

After an August coup attempt by hardliners to remove Mikhail Gorbachev from power failed, the USSR was living on borrowed time. Week by week Gorbachev's authority weakened and Russian President Boris Yeltsin's influence grew as the republics called for the end of the Soviet Union. In December, 11 of the 12 republics formally ended their relationship with the Soviet Union and formed the Commonwealth of Independent States. Gorbachev resigned shortly thereafter and the leaders of the new commonwealth began the long process of settling their differences.



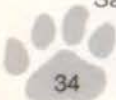

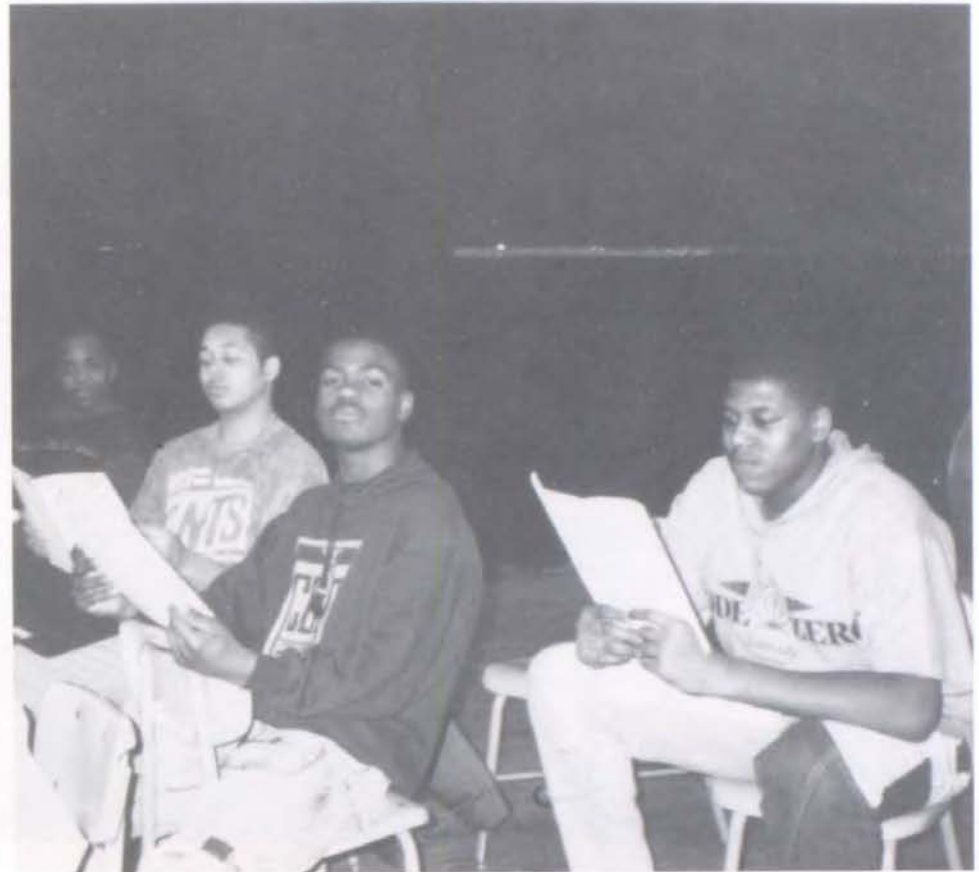

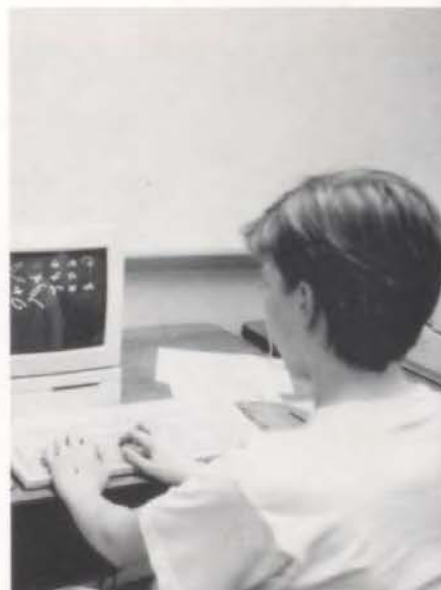

Boxer counts days remaining before step up

Like most kids who count down the days to Christmas, Randie Carver admits he's keeping a watch on the calendar. In just more than three months he turns 17 years old. When he does, the doors of the amateur boxing world will come flying open for him.

Just last week the East Kansas Athletics Club fighter completed a two-week workout at a camp at the United States Olympic boxing training center in Marquette, Mich. When Carver was finished, the camp's coaches added a note at the bottom of their evaluation sheet.

Highly recommended for international competition in Dec. '91

For a 16-year-old boxer who has already fought in both the National Golden Gloves and

U.S. Amateur Boxing Championships, the words were like music to his ears.

"Yes, I'm excited," Carver said. "Hopefully I'll be called on Dec. 3."

That's the day he will become 17 and eligible for international competition. It is a goal that Carver and George Smith, his coach at EKA in Olathe, have been working toward for the past couple of years.

Carver is 59-12 as an amateur. He greatly enhanced his chances of gaining international exposure during his stay at the USA Amateur Boxing Federation training center in Michigan. He received a 5, the highest possible mark on an overall evaluation by the camp coaches.

"I wanted to go out there and convince the coaches that I'm the kind of person they want for an international trip," Carver said. "It was a trip

to showcase the kinds of skills and manners I have, to show what I can do and fix what I can't."

Going by the camp coaches' evaluation, there is little technically wrong. Carver was ranked No. 5 in the camp in boxing skills.
