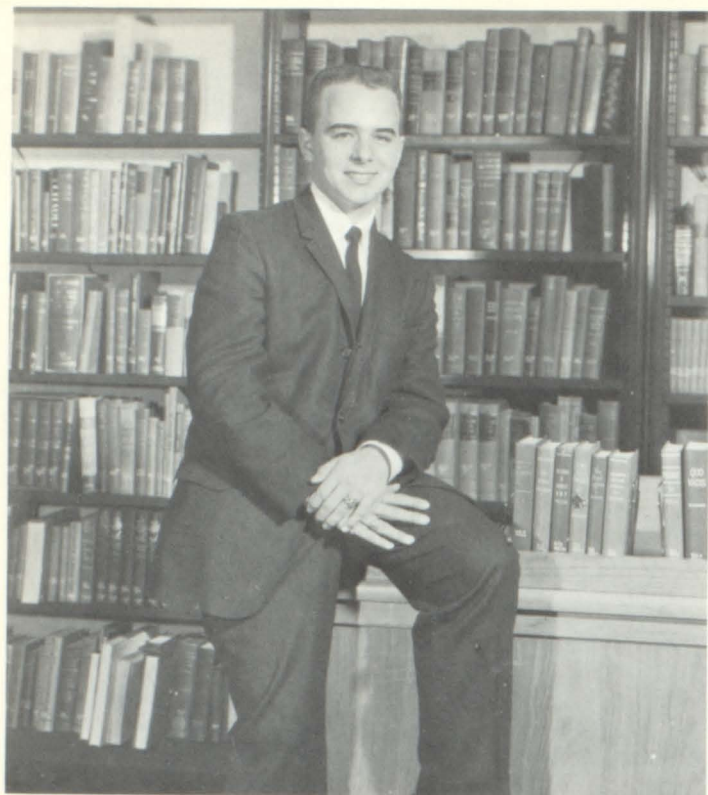

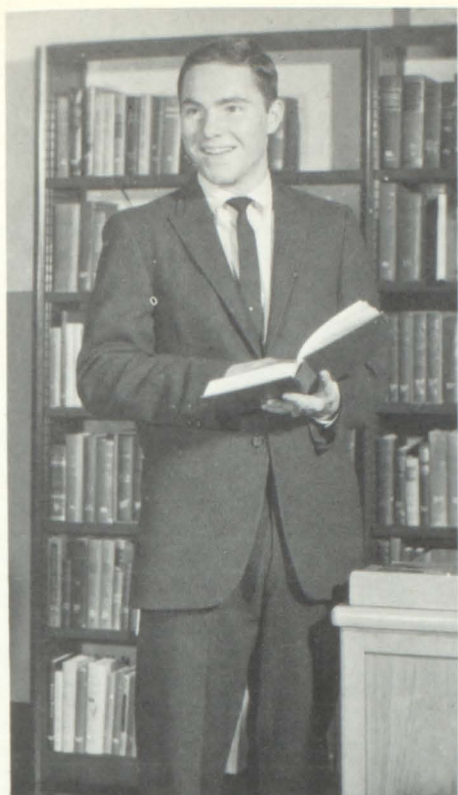


Doug Northcutt was elected Student Council President for 1961-1962. His election climaxed a March assembly in which all candidates campaigned.

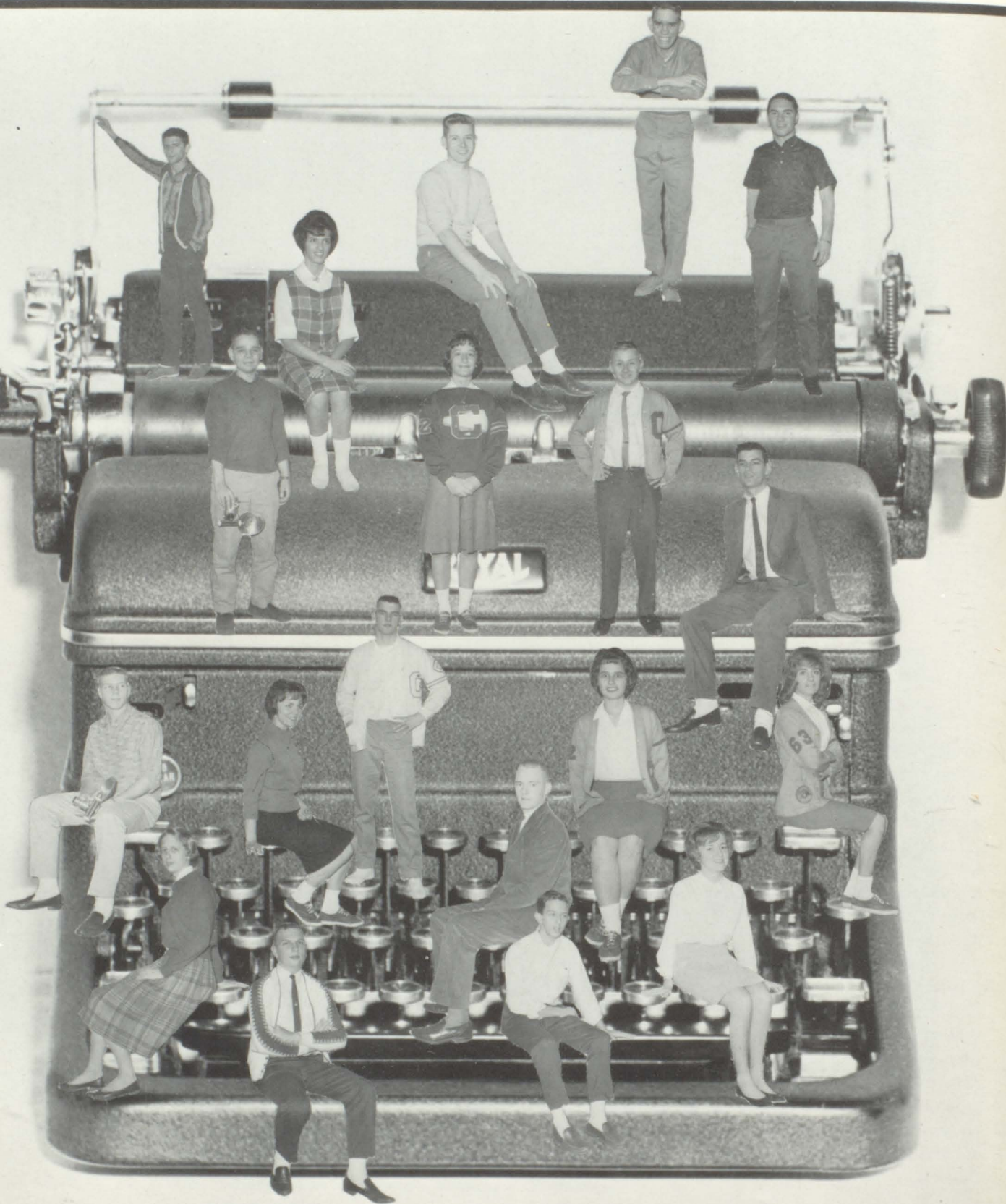
The Student Council acts as a continuously functioning government of and for the students. 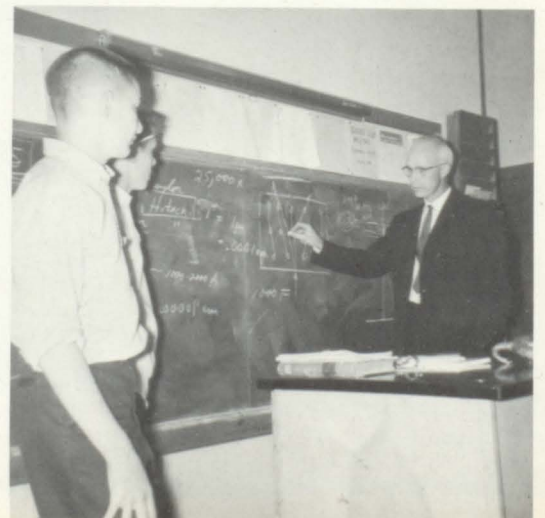

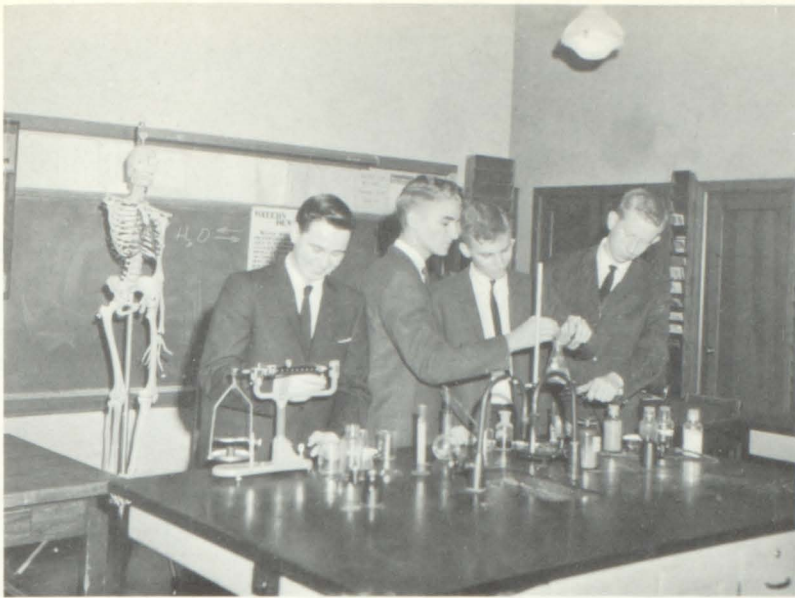

Left. Richard Zeldin and Gary Ernst clean the aquarium.



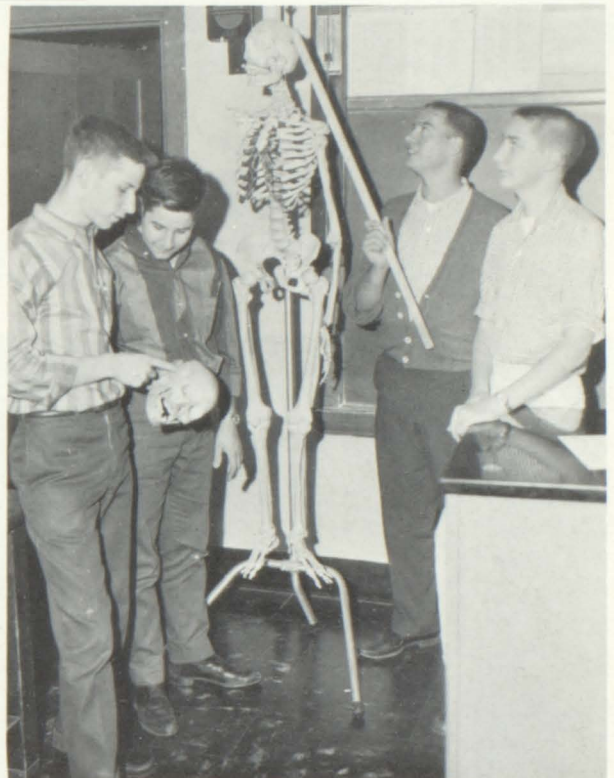

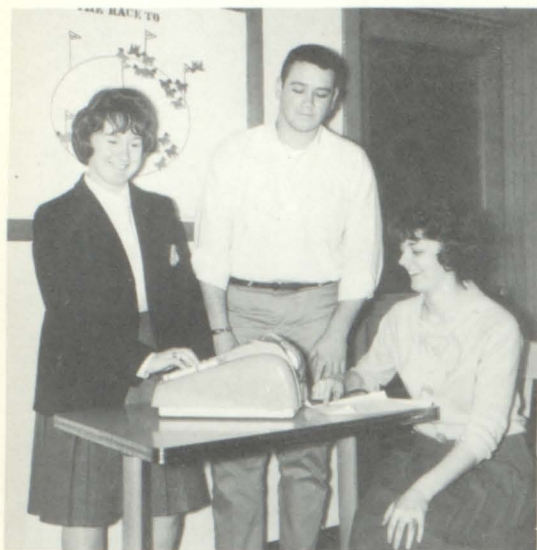

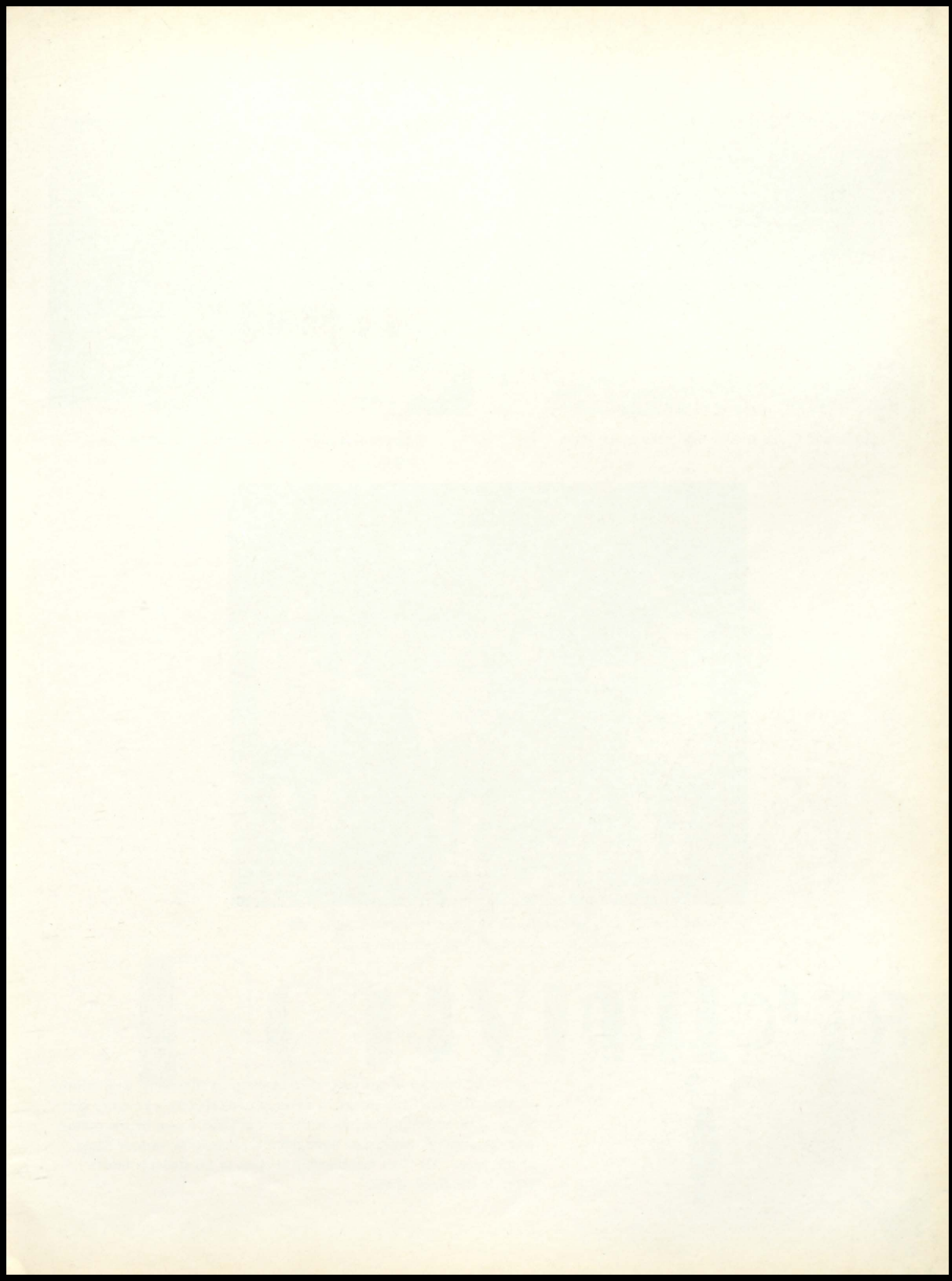


MARCHING BAND

Asked his opinion of the United States, Raul answered that he has been very happy here. "The people are so friendly to foreign exchange students."

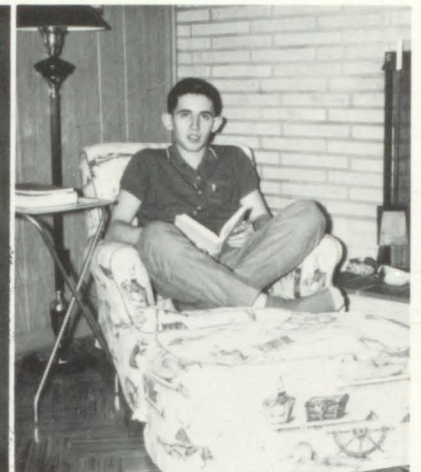

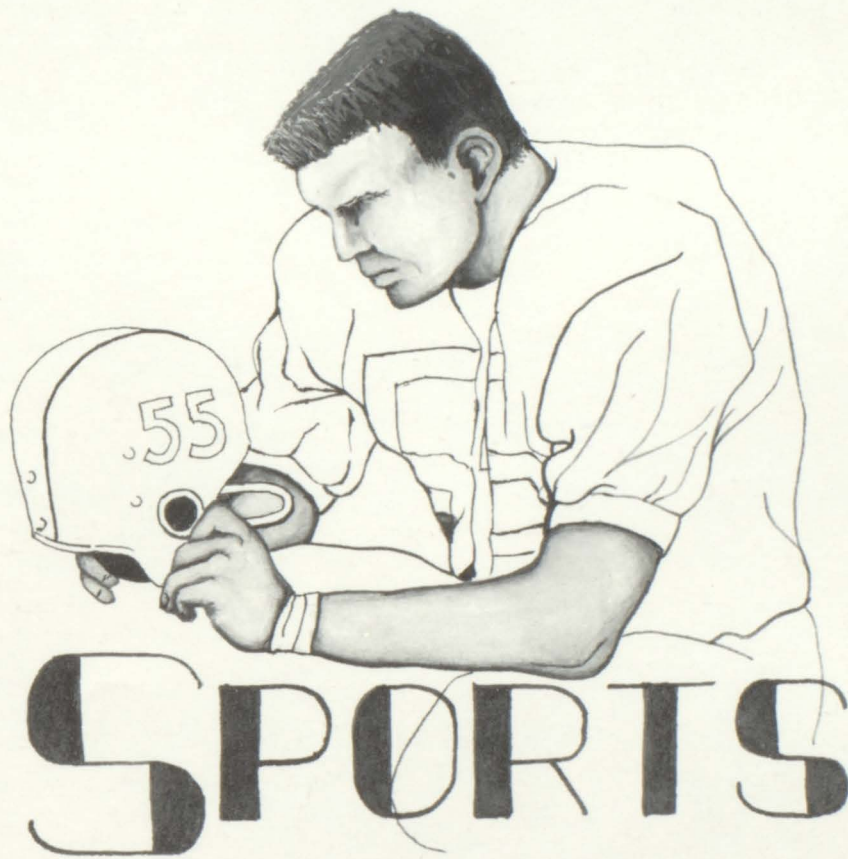

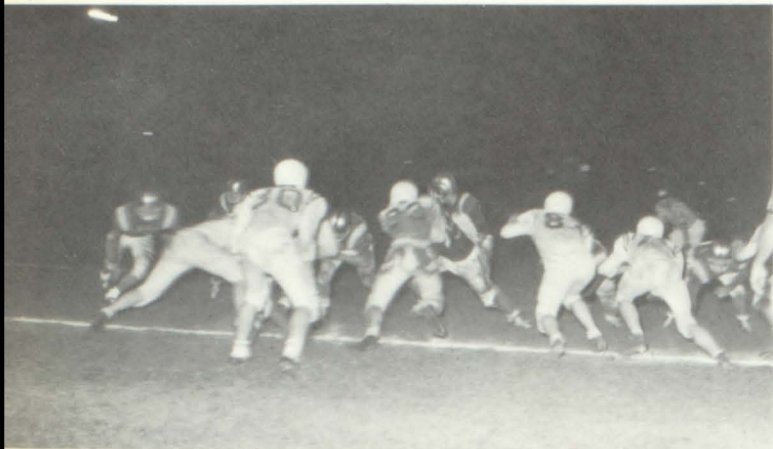
CENTER 20
