
#### **FOREWORD**






#### **NEW ADMINISTRATORS**




John Paul Jones, former principal of Humboldt School, is the new principal at Westport High School this year. Mr. Gene Banaka, our former principal, is now at Center High School.





Mathematics is a logical and a sequential development of interrelated processes and concepts. Today functional experiences in quantitative relationships have replaced rote learning and meaningless memorization of rules and definitions. Emphasis is upon mathematical structures learned in an atmosphere of active inquiry. Stress is placed upon mathematics as a way of thinking. We attempt through solving more varied and difficult problems to broaden and deepen the basic concepts learned by the student earlier in his education.

Not only is mathematics taught strictly with a mathematical overview but also with a social overview. This is done by developing in the student the ability to relate mathematical models to the real world; to develop an appreciation of the ways in which mathematical concepts are needed and used daily in our society; and to develop the ability to formulate and apply mathematical concepts to personal and social problems.

Mr. E. Champion, Mr. Corso, Mr. Davis, Miss Dee, Mr. Nelson, Mrs. Smith, Mr. Summers, and Mrs. Williams comprise the mathematics department.

The foreign language department offers French, Russian, Spanish and Latin. Miss Grace Dooley, a new teacher at Westport, teaches French I and II and one French I class at Manual. Mrs. Lee offers two levels of Russian to Westport students. Mrs. Shaw teaches four levels of Spanish. Mr. Nied instructs Latin II and III.

An experiment in the use of the language laboratory is an open lab period during fifth hour during which any language student may be released from Homeroom to hear instructional tapes. The lab is supervised by Mrs. Shaw and Miss Dooley.

Mr. Nied is using some techniques of the oral method in his Latin II class. This includes using the language lab once a week to improve pronunciation and teach simple elements of grammar by patterns. This year Mr. Nied is teaching the Classic Aeneid and the Odyssey in the original Latin.

The foreign language clubs offer many opportunities to broaden the cultural knowledge of Westport students. The Spanish Club has as its honorary member, Miss Celia Sforcin, AFS student from Brazil. The French and Spanish Clubs joined forces to sponsor an orphan at Christmas and exchanged Christmas customs at a joint meeting. The Latin Club feted Virgil on his birthday this year. The Russian Club enjoyed comradeship with fellow Russian students at Southwest where Mrs. Lee also teaches. They enjoyed Russian films at the Waldo theater in November.


The first voices of the class of 1975 were heard in the halls of Westport in late August, at eighth grade orientation. This was a new and challenging experience for all.







Many of us have already joined organizations. This shows that we are willing to take over responsibilities.


Our class sponsor is Mrs. Young and our class counselor is Mrs. Agron.

#### STUDENTS BASIC UNDERSTANDING

The science department offers many courses for those students who are interested in this field. In general science, there is special material which provides an opportunity for students to discover for themselves various scientific principles. Earth science is primarily a survey course covering the history, structure, and composition of the earth, mineralogy, meteorology, historical and structural geology. Map reading and gathering weather information for forecasting are two of the several techniques learned during the year.

techniques learned during the year.

This course is structured for the individual who is fulfilling the requirements for a high school education only or one who is going to college. It is a practical course because the student is taught to see the importance of the conservation and preser-

vation of the planet on which he lives.

The biology classes are again using the B.S.C.S. Green Version High School Biology which is an ecological approach to the subject. For the first time this year there are second-year students enrolled as laboratory assistants. These students arouse independent study through projects and reading. They also assist in lab classes and prepare materials to be used in laboratory work.

The new chemistry study program we have started in chemistry this year is lab oriented. It is designed to make it easier for the student in college. It is also designed to arouse interest in the field of science in general and to help the student realize chemistry plays an important role in everyone's

life.

The Physics class is using the text Modern Physics by Williams, Metcalfe, Trinklein and Lefler. It is a traditional approach, supplemented by the P.S.S.C. experiments and problems. The course started out with a study of the slide rule and

the trigonometric functions. Measurements with precise instruments like the Vernier and micrometer calipers proved to be more accurate than the meter sticks. Force and motion, heat and nuclear energies, sound, light, electricity and magnetism are the topics we expect to cover before the school year is over.

The Human Science course presents not only a complete understanding of the functions of the body, but affords an opportunity for each student to determine if he has ability and aptitude for work in some phase of the medical field.

No department in Westport works with as many students as does the English Department. Through the efforts of eight full-time instructors and two who share teaching English with a language, the staff endeavors to guide students to their full use of the communicative skills. These skills (reading, writing and speaking) are approached with grammatical correctness and good logic uppermost in mind.

The following are fulltime teachers of English; Thelma Bowen, Holly Jo Cobb, Justine Frogge, Stella Hoing, Inez Pletcher, Gladys Riley, Ann Taylor, Val Ziegenhorn. The two part time teachers are Beverly Shaw, and Ken Nied.


Mr. Ballantyne, chairman of the Business Education Department, discussed an account with Terri Truax.






