

















# 'My Dog Ate My Homework"













































# **Battling Sleep**



The Kansas City area was hit by a big ice storm in Jan., which resulted in 300,000 people losing electrical power. Some people were out for as little as four days, and even as many as ten days. The ice storm took us by surprise. "It was a tragedy, as well as a learning experience. It shows just how quickly people respond to others when in need. It shows how well the community can work together," says senior Frances Paden.
