
Strictly Business Class of 1994






W e Mean Business at the Westport Business/Communications Magnet







Science students' soil project may detect local lead pollution problems

Mr. Klafta's Science Club students have been conducting a soil testing project this year to determine the lead content in local soil samples.

The research project will address this important environmental issue to determine the effect lead contamination has on children. Ultimately, the students want to do something to help reduce or eliminate the

possible dangerous levels of heavy metals which are known to cause sickness and even death especially in children. Selected sample sites throughout the Kansas City Metro area

out the Kansas City Metro area were used over an eighteen month period. EPA guidelines were used, along with soil testing kits, data and computer enhancement analysis and field hand tools.

Hey, Let's Avoid Becoming Another Statistic!

Mrs. A. White said,"I think deciding whether students want a world that is centered on valuing material things or centered on valuing human beings. It is the choice that future leaders have to make. Our generation is forgetting the value of human life. "Students could avoid becoming another statistic by going back to the belief that we are our brother's keeper, so that we may have closeness in our society. We feel responsible for taking care of each other.

"We, as teachers, should help the students develop an attitude to model how to be kind and treat others with respect. Learn that the desires to learn comes from the inside of one's heart. Be determined on setting his or her mind on what goal or obstacle it is that he or she wants to achieve."

Mrs. Robinson's response was that "Identifying meaningful goals and developing a plan for reaching those goals" is important.

"It goes back to focusing on their goals and then chances of reaching those goals will become greater.

"The impact varies from student to student; I can be an encourager or a discourager. It is therefore important that I communicate a caring attitude in as many different ways as possible:i.e., my words and actions should be consistently positive and fair. I should ask for forgiveness as often as I need to.

"As teachers, we should demonstrate love, caring, understanding, patience; we must continue to find ways to make our subject matter relevant and interesting. Be an example by modeling what we wish the students to gain academically and personally. They must challenge and question everything. They must also become keen observers and careful listeners.
