In addition to bringing a Foreign Exchange Student to Raytown for next year, plans were made to send a Raytown student abroad.


A Safety Committee was appointed with Klaus Gottschalk as chairman to study traffic accidents and teen-age driving habits.



#### Differences As Birthe Sees Them

"Nearly everything is different here. It begins with different homes--German houses very often are duplexes or apartments--and the standard of living--you are much better off in general. Teachers are pretty well-paid, but my family at home does not have a TV, a washing machine, a car or a home of its own.

"Our school system is very different too. Children start to school at the age of six. After the fourth grade they can enter an examination for a secondary school or a high school. A secondary school has six more grades; a high school has nine. After the thirteenth grade we have a great examination and it is necessary to pass it to be able to attend the University.

"Our classes are organized quite differently. The fifth graders are divided into several classes of about 30-40 pupils, and these classes stay together all the time till the thirteenth grade. Because they all have the same subjects they have them at the same time. After some years, each class is a real community so we do not need special clubs.

"What do I think about the American people? I find that people are very optimistic and very, very kind here. The hearty welcome and blind acceptance I found here touched me deeply--we are more conservative, you know. We usually examine a person thoroughly before we accept him.

"You can't imagine how much fun it is to have a new experience every day, to meet a new nice person every day and to live with a wonderful family in a wonderful community. I am happy, grateful and proud to be here."


MR. DALDRUP:
