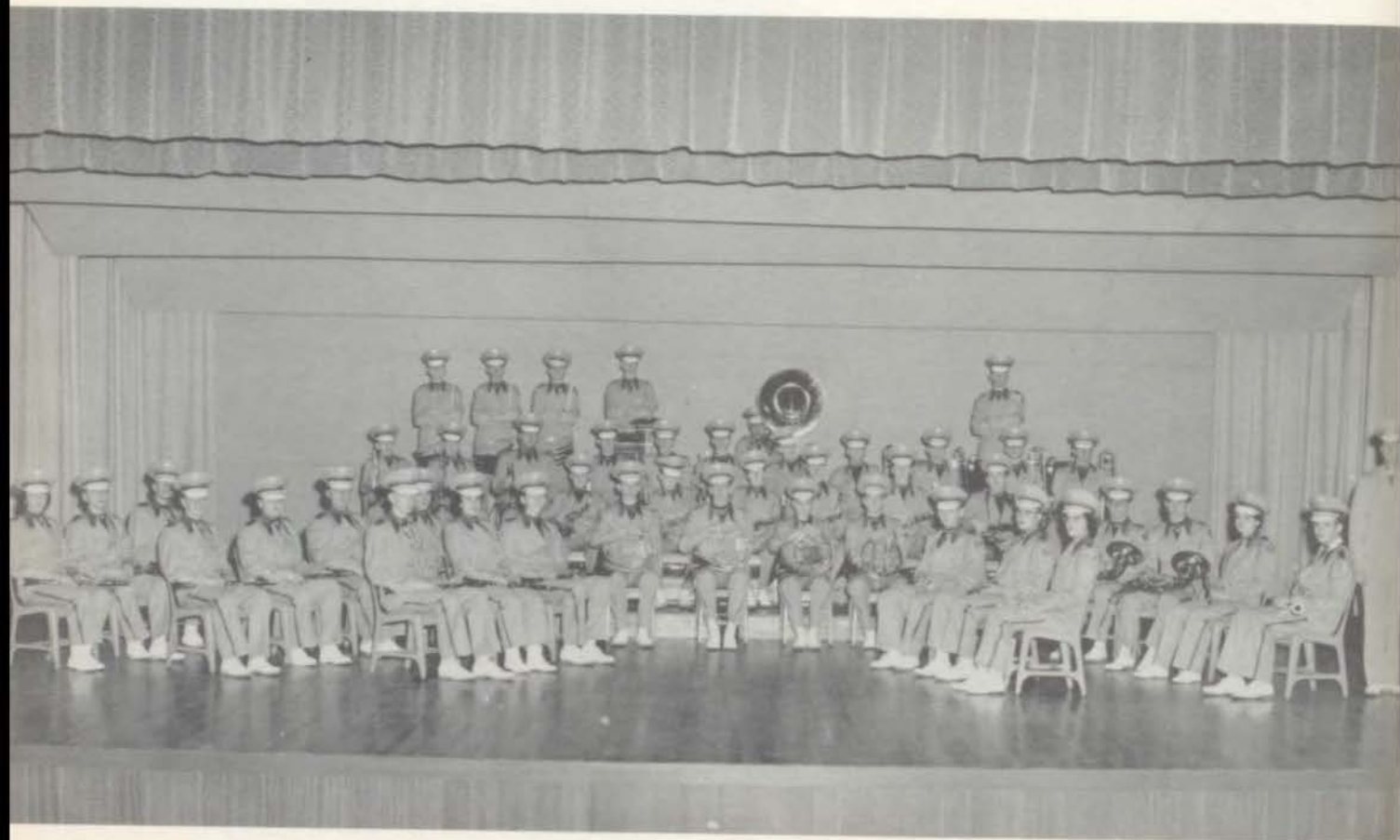

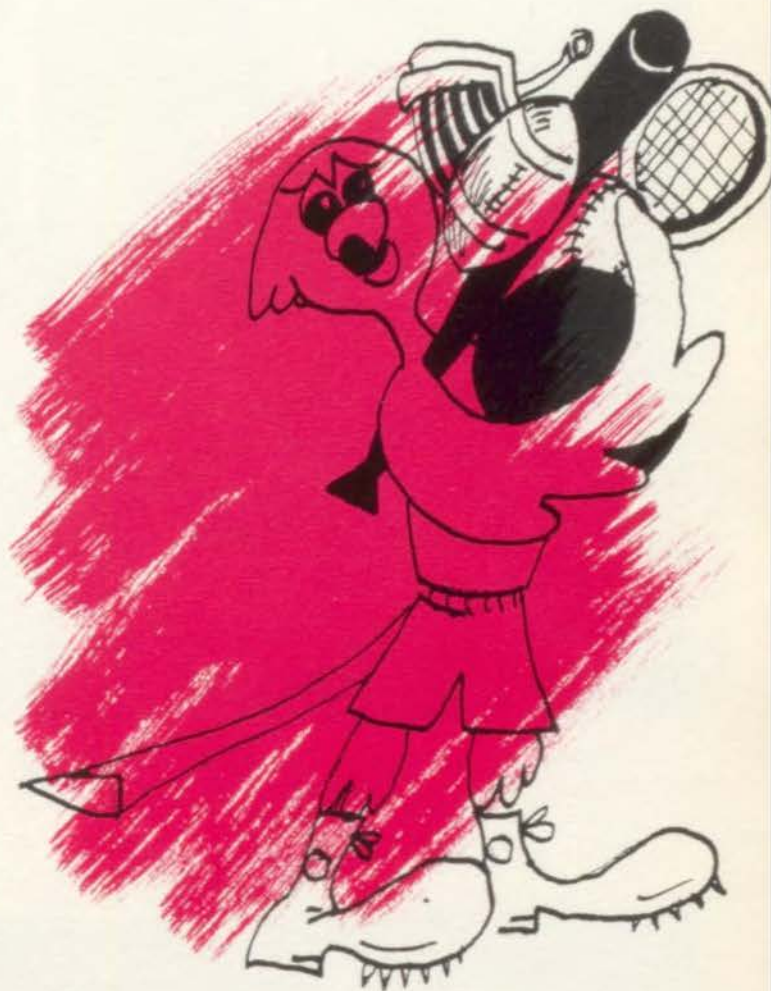


## READ ALL ABOUT IT

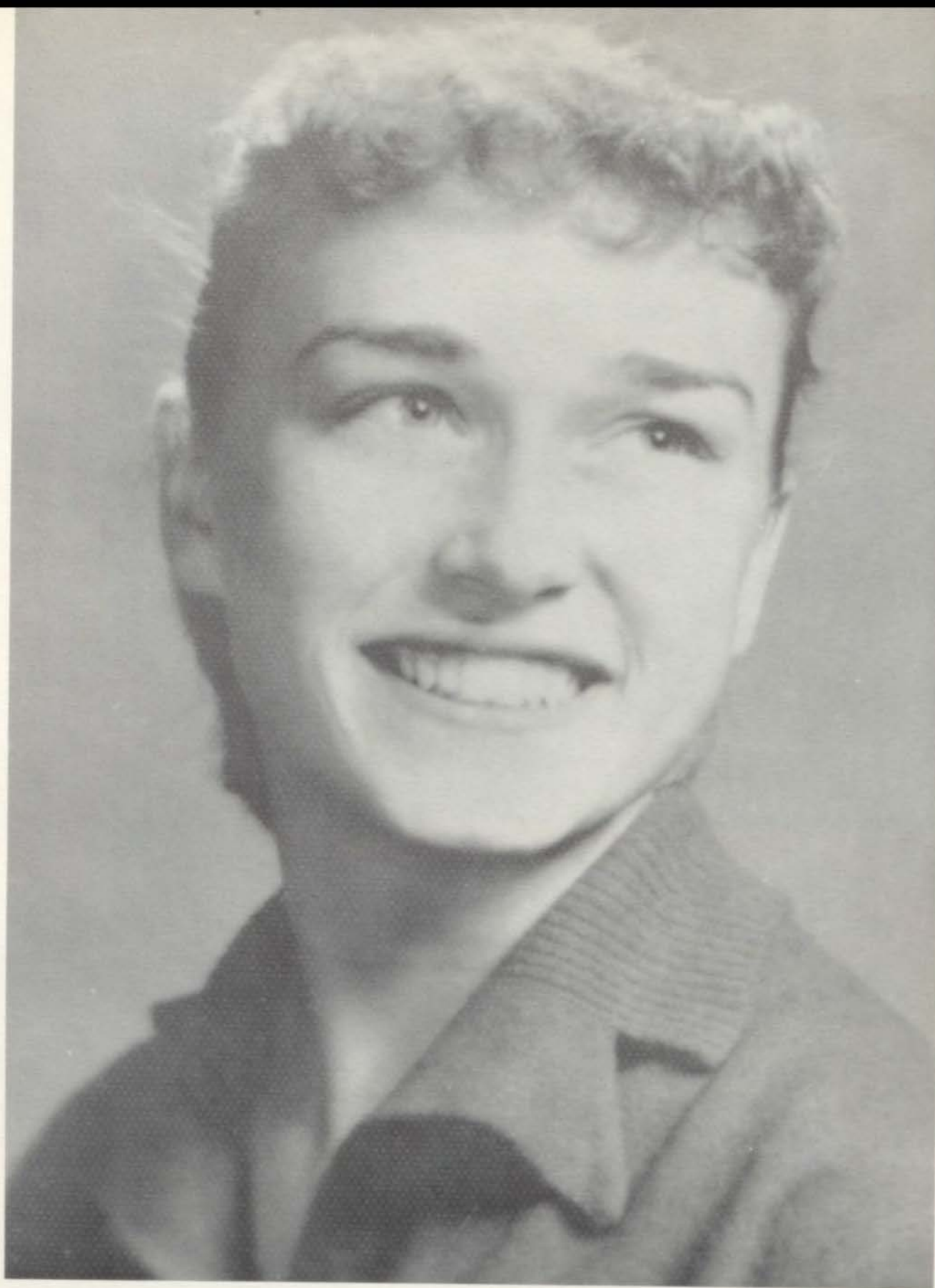

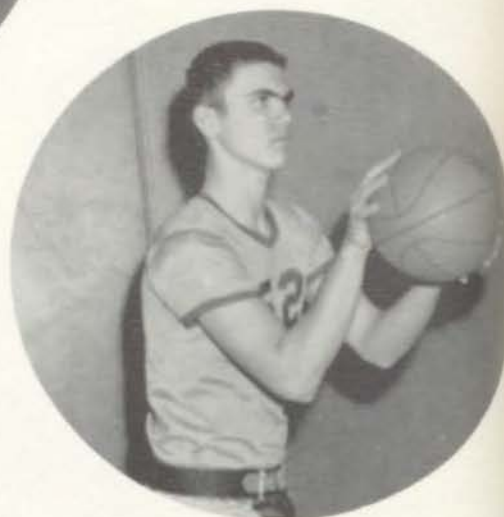
