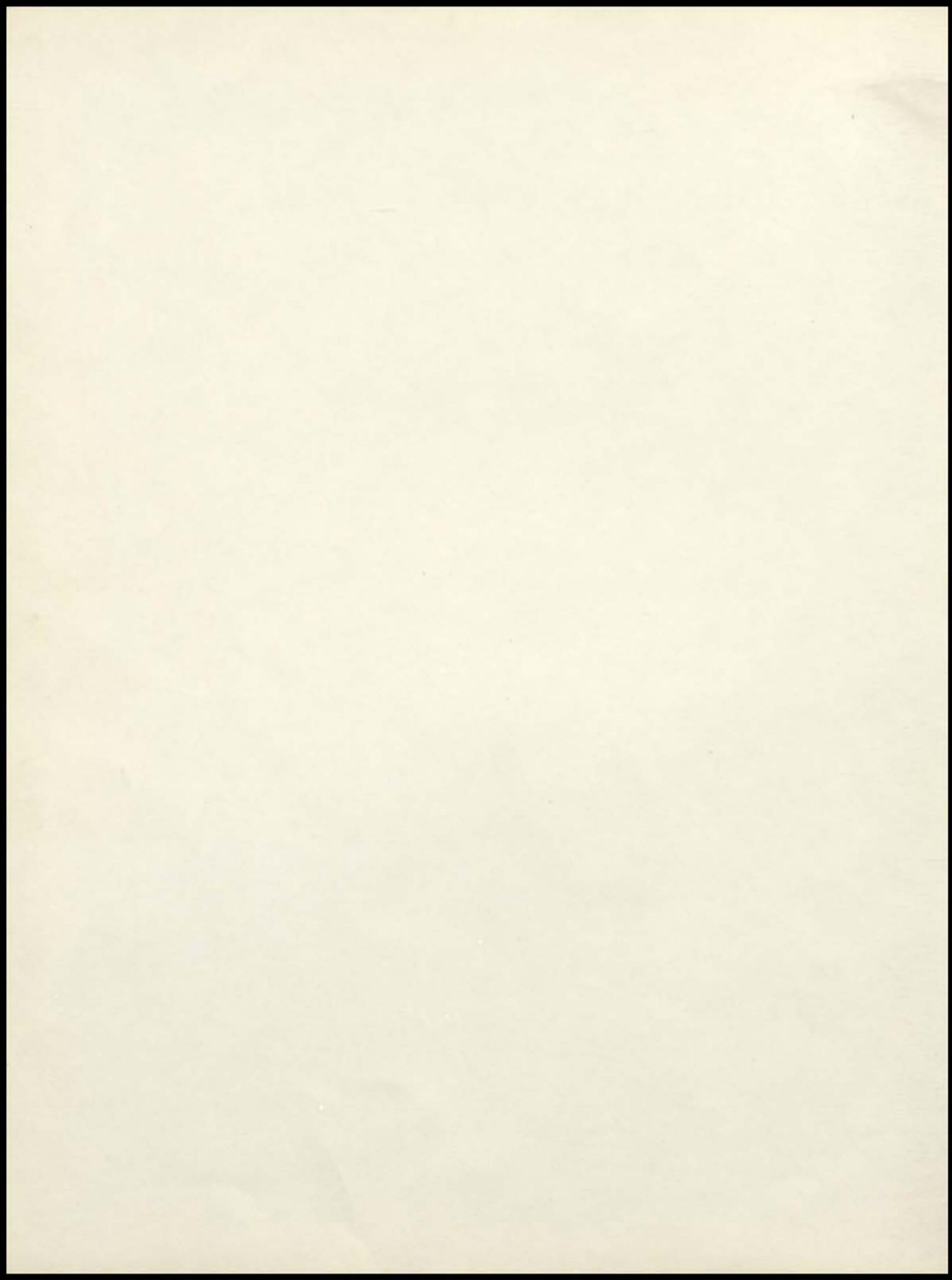

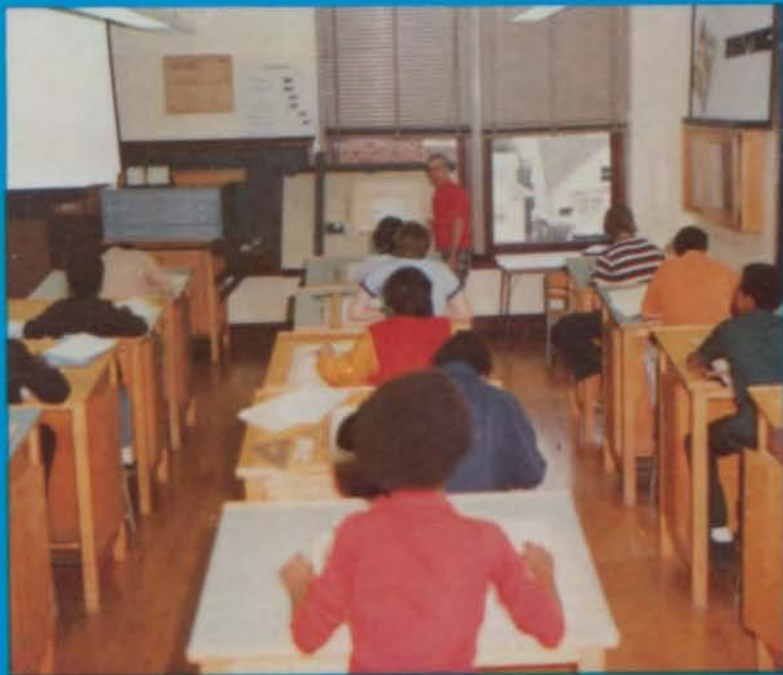

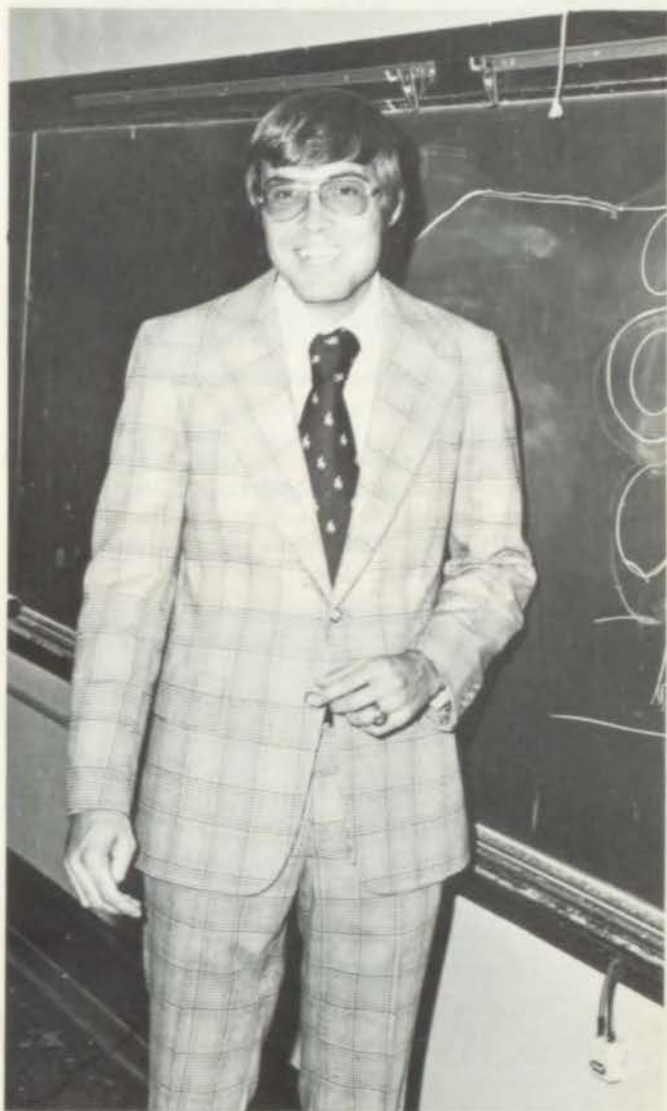
Teachers Brighten Future

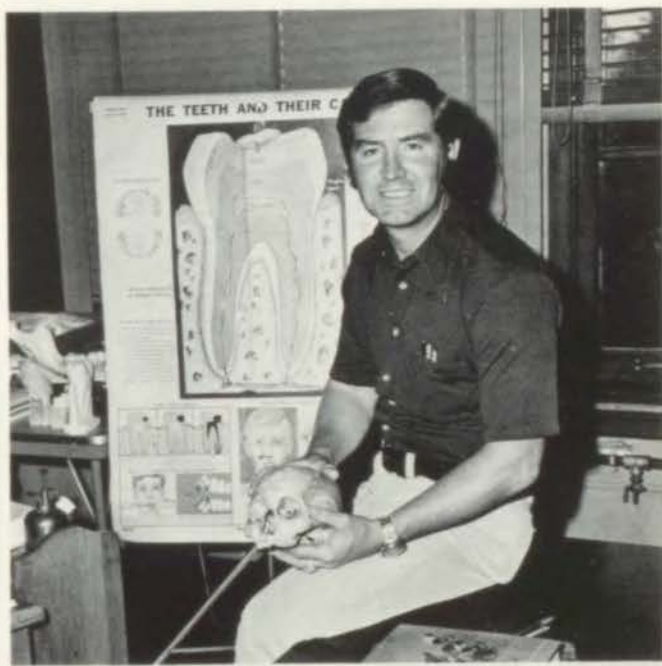

It was the desire of all teachers of mathematics at Westport to assist our students in their quest for such goals.

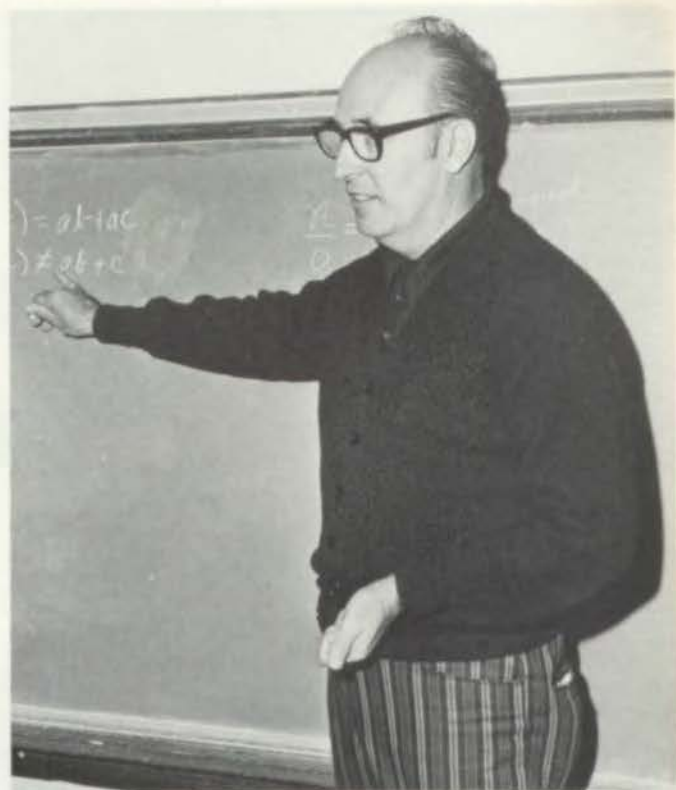
Individualized teacher planning, organizing, actuating, and evaluating toward the accomplishment of these goals proved to be rewarding to all concerned.

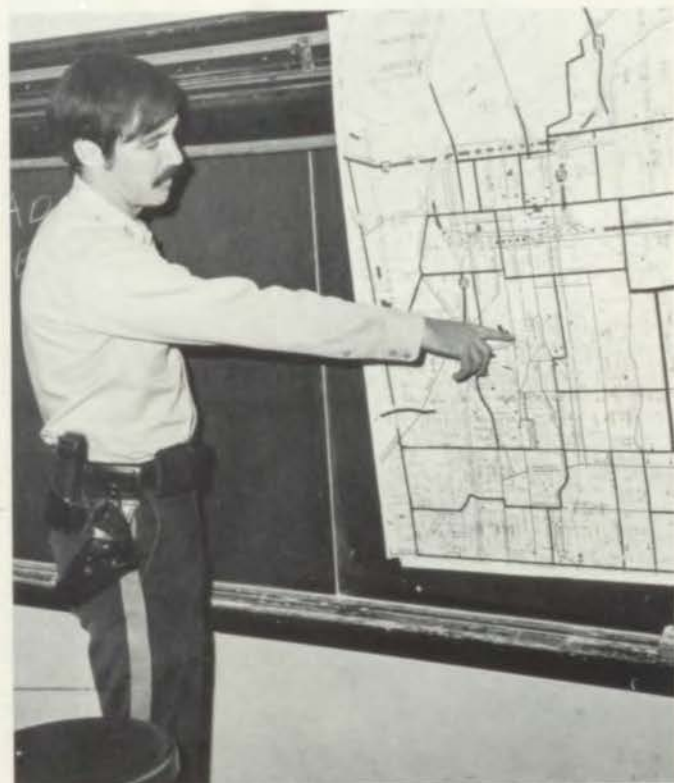

The image of the library as a storehouse for books is no longer accurate at Westport High. It is much more than this.

The Library Resource Center is the "center" of a great deal of activity. It has seen some changes this year, particularly in the use of media. Four carrels equipped with cassette players and filmstrip previewers have given us special listening and viewing facilities. Students and faculty are making more use of these kinds of supplementary materials than ever before.

To be able to discover for one's self answers to questions, to find materials to supplement classroom work or to use for the enjoyment they provide, students must know how to use a library. Work has been done through the English classes to teach these skills, and a feeling of being an independent learner has increased.

Research has been encouraged, and this has led to the use of the reference sources as well as the periodicals in our collection.

A great wealth of information is available to those who know how to find it, and with the help of the librarian and her aid and student assistants, Westport students are taking advantage of this aspect of their school.

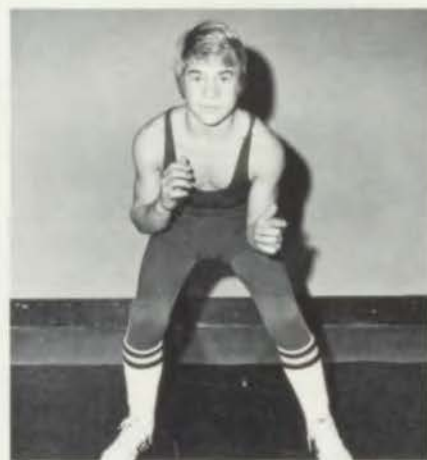

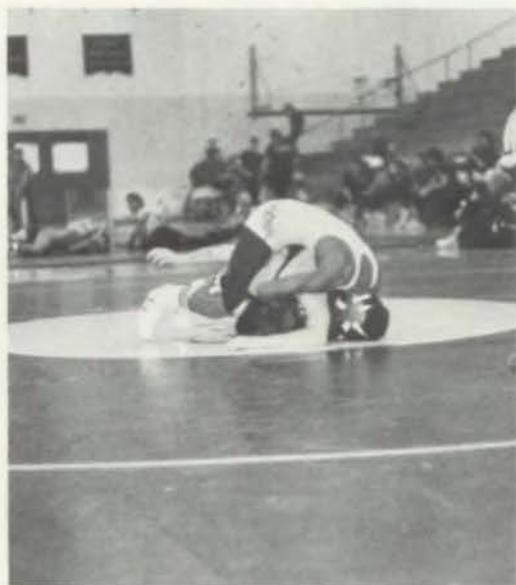

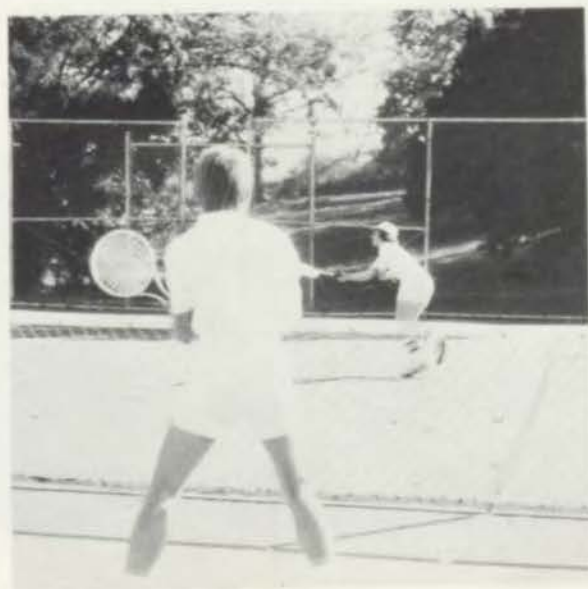

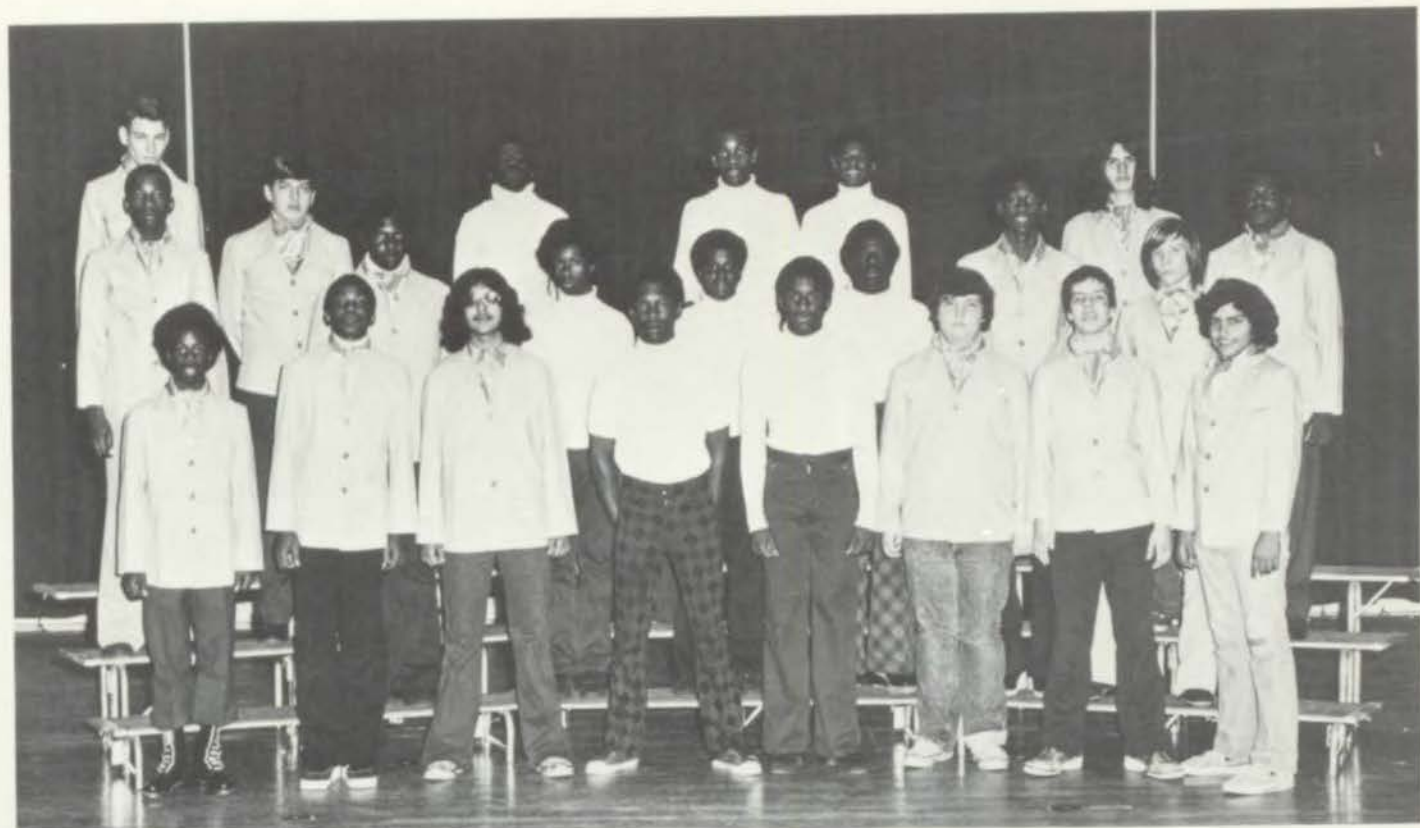
The Girls Glee Club and the Boys Glee Club acted as feeders to the choir.

Betty Schultheis Ortner was an art teacher at Westport for 17 years. She was at Westport only 1½ weeks this year, when she became ill and did not teach after September 3. Mrs. Ortner died at Sherman Hospital, Houston, Texas, December 8, 1975.

She was a friend to all of the teachers, but was especially close to those in the Art Department. Mr. Zimmerschied has known her for five years. They worked as sponsors of the Art Club. By the leadership of Mrs. Ortner, each year an orphan was adopted. Before teaching at Westport, Betty Ortner taught arts and crafts at the Kansas City Recreation Department. She received a master of science degree and attended Kansas University and the Art Institute at the University of Missouri at Kansas City.

"She believed in individualizing instruction. Students worked on projects of their own choice," says Mr. Zimmerschied. "She was always interested in the students welfare.

Betty Ortner was interested in making the school more attractive. She helped to organize many clean-up campaigns."

A regular supporter of the Plaza Art Fair, she has also traveled in an art circle in Kansas City and was rather well known for her paintings, especially her water colors. Some of the murals here at Westport, such as the one in the stairwell on the west side, were made under the direction of Betty Ortner. Another mural made under her direction is located directly across the street from Westport.

"As well as being an accomplished ceramist, the most important characteristic of Mrs. Ortner was the love she had for her students. She never said anything bad about one of them ... and had a tremendous respect for people," added Mr. Pond.

She is deeply missed and Westport expresses its sympathy on the loss of a beloved teacher and companion.

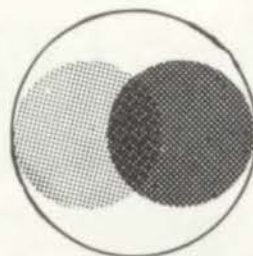

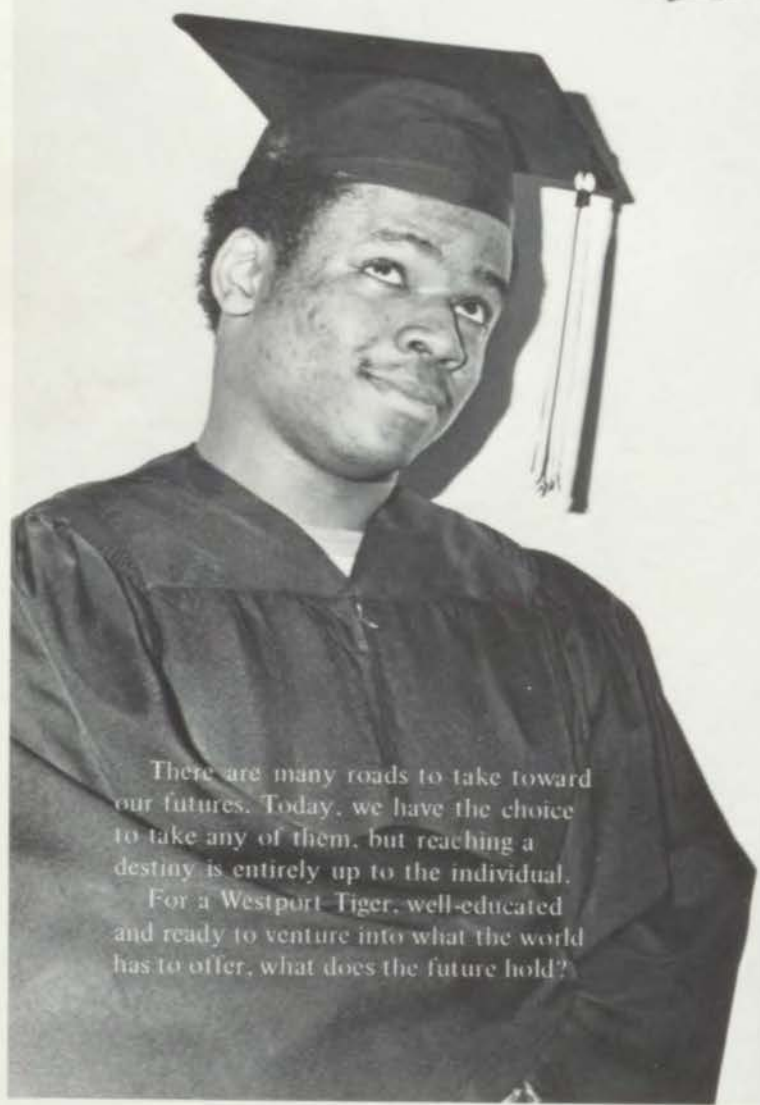
