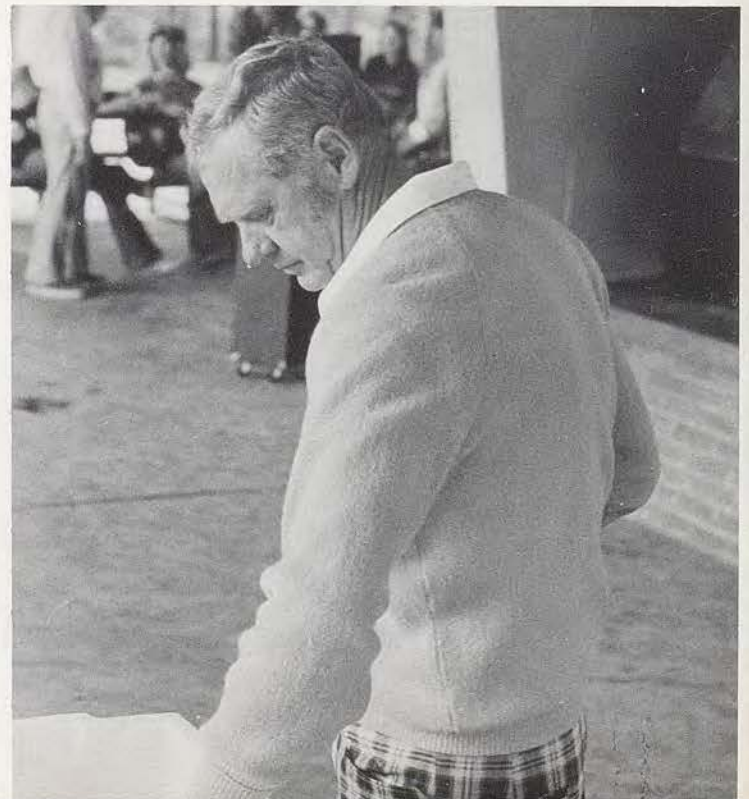
Dear Van Horn Students,

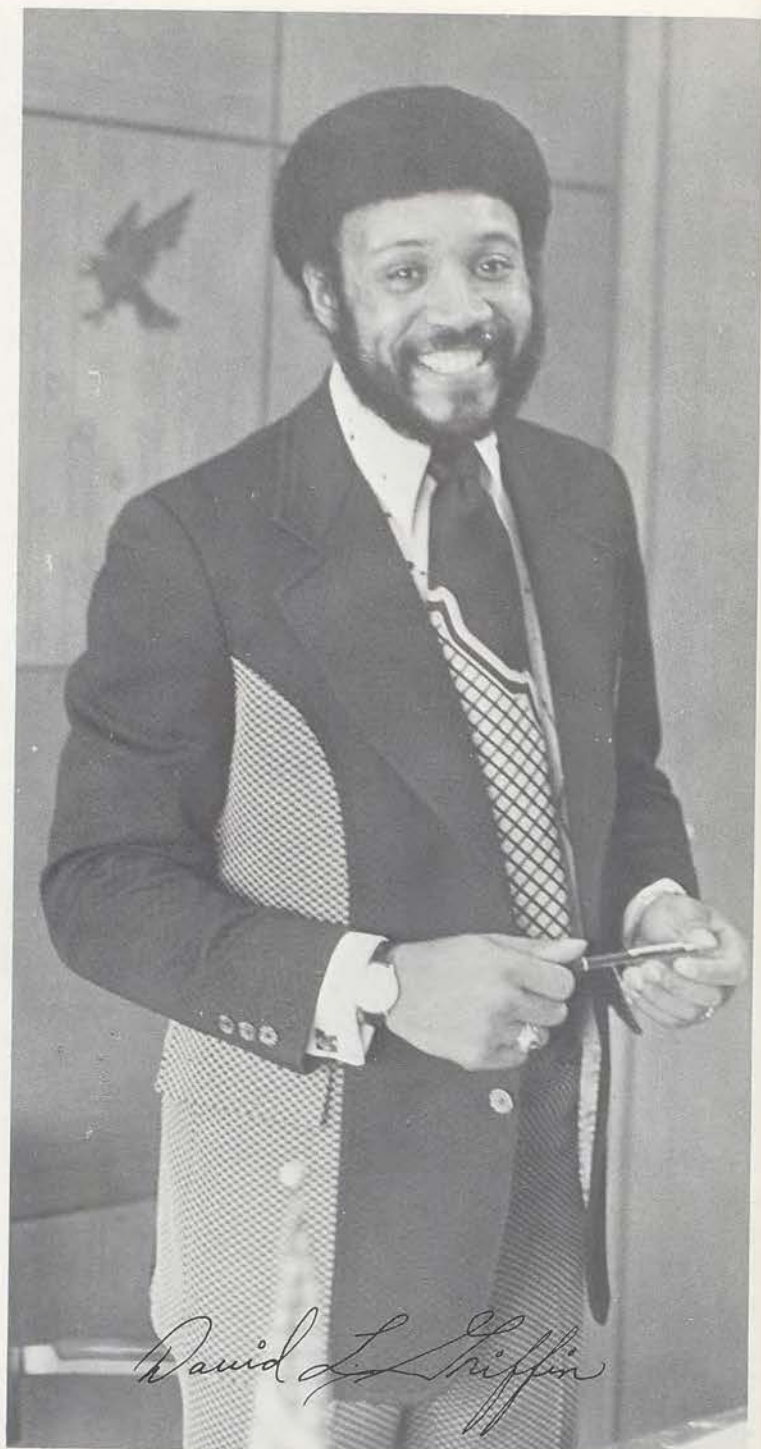
Dear Students,

Take advantage of all your opportunities for a new and brighter tomorrow. Train today to win the race tomorrow that will last ALL OF YOUR LIFE.



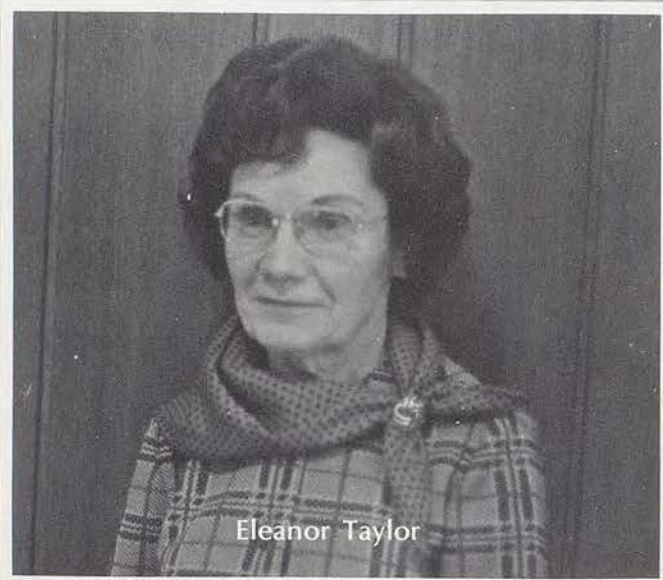
Greetings to the faculty and students of Van Horn High School:

I will take many things back home with me, even a Missouri 'twang' I am told, and the traditional hobby of T.P.ing and confettiing.

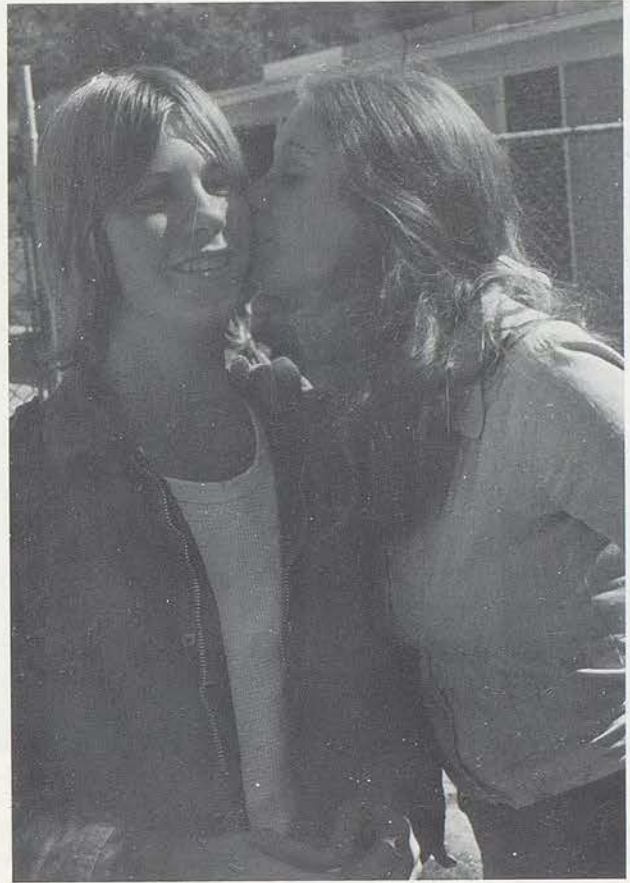
