
Charles B. Wheeler, "Class of 1942", is now Mayor of Kansas City. While here at Westport, he was Sports Editor of the CRIER.














Administrators







Modern Resources Serve



Mrs. Jeanne Farrand, head librarian, has been at Westport for nine years. She attended Kansas State Teachers College, Kansas Wesleyan, and Central Missouri State College. She holds B. S. and M. S. degrees.



A new feature in Westport's Resource Center is the selection of paperback books. Many new books were received and available for the students' use.

This year Westport High School lost a library and gained a new Resource Center. It was twice as large as the old library, and contained some new furniture, new books, and new audio-visual equipment, designed to help the students in the learning process.

Plans for the Resource Center began in November and December of 1970, when Mr. Curtis began to study the problems of modernizing the old library in a manner more consistent with modern concepts. He knew that because of an inadequate number of books, limited seating, and a shortage of library personnel, few students used the library. The scarcity of filmstrips, records, slides, tapes, and other materials vital to a Resource Center added to the problem. Early in 1971, Mrs. Jeanne Farrand, the librarian, department heads, and Mr. Curtis, met with representatives from the central office to discuss plans for modernizing and enlarging the library. In May, 1972, school representatives met with Mrs. Marnie Neal, the Director of Library Services, to investigate the possible space for a larger library.

The group's final decision was that the new Resource Center would need new shelving and furniture, sound-proof ceiling and floors, audio-visual materials, more books, and a larger staff of library personel. The group sent a written proposal to the central office requesting these items; and, under Title II of the Elementary and Secondary Education Acts, we received books and audio-visual materials.
