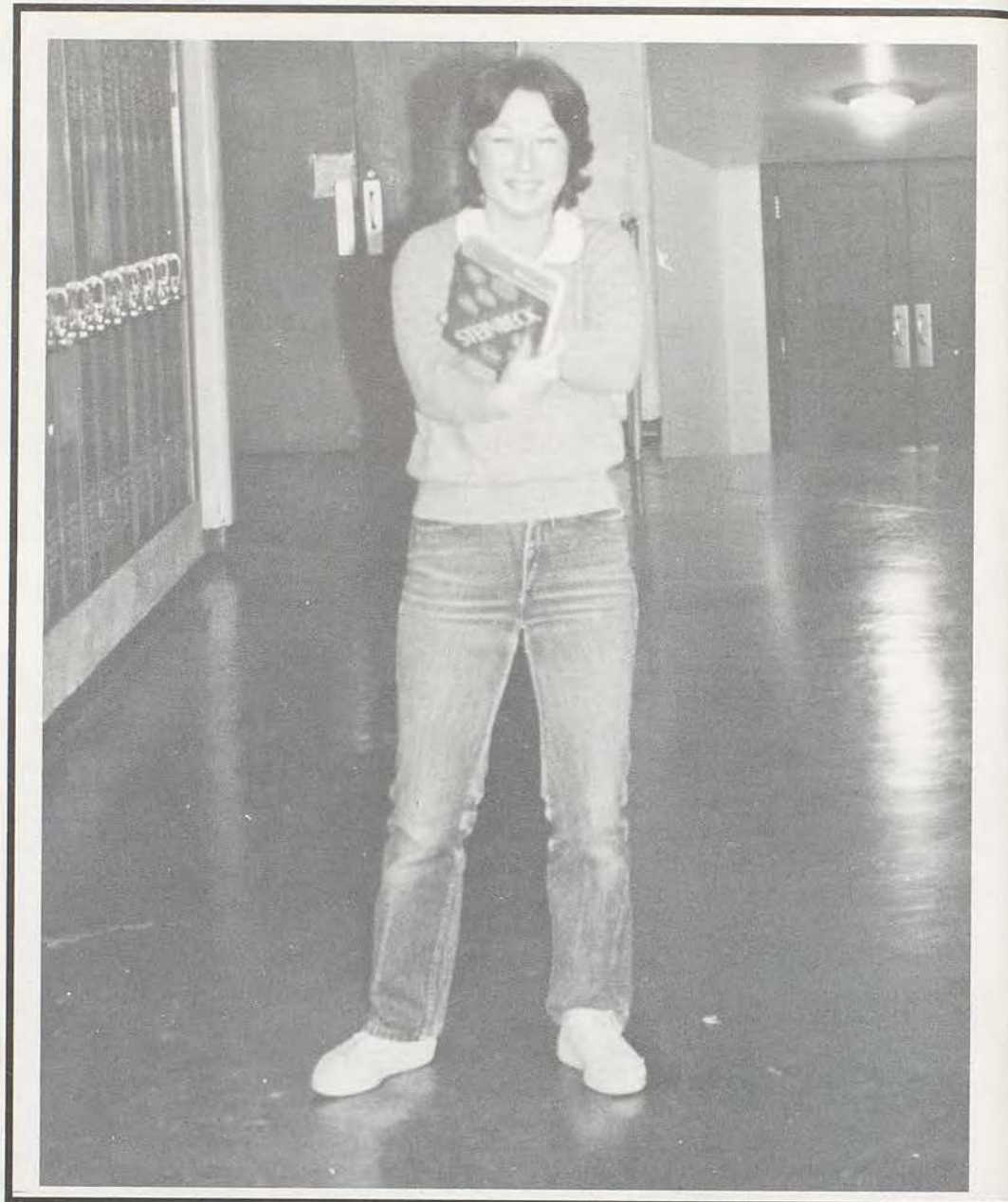
Dear Fellow Falcons,

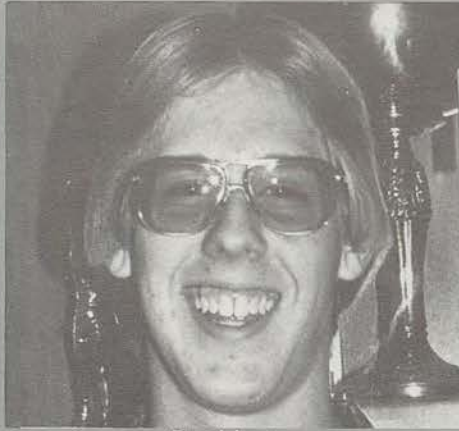


# Student Council Goal Met

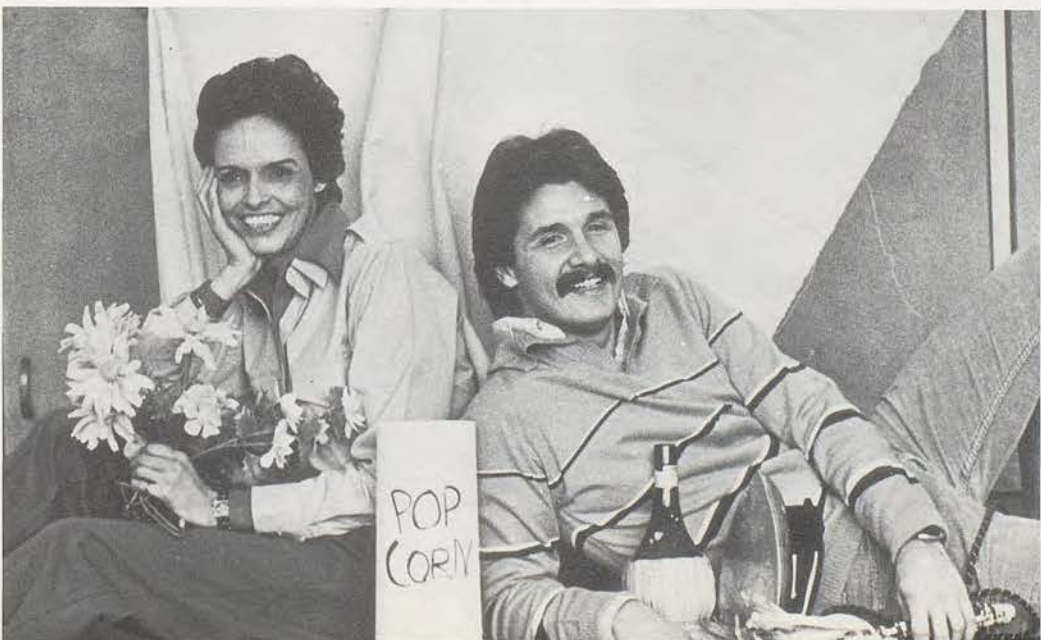

Booster Club also purchased a popcorn popper for use by any Van Horn organization.

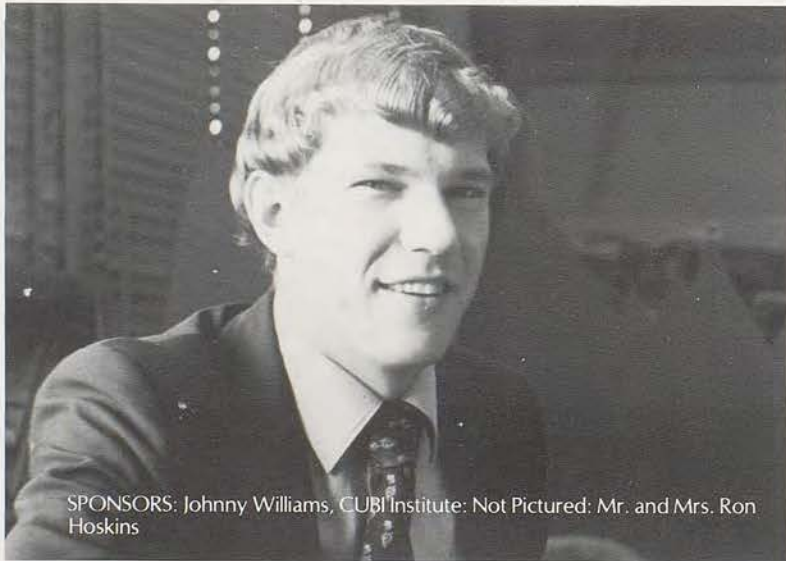

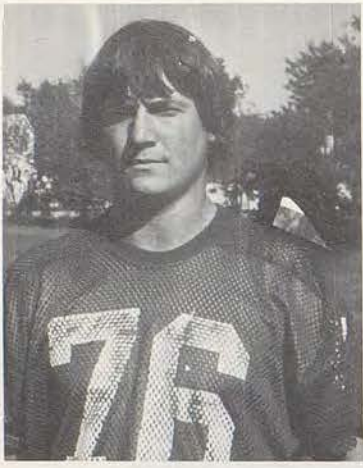
forced to sit out the next game against Central.
