

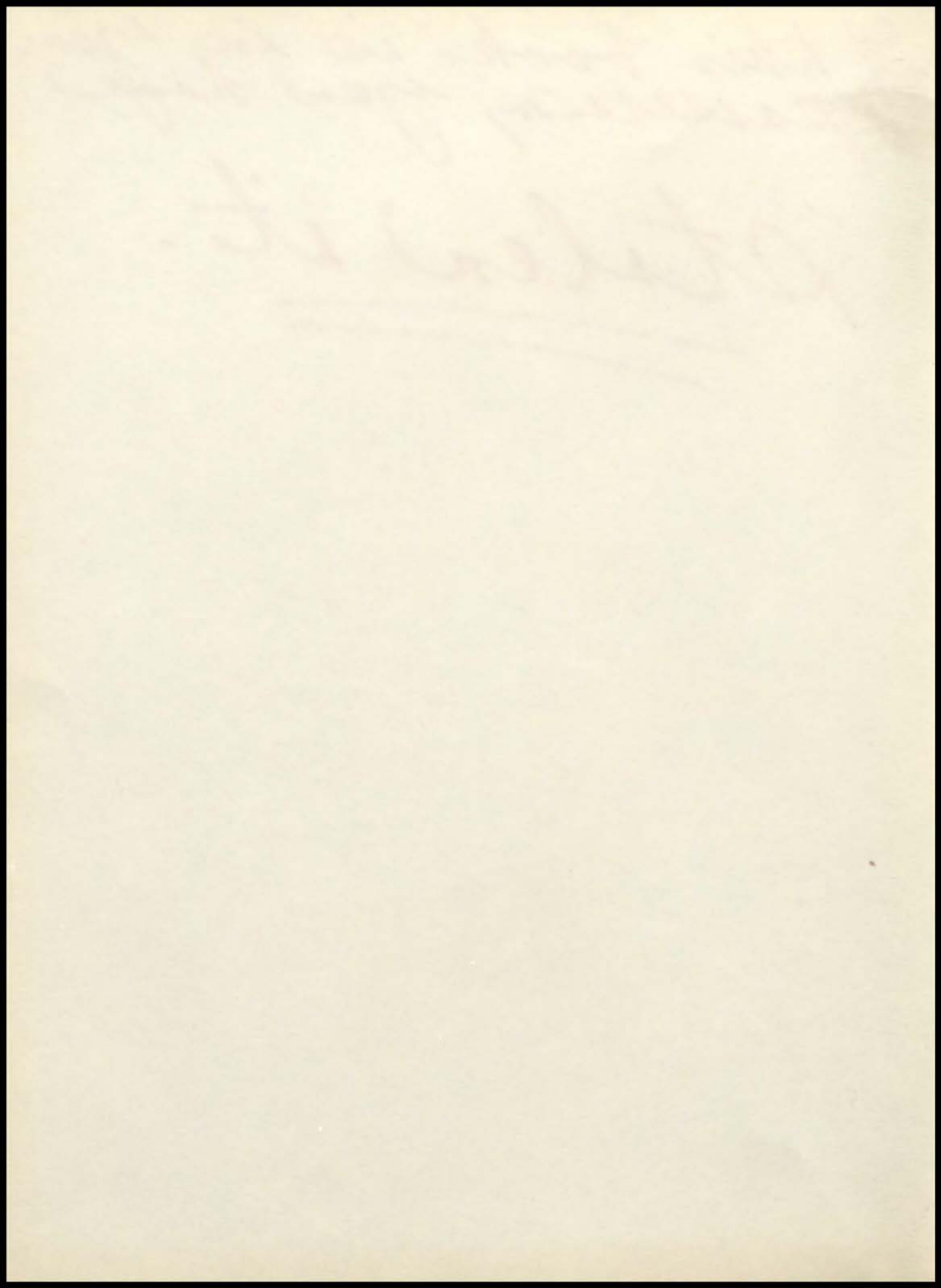

The department of home economics and family living through its wide range of curriculum strives to guide students in establishing values which will give meaning to self, family, and community life. Mrs. Jacque Thompson teaches the basic home economics program; Mrs. Frances Fitzgerald, basic home economics, foods and clothing; Mrs. Marjorie Harris, foods, clothing, home decoration and consumer education; and Mrs. Margaret Stark, family living.

Mr. Rizzo has the secretarial practice program, typing and accounting. We are glad to have girls from Lincoln High School, Southwest High School, and Manual High School attending clerical practice classes at Westport.

(Cooperative Occupational Education), a federally funded state supervised vocational education program, was designed to give high school seniors a supervised work experience in an occupation for which they're qualified and have the training. This program provides a satisfactory work experience leading to full-time employment in that occupation or related occupations.

Mr. Bruce Swoffer, recently appointed the Learn and Earn Action Program coordinator, came from Man Power Training and Development Program. 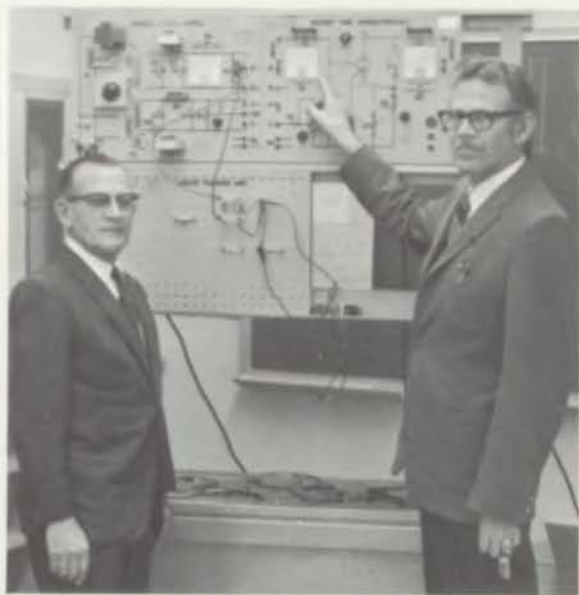

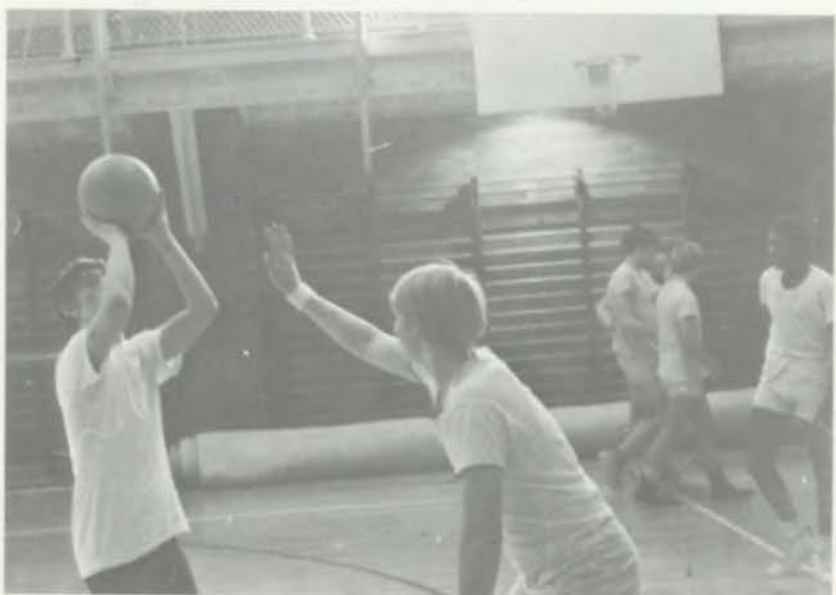

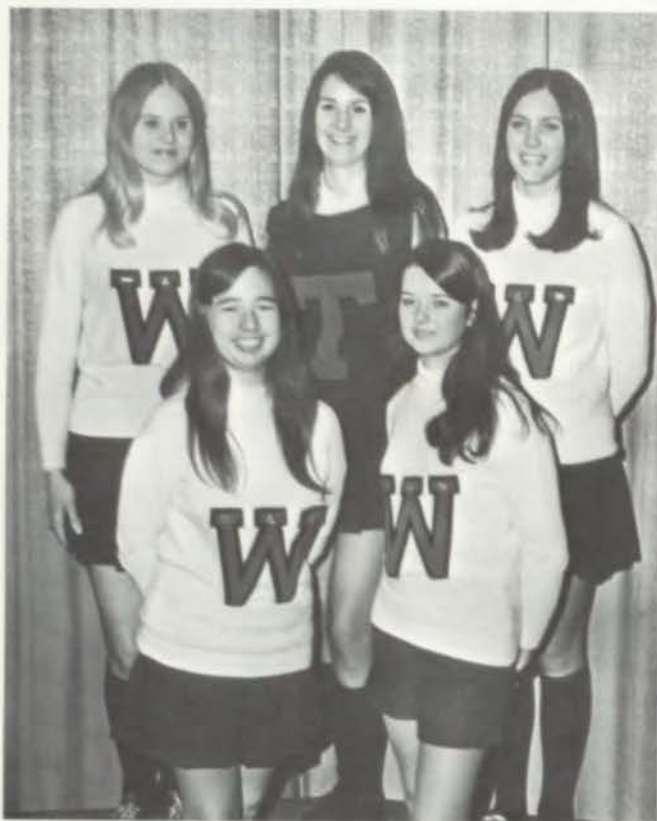
