





# UNCOVERING OUR PAST

Exactly 80 years ago, in September, 1908, the present Westport High School opened its doors. For its time, it was state of the art: electric lighting, central heating and completely fireproof construction.

A lot has changed since then, both at Westport and in the world. Now, Westport is the oldest standing high school in the city and due for a complete remodeling.

Most, if not all of the students who entered the new building in 1908 are dead now. Eighty classes have walked Westport's halls, left their marks — their pictures in old yearbooks and newspapers, their trophies in our cases — and passed into history.

In preparing this yearbook, the staff has searched eighty years of yearbooks. We've laughed over some pictures, puzzled over others, and often been amazed at how good the pictures were. What we have discovered in our dig through Westport's history is a proud and enduring heritage.

From 1908 to the present, we have seen the same optimism about the future, the same humor and mischief, and the same pride in her achievements that characterizes Westport today.

As we present this year at Westport, we would like to share some of the memorabilia we discovered while uncovering our past.






# ADMINISTRATION






The Varsity basketball team showed the real Westport spirit this year. Playing against some really tough teams like Southwest and Pius they rolled up an impressive record.


## A "Golden" Opportunity




