was the Homecoming game. SW played the Paseo Pirates on Oct. 27 in a torrential rainstorm. The Indians played well, but in the end, the victory went to Paseo. The final score was 8-6.

SW played the Central Eagles in District play on Nov. 4. The first quarter went scoreless for both teams. The second quarter began with SW catching Central's kickoff and running for a touchdown. At the end of the game, the score was tied and play had to go into overtime. Central prevailed and won the game 12-6.

Gourley said the only difficulties the team really has are mental discipline, aggressivness, and their desire level. All three are attainable with work and cooperation from all the team members, he said. Some of the players said, "The win over Lincoln has helped us with our desire level, and hopefully in upcoming games the team will continue to improve." Both coaches strive for a "total team concept." Of the Indians desire for a winning season, Gourley says, "To this point, the most inspirational player is Chris Murray, who is out for the season with a knee injury."

At the end of each season, League, District, and All-Metro selections are made. This year, nine players from SW were chosen. Dominic Foster, James Robinson, and Ricky Willis were Honorable Mentions for the IL League. Michael Cosby was selected in the League and received positions on the first team District, and second team All-Metro. Richard White, Ivan Griffin, and Maurice West were all chosen for the second team in the IL League. Sam Johnson and Ronnell Eldridge were selected for both the IL League first team and the District second team.

Southwest what they had accomplished this year. They had placed second place in the marching competition and are still preparing for the district competitions. They should be commended for their efforts and accomplishments.











At 12:00, midnight, the final results for the 1989-90, Homecoming Queen and King were in and ready to be announced. Shortly after, Monica Jones and



Hot Dancing on a Cool Night



















SBC "In Effect"
