


Dr. Roscoe V. Cramer

Dr. Roscoe V. Cramer, Principal of West Junior and Switzer Schools from September 1928 to June 1960 died Saturday Nov. 21, 1970 at Baptist Memorial Hospital after an illness of two weeks. He died from a heart attack.

Dr. Cramer was the person who worked to set up the first West Side Neighborhood Council, a forerunner of the (Numerous) many groups we have on the West Side and in the city now. He was president of this group for 10 years. He helped to get the West Side a dental clinic, recreational activities for youth, public housing and beautification of the West Side. He made West Junior noted throughout the United States as the first Junior High School to have "Common Learnings". Educators from 35 states visited the classes and the program of the Common Learning classes were adopted across the nation.

Based on West Junior and programs in all subjects, he was co-author of Administration in the Elementary School and the "Junior High School." When you read the books you can "see" Switzer and West Junior as they were at that time. He received four awards for his work on the "West Side". We will never be able to repay him for what he did for us except by going forward-doing the best for the "West Side" as he dreamed we would.
