
The outstanding player was Mark Borchers, who canned 13 of 15 shots for 27 points. Mark also had 15 rebounds.


The win was the finest shooting game in the history of the Falcons. Van Horn shot 62 percent of the score by sinking 31 out of 50 chances.




















- Assembly


SAGIA is involved in community affairs through such activities as the United Way, Blood Donor Day, and landscaping around the school.


An old man's thought of school
