





The Ford Foundation Grant

In 1982 East recieved an award of 1000 dollars to help improve the climate of our school. This award made us eligible for competing for a \$20,000 grant. In October we were advised that we had been awarded the grant to improve our school climate and develop a multi-cultural program for students during the 1983 school year. The money has been used to focus on our heritage and the development of an awareness of careers in agri-business.

East has representatives from 10 ethnic groups. Members of those groups have formed the HERITAGE CLUB.

The Club has four principle parts; the planning board, the student advisory, a performing troop and a two day spring fair. The founding club members have written a constitution that they hope will cause a new tradition to be established at East.






Mr. Liggins had so much to take care of this school year he had to be moved to his own room. With one less Asst. Principal this year everyone had to extend themselves.

Students at East are fortunate to have a K.C. Branch Library in the building. It offers them many extra services, such as film and record lending, research materials and a wide range of reference materials.








THE HERITAGE CENTER


