




JROTC WELCOMES SERGEANT MAJOR CALLOWAY




Jonathan Edwards




G8 Pledges Relief

Early on the morning of January 2, 2006. an explosion at the Sago Mine in West Virginia trapped 13 coal miners. The miners were 260 feet underground when the accident occurred. Twenty-seven-year-old Randal McCloy was the sole survivor.



Iragis Cast Historic Votes

In December, the United Iraqi Alliance won the country's general elections, although it failed to gain an absolute majority in parliament. A coalition is likely to be formed with other ethnic groups including the Kurdish alliance. Sunni Arabs also gained seats over the previous balloting, U.S. officials hope that favorable results from the elections will strengthen Iraq's government and help to move along the withdrawal of U.S. troops.



Change is the Verdict for Supreme Court

On September 3, Supreme Court chief justice William Rehnquist died of thyroid cancer. Judge John Roberts was named as his replacement on September 30. Sandra Day O'Connor, who had announced her retirement in July, agreed to stay until another justice was appointed

This molecular reaction is used to create medicines, plastics, and other products with more efficiency and less environmental hazard.



Women in Power

Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, a Harvard-trained banker and survivor of Liberia's brutal politics, took the oath of office to become Africa's first woman to be elected female head of state. In Chile, Michelle Bachelet was elected as the country's first female president. Her first fulfilled campaign promise was splitting the Cabinet down the middle to equally represent both genders, and women were appointed to half of the 20 seats.



The historic mission allowed scientists to take photos of the comet's surface. Information gathered may some day help scientists stop a comet if the Earth were ever threatened

On July 18, archaeologists displayed an ancient Roman dining set that had been hidden for two millennia in the volcanic ash of Pompeii, Italy. 


Did Global Warming Fire Up the Hurricane Season?


Still the Best Medicine

The return of the disease in 12 African countries has been linked to the failure of the Nigerian authorities to complete an immunization program in 2003.



Mending a Broken Heart

Johns Hopkins University researchers studied stress cardiomyopathy, often mistaken for a heart attack. Known as broken heart syndrome and associated with the loss of a loved one, researchers found that it's caused by a surge of adrenaline and other stress hormones that temporarily stun the heart.


88 Years in the Making



Squirt Alert

Massive South Asia Earthquake

A powerful, magnitude 7.6 earthquake shook the Pakistan-India border region on October 8 and triggered massive landslides that buried mountainside villages. This earthquake originated only about 6.2 miles beneath the earth's surface, which is shallow compared to most earthquakes. The earthquake's shallow nature caused the ground to shake far more violently compared to similar earthquakes that occur deeper in the earth's crust. Over 80,000 died and millions were left homeless as a result.



Dynamic Dinosaur Discoveries

Scientists are using fossils and new technology to learn how dinosaurs lived and died 77 million years ago. The fossil of a duck-billed dinosaur, nicknamed "Leonardo," was discovered in Montana almost completely intact about four years ago. Now researchers can use the latest tools such as CT scans and supercomputers, to learn how dinosaurs stood, moved and ate.



Dogs Sniff Out Sickness

A new study reported that dogs can detect if a person has cancer by smelling his or her breath. 

Two climbers discovered an ice-encased body while hiking 13,710-foot Mount Mendel in California on October 16. The man's body, found within the Sierra Nevada glacier, is believed to an airman whose plane

crashed in 1942. The man was found wearing a World War II-era parachule The wreckage from the plane and four other bodies were discovered in 1947.

A New Mammal in Borneo?

Scientists investigated whether a red-furred mammal, about the size of a house cat, is in fact a new species. A nighttime camera trap captured an image of the creature in Borneo's rainforest. If it is a new species, it would be the first new mammal species found on the Southeast Asia island in over a century.







The Tenth Planet

Astronomers have found a new planet beyond Pluto, in the outer reaches of our solar system. The yet-unnamed planet is thought to be 1.5 times bigger than Pluto and about 2 billion miles further away. Other planet-like objects in our system have been found by the same astronomers, but to date none of them have been defined as planets.

Great Apes in Danger

As few as 350,000 apes remain in the wild and the United Nations Environmental Programme (UNEP) believes they could become extinct within 50 years due to poverty, disease, hunting and logging in the areas where apes live. The UNEP also reported that almost half of the apes' habitat in Malaysia is expected to disappear within 5 years if current building trends continue.





The Name Game

The Washington, D.C. National Zoo's glant panda cub was given the name Tai Shan, meaning peaceful mountain, 100 days after his birth on July 9. As part of Chinese custom, panda bears are not named until after their first 100 days of life. Tai Shan's name was decided by popular vote—the winning name received 44 percent of 200,000 votes cast on the zoo's Web site.



Window to the Sea

In November, the world's largest indoor aquarium opened in Atlanta, Georgia. The Georgia Aquarium includes interactive stations and touch tanks for visitors to enjoy. This aquarium holds over 8 million gallons of water and more than 100,000 animals representing 500 species. It's a huge leap in size over the next largest aquarium—Chicago's Shedd Aquarium has 21,000 animals and 5 million gallons of water.



Dwindling Tigers

In a countrywide census, India launched its biggest survey ever to count the tiger population. The effort focused on national parks and reserves where scores of tigers have gone missing due to poachers and illegal fur traders. Experts estimate that there are only 3,500 tigers left, compared with a count of 40,000 tigers roaming around 100 years ago.



Brave Honey Bees

Researchers from several U.S. universities have trained honey bees to locate the vapors of buried land mines. The bees follow the vapor plume of mines until the source is reached. The bees are also light enough not to set off the mines, and bee training is usually completed in only one or two days.


