CECIL A. BILLUPS was a new teacher at Van Horn this year. She taught Special Education. She likes to swim and play tennis in her spare time.




JEFF BOURNS has taught Wood Shop at Van Horn for 22 years. He enjoys the outdoors in his spare time.

CLIFFORD CARPENTER, American History teacher, has taught at Van Horn for 9 years. Hiking, camping, fishing and skiing are what he enjoys.






BENJAMIN BROWN, JR., spent his first year at Van Horn teaching Refresher and General Math. In his spare time he collects records and enjoys sports.

ELEANOR BROWN has taught English for 7 years. She sponsored Mask and Wig, helped with Thespians and was coordinator with the Literary Societies.






ROBERT CLOSSON has taught at Van Horn for 22 years. During the past year he taught World History. He also served as the head of Audio-Visual.




VIVIAN CONSTABLE taught both first and second year Meal Management. Gardening and sewing are a couple of things she likes to do in her spare time.

EVERETT DRAPER has taught at Van Horn for seven years. He served as a sports official and as a Driving instructor. He taught Human Science.






CHARLES ELLIOTT just finished his second year at Van Horn. He taught Band, Orchestra and Guitar. In his spare time he is also involved with music.

VIRGINIA JONES has taught at Van Horn for 6 years. During the past year she taught Business Law and Office COE. She likes camping and playing bridge.




BERNICE KING has taught World History at Van Horn for five years. Among her hobbies is raising plants.

F.L. JORDAN spent his first year at Van Horn teaching English and Debate. In his spare time he enjoys all sports and works with underprivileged children.




OTTO KAIFES, a teacher at Van Horn for 18 years, taught Calculus and Algebra during the past year. He was the coach of the Baseball team.

ROBERT KLAMM taught Speech and Drama in the past year. He sponsored Stage Crew, Thespians and Spring Play. As a hobby, he is a magician.








LARRY LASATER, Van Horn's Metal Shop teacher, is a church organist and an antique dealer. He has taught at Van Horn for three years.

HAZEL MALONE has taught Child Development, Consumer Education and Home Economics. She enjoys reading and sewing. She has been at Van Horn for 5 years.




NEIL MATTICKS experienced his first year of teaching at Van Horn this year. He taught Earth Science.


ALMA MOLIX was a new teacher to Van Horn this year. She taught Typing and Accounting. In her spare time she enjoys bowling and playing tennis.

LORETTA PEGRAM just finished her first year of teaching at Van Horn. During this past year she taught Family Relations.




MARLYS PERKINS has been an Art teacher here for 12 years. She was responsible for the sets and publicity for the Musical and other shows.

D.R. SMITH was the advisor for the Pioneer. He taught English during the past year.




TIM STOUT was another new teacher at Van Horn this year. The subjects he taught were first and second year Art.

BETTY WOYSNAR has been at Van Horn for two years. During the past year she helped those with learning disabilities.







LIBRARY






MANAGERS

















CROSS COUNTRY


TENNIS

But, to take complete control of what seemed a desperate situation, was the Tornado Squad, sponsored by Mr. Kaifes. These stalwart Seniors stood in each hall, communicating with their walkietalkies, brandishing toy machine guns and swords, and wearing construction helmets. They guided all of Van Horn's students to safety in record time. Their fearless attitudes helped them lead the students through one of the most difficult Van Horn tornado drills yet.




