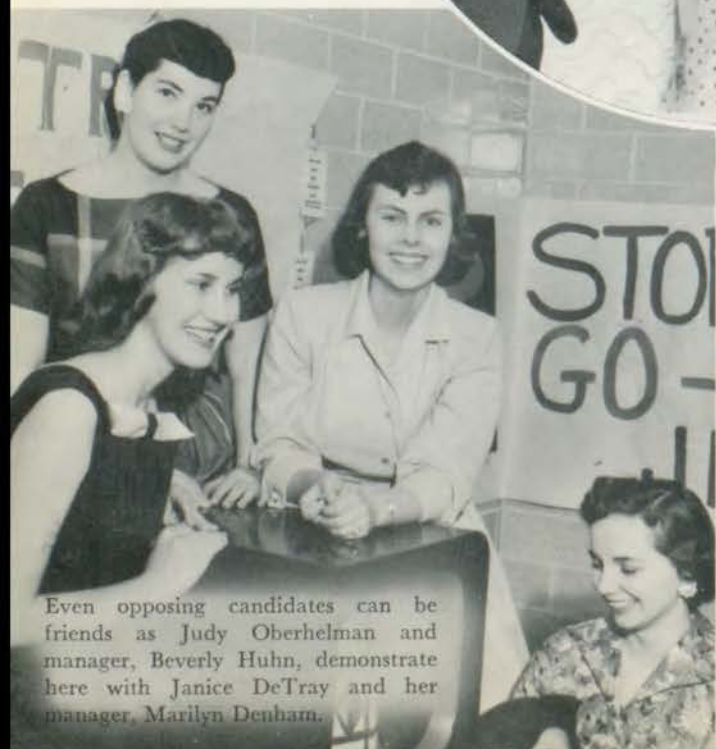

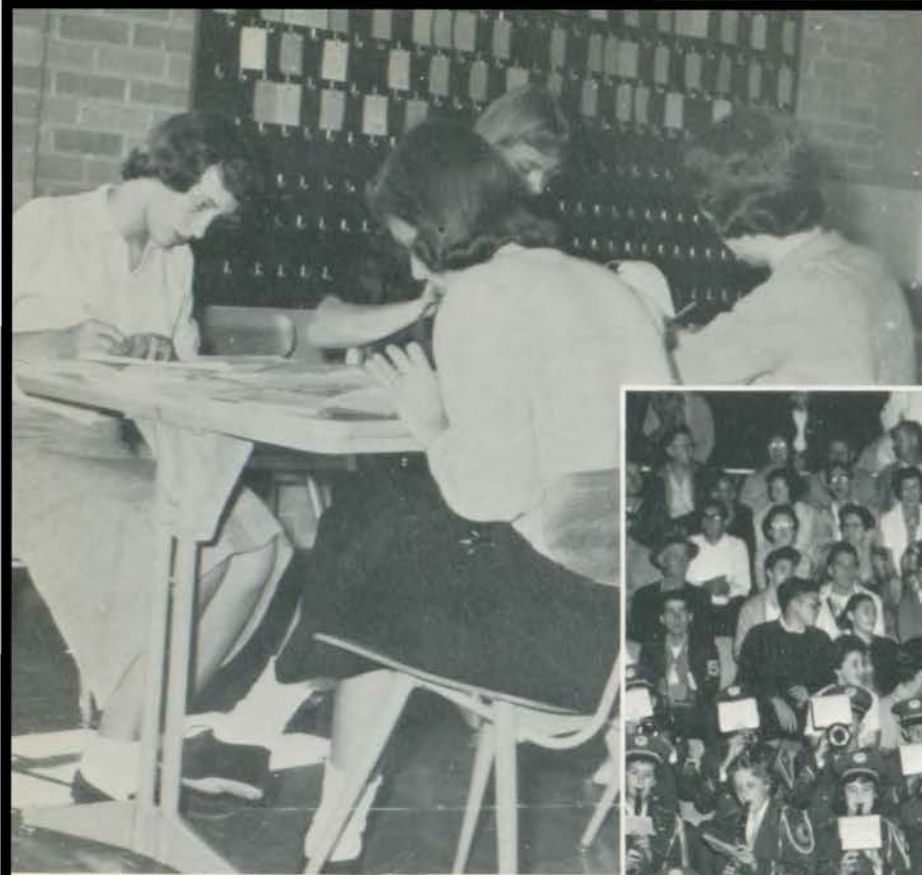

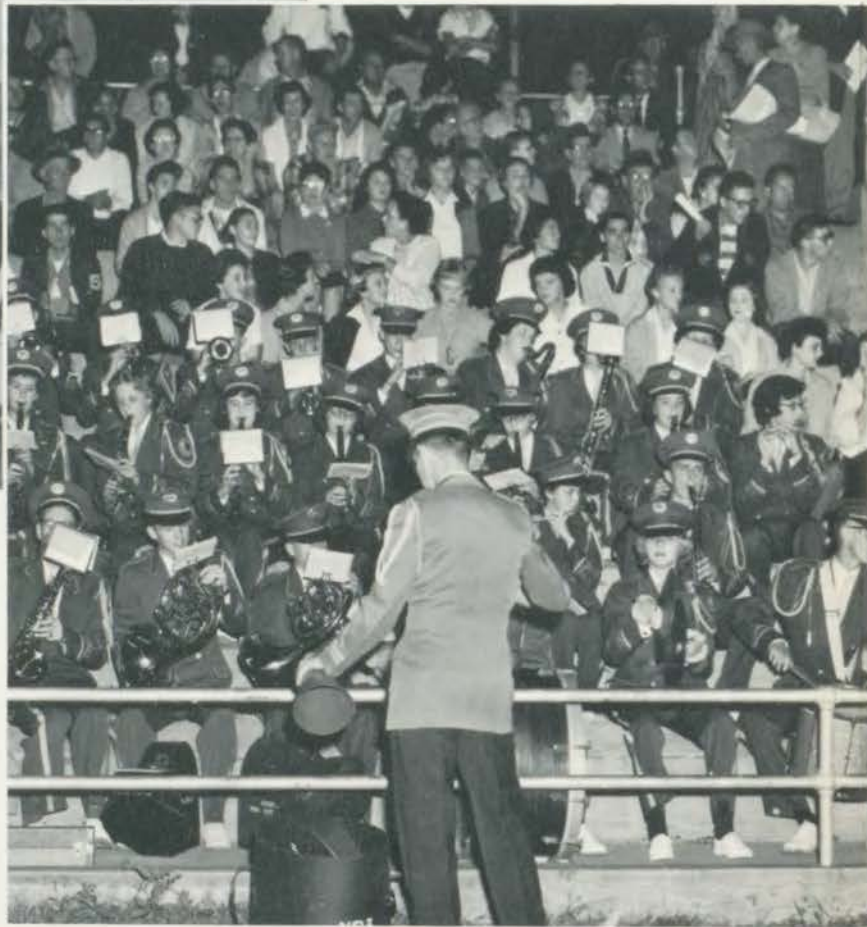

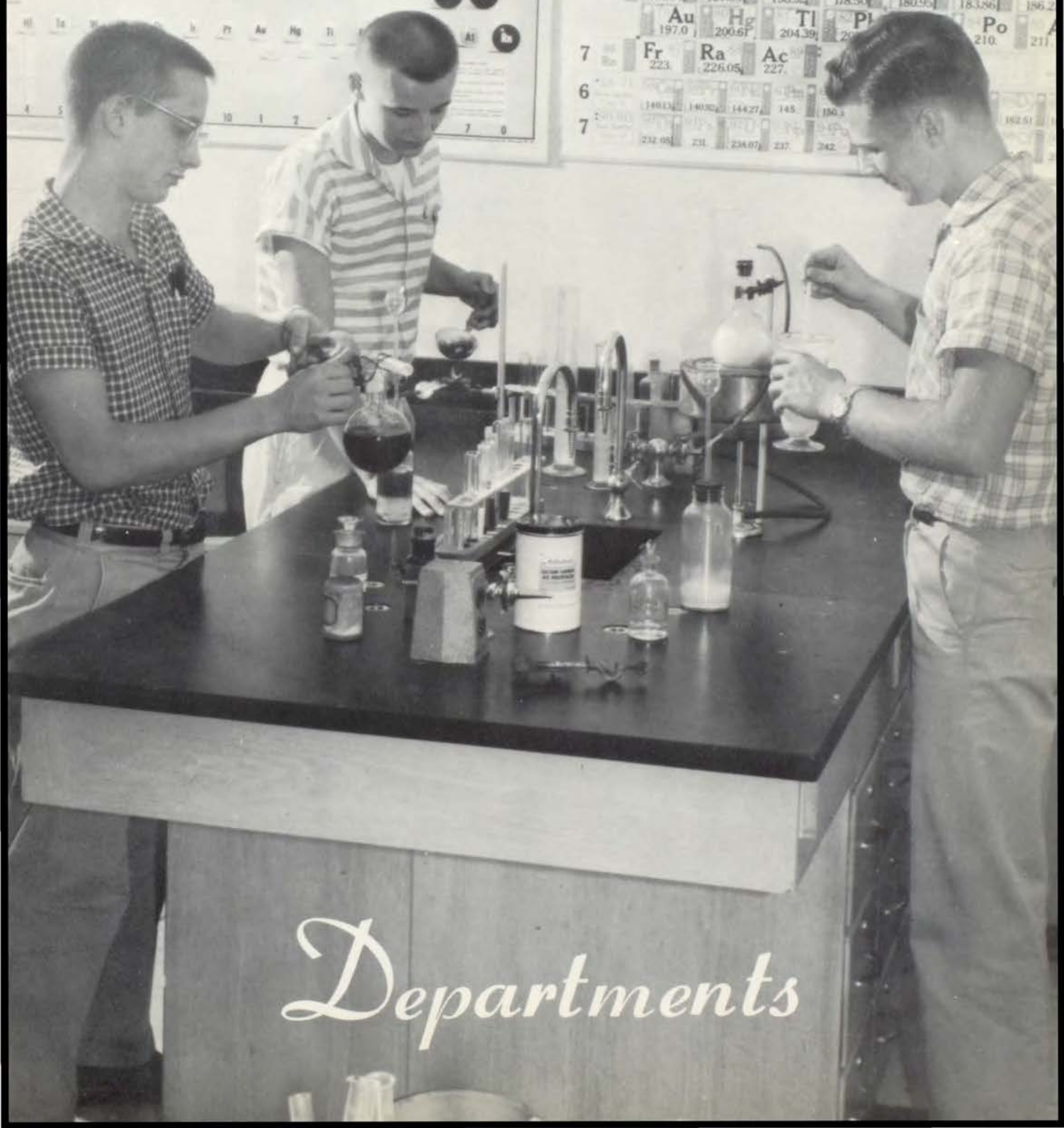


Generalized summary of metals and non-metals.  
 A metal has relatively loosely held electrons and has a tendency to lose electrons.  
 A non-metal has tightly held electrons.  
 If two atoms have approximately the same size, the one with the larger atomic number (greater charge) is less metallic.

# develops patriotism and honor

Military training in high schools was provided for by the enactment of the National Defense Act of 1916, as amended in 1920. The ROTC unit at William Chrisman high school was established in 1935 principally through the efforts of the Terey J. Ford Post of the American Legion.

The objectives of this course are:

- a. To inculcate habits of orderliness and precision, to instill discipline and thereby respect for constituted authority, to develop patriotism, and to encourage a high sense of personal honor and deportment.
- b. To give the student (cadet) elementary military training which will be of benefit to him and of value to the nation if and when he becomes a member of the Armed Forces.
- c. To develop an appreciation of the Army in its role of national defense and to fully inform all students (cadets) of the opportunities for service therein.

The complete course of instruction comprises three years, with a required minimum of 96 hours of instruction each year. It will be completed during the last three academic years of high school.

Hygiene and First Aid, Light Infantry Weapons, Marksmanship, Map Reading, Compass, Aerial Photography and Military Organization are but a few of the subjects taught in ROTC.

The purpose of high school ROTC is not to produce Reserve Officers. This mission is assigned to college ROTC units.

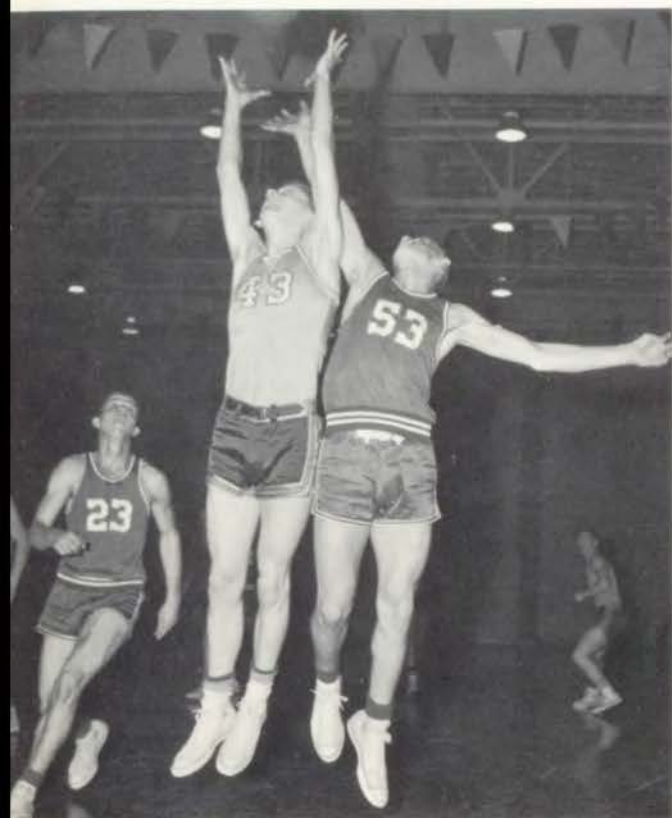

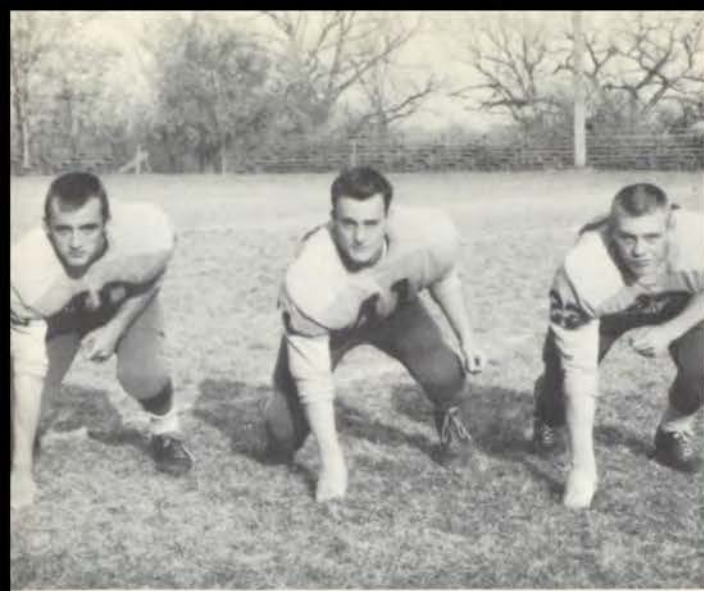

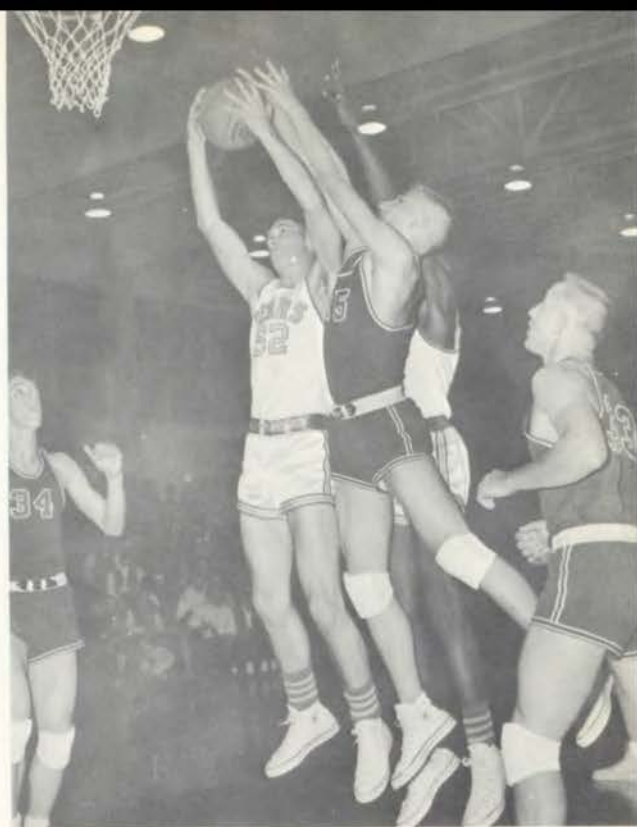

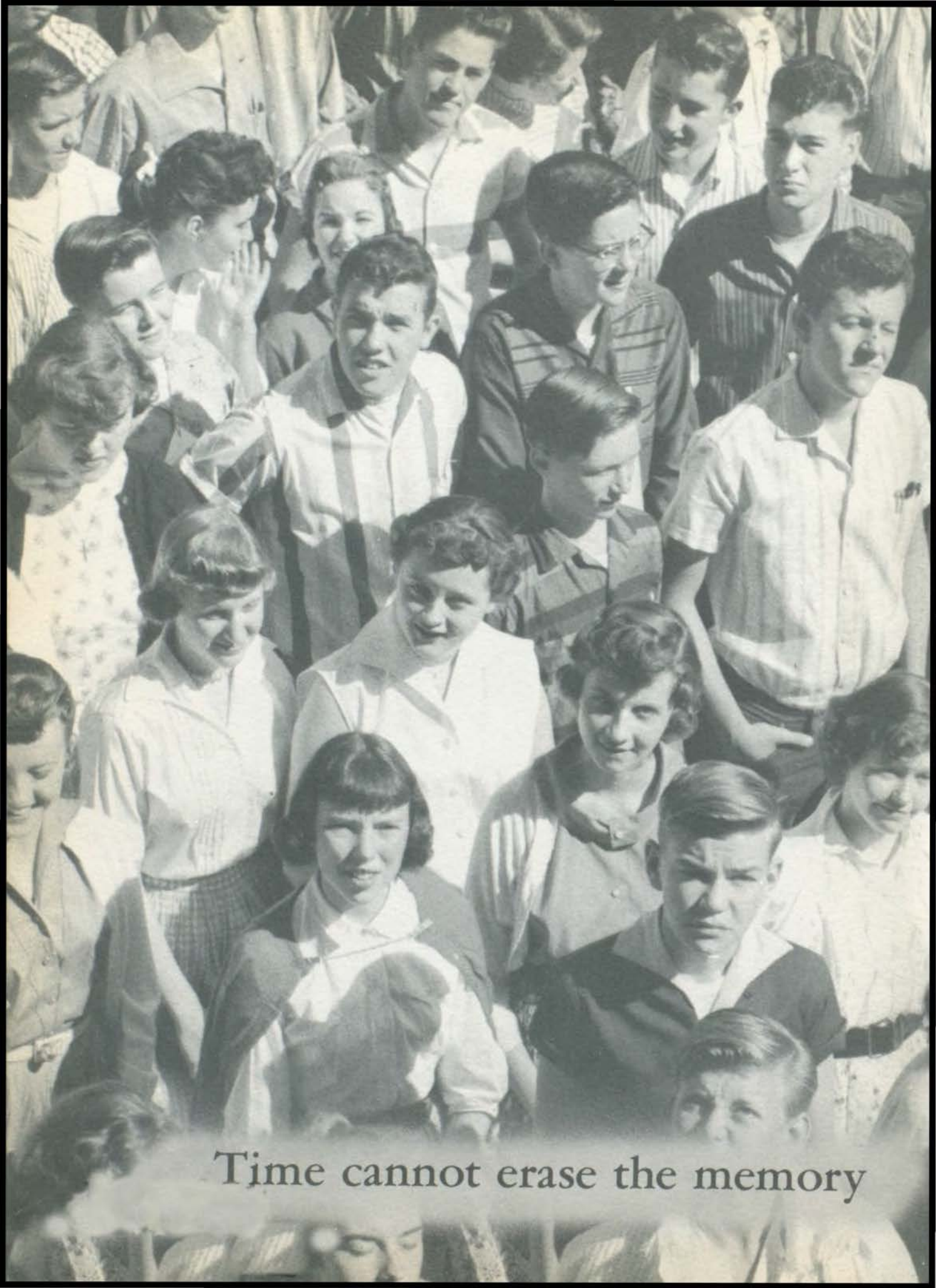
## Commencement Night
