## Present New Challenges

Teaching the general introductory science for 8th and 9th grades are: Mr. Cross, Mr. Martin, Mr. Spiller, and Mrs. Young. In the advanced science courses Mrs. Young teaches Chemistry; Mr. Bourrette, Human Science and Mrs. Hasty, Biology. Mr. Baysinger teaches Earth Science and Miss Dee teaches Physics.

When possible, the most up to date methods of teaching science courses have been adopted. For example, Miss Dec teaches the I.P.S. or New Introductory Physical Science Course, Mr. Bourrette has styled his course along the lines of premedical requirements. Mrs. Hasty uses the Biological Sciences Study Committee.

Mrs. Young follows the Chemistry Study course of instruction with emphasis on the discovery approach. Mr. Baysinger, in his Earth Science classes combines Earth Science Study Committee course with the traditional instructions in Geology, Meteorology and Oceanography.

The social studies department conducts classes in the required subjects of Citizenship, which is taken in the freshman year; American History, taught in the junior year; and either World History or World Geography, which is generally taken by sophomores.

Elective courses compose a fourth year of social studies. The fourth year a social studies student may take one semester of Contemporary Issues, an honors course stressing research and critical analysis taught as a seminar. The second semester is addressed to the study of the economic system of the United States.

Another fourth year elective, is a course called Current Affairs.

Newly included in our curriculum this year, is a course in Psychology, which, together with Geography aand Economics, comprises what most nearly can be termed "Social Science" in our curriculum.

We have three Driver Education teachers at Westport who instruct approximately 150 students.

The instructors are William Love, John Idoux, and Ken Carlson.

Three autos are available to instruct our students. Normally three students drive during an hour class period.

In Driver Education we strive to promote safety and good driving habits.

The concern for the well-being of individuals in the family setting is the fundamental element of home economics and family life education. The home economics and family living department provides Westport students with a wide variety of areas to meet the needs of all age levels. Mrs. Ruth Brody teaches eighth grade homemaking classes and ninth grade home economics I and II. Eighth graders gain an appreciation and understanding of children through their child development unit. In Home Economics, students are introduced to the social aspects of foods and at the same time develop an interest in good nutrition. The clothing unit is aimed at improving personal appearance as well as good techniques in construction. As Westporters develop physically, intellectually, emotionally, socially and spiritually, a wider selection of courses are available to them. Mrs. Frances Fitzgerald and Mrs. Marjoric Harris teach classes in Foods I and II, Clothing I and II, Home Decorations and Home Management.

Mrs. Margaret Stark in her family relation classes strives to develop in students certain traits and characteristics essential for living effectively with members of their family and with others.

The ninth and tenth grade Physical Education classes are smaller in number this year, but to make up for this difference we have the largest eighth grade class we've ever had. Due to the two large eighth grade classes this year, Mr. Jarvis and Mr. Little have been assigned to teach one class each assisting the regular P.E. teachers.

Our Physical Education Program is unique in that most of our activities involves competition of record performances that go back 25 or more years. Each year every boy will compete for class championships, school championships and the all time championships.

#### Master Skills and Tools

The Westport Battalion, Reserve Officer's Training Corps, is in it's second year of operation after some 15 years inactive status

The battalion is branching out this year into more advanced training, as well as conducting basic training, in the school of the soldier, for first year cadets.

There is at present 130 members of the unit, with some 65 percent being veterans of one or more years of service. Still too young to have commissioned officers, the battalion is functioning with non-commissioned officer's filling the battalion and company staff positions.

The battalion took second in Federal Inspection last year, and sixth in overall city competition.

Military Instructor for the battalion is Master Sergeant (Ret) Frank O. Champion.

The C.O.E. program increases the opportunities for education and training at Westport. Parents and pupils request this program because a pupil may obtain a worthwhile work experience under school supervision. These opportunities may develop into fulltime employment after graduation.

The C.O.E. Program is divided into two units - C.O.E. Class and C.O.E. Work.

The instruction in C.O.E. Class considers School Rules, Regulations, and Policies; Employer-Employee Relations; Importance of Personality Development and Getting Along with Others plus Progress on the Job. Selected units are taught from the textbook: "Business Principles and Management" and "Merchandising Mathematics.

Credit in C.O.E. Work depends upon regular satisfactory employment, regular school attendance and an evaluation made by coordinator during a personal visit to the place of employment.

Audiovisual is an important part of our instructional program. Each year more equipment has been added with greater use of films, records, and tape recordings. Our Audiovisual department is open daily before school and during the day to provide teachers with needed services such as the scheduling of equipment, ordering and delivery of aids, making tape recordings, and transparencies and the maintainance of equipment.

Our coordinator who directs the audiovisual services here at Westport is Mr. David E. Hill. He has three very competent student assistants that manage the audiovisual room during the Hours 1 and 7. They are: Bill Foreman, Rodney Eck, and Mitchell Witmer. These students assist in delivery of equipment, and films, training student projectionists, splicing films, and many other tasks during these two hours that must be done to help maintain effective services.

The Vocational-Technical Department has expanded from four small offerings in the school year of 1964-65 to a sophisticated and modern department of eight different courses in 1968-69.

The courses keep changing with the advent of new techniques and equipment, and the courses have kept abreast of these changes with the addition of the latest types of equipment and procedures. Some of the most recent changes have been the Dictaphone Class-Master Electronic Teaching System used in Secretarial Practice, The new IBM Electronic Computer Typesetting System in Graphic Arts and the Radiotelephone Equipment and Color Television Equipment used in the Electronics course.

Five teachers are on the staff in the Business Education Department: Robert Ballantyne, chairman; Ernie Paris, A. J. Rizzo, Mary Theroff, and Opal Heatherly. Classes are taught in typing; business, personal, and advanced business; bookkeeping; general business and stenography.

Two vocational classes, clerical practice and secretarial practice, are also offered. These courses are offered in two-hour blocks.

The business education department is well equipped. Training is offered on the following machines: typewriters, both manual and electric; ten-key listing machines; calculators, both printing and rotary; comptometers, posting machines, dictaphones, and duplicating machines of various types.

The purchase of a new Dictaphone Class Master Electronic Teaching System this year makes it possible for twenty students to take dictation by means of headphones.

A student who excels in this department is eligible for entry positions in the business world.


Sophomore Class

We hope to be not only the largest class but the best to leave the halls of dear old Westport High School.



#### Backbone of the Team


