
STUDENT COUNCIL




CENTER 20 BELTON 0

The last score came in the fourth quarter as Jerry Parrott took a handoff from Roy and went 66 yards for the goal.

With a touchdown in every period, Center's gridiron gladiators set the Trojans back on their heels as they rolled to a 25-6 victory.
