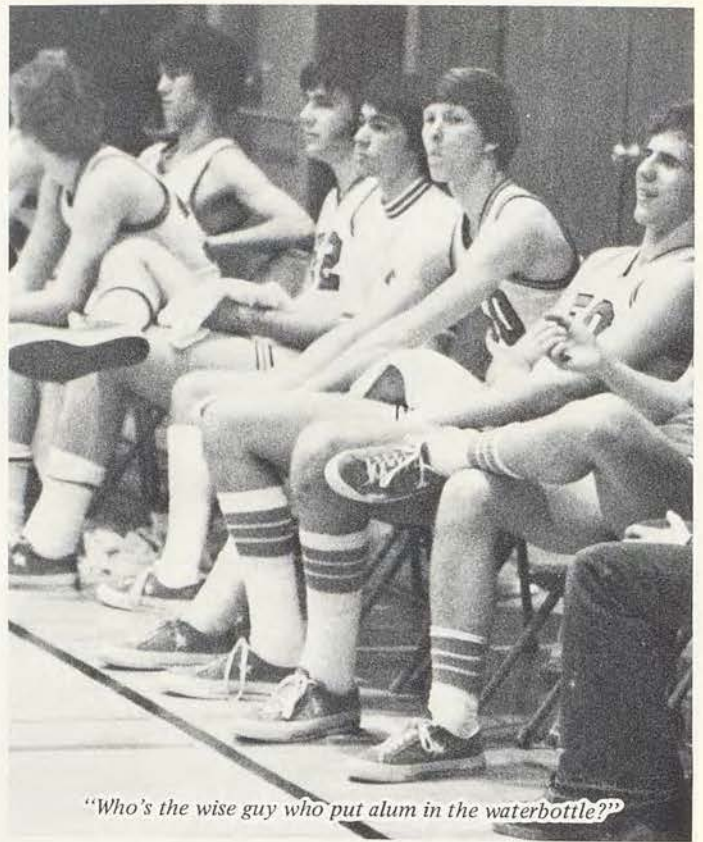

The win was the finest shooting game in the history of the Falcons. Van Horn shot 62 percent of the score by sinking 31 out of 50 chances.

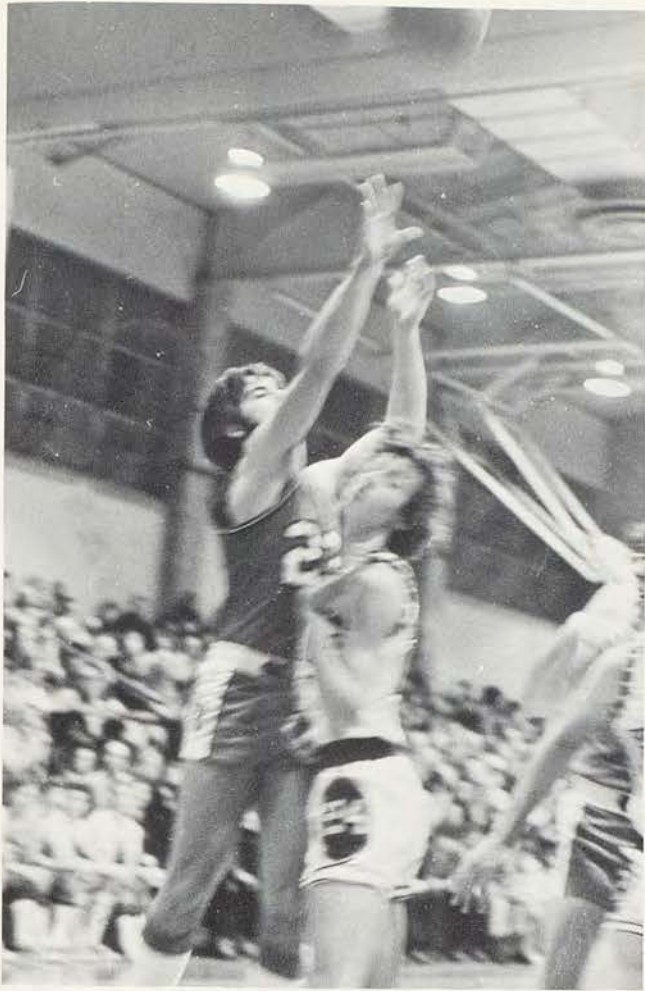
This was the seventh time in 22 basketball meets, and the first time since December 28, 1971, that Van Horn defeated Chrisman.
