




#### WEST SIDE STORY

Years ago, Quality Hill, was the hill of mansions, fine horses, and rich families of Kansas City, Missouri. This was the area that we call Westside, today.

In 1839, the city of Kansas had been incorporated as a separate part of Westport Landing. This area had been originally founded by Francis Chouteau as a fur-trading riverport.

By 1890, exactly 51 years after our city was established, a new school was built on the Westside. The name of the new school was Switzer Elementary School and it contained grades one thru eight. The first Parent-Teacher Association was formed at this school. The 1890 school building is still used today.

Within twenty years (1910), the Westside became an area of middle-income families. The mansions became apartment houses or else they were replaced by regular apartment buildings. Also, within this period of time the rich families were being replaced by railroad and packing house employees.

When our city was established there were many Anglo-Americans and a few Afro-Americans. As the Westside area changed, our city was receiving many Mexican Citizens who came from Old Mexico to work for the railroad companies and the packing houses. This area (Westside) was ideal for the three ethnic groups who worked for these companies.

By 1925 it was decided that a Junior High School be located in this area. The new school was named West Junior High School and it served grades seven through ten (a four year Junior High School was unusual).





Although World War I took its toll of young men, we must remember that many of our young men, on the Westside were first generation citizens of our city. However, World War II did affect the Westside because many of our young men were citizens serving their country. Due to the War many of our Westsiders were able to see new ways of living, thus, creating desires to change their customs, or trades or patterns of living. The Westside was no longer known as "Little Mexico" or the Negro section of town. In place of one or two ethnic groups, the Westside had three groups, Mexican, Negro and Anglo.

The three groups organized for the improvement of their neighborhood. Through their efforts new housing, better street lighting, better health services, more neighborhood youth centers, were provided and four year junior high school was changed to a five year senior high school.

In September of 1969, the doors opened to West High School which serves grades eight thru twelve. Today, the school, the neighborhood organizations, and the Kansas City School Board are working as a group to improve and make West High School the BEST High School for our three cultural groups.






