After attending Graceland College in Lamoni, Iowa, Mr. Heath transferred to CMSC and graduated from there in 1959. He is married and has two sons.

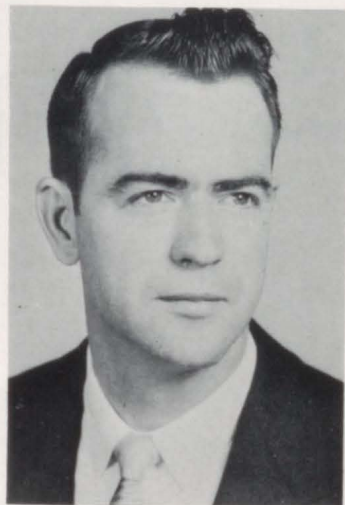

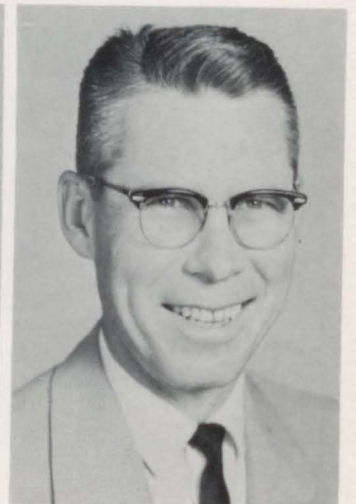
Both Mr. Atkins and Mr. Heath are very much interested in furthering their education. To do this they are busy now filling out applications to teachers' Summer Institutes.

Senior Success Story 1961

When this year's record of senior achievements was listed we discovered that the class of '61 had made quite a name for itself. Individual seniors had won recognition on a national scale and the class as a whole was well-known throughout the state. This year's graduates had proved themselves to be good students and good citizens, actively participating in worth-while fields of endeavor.

Look at the list of their scholastic honors. For the first time in the history of Raytown High, the National Merit Scholarship Foundation named six Raytown seniors as finalists. Carl Cook, David Howe, Margaret Mehl, Arthur Nickless, Marsha Talbott and Mary Eleanor Zachman successfully competed for this high honor. Seven Letters of Commendation were awarded to: Steve Dearborn, Gerald Davis, Earl Ingold, Keith McGranahan Elizabeth Mehl, Bob Osborn and Kathleen Withee. Also in the scholastic field, David Howe and Arthur Nickless won consideration as finalists in the General Motors' National Scholarship plan.

Senator Stuart Symington nominated J. T. Battenberg to the U.S. Air Force Academy. Jim Evermonde also won a nomination to the Air Force Academy, his sponsor being Representative William Randall. Nominated to the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis was Charles Walthall. His sponsor was Senator Edward Long.

Two Raytown seniors placed in the National Council of Teachers of English writing contest. Mary Eleanor Zachman was one of 13 seniors named as winners from Missouri, and David Howe was one of 13 runner-ups.

As a class, the scholastic record of this year's seniors was impressive. Over the course of its high school career, this class had larger percentages of its students on the Honor Roll than any other class. These seniors also had the highest class average score on the Ohio Psychological Test of any senior class in Raytown's history.

Expressing a very active interest in the state and national governments, members of the class of '61 won a number of important offices in Boys' and Girls' State and Boys' Nation. Tom Plaskett, elected Governor at Boys' State went on to become Senate Majority Leader at Boys' Nation. J. T. Battenberg was elected Missouri State Treasurer to serve with Tom, thus giving Raytown two of the very top positions at Boys' State. Jo Edwards at Girls' State ran for the office of Lieutenant-Governor and served on several strategic committees.

Also on a state level, Jo Edwards served as Missouri President of the Future Teachers of America. She held this office for the 1960-1961 year, the first Raytown student to hold this high position.

An interest in politics showed itself here in the school government. The class of '61 began the Junior and Senior Executive Committee system of organizing student activities by class. This has since become traditional.

Good citizenship has long been an interest of this class as was evidenced by our founding the Key Club and International Relations Club. Molly Shirk was nominated for the DAR citizenship award. Eight Raytown seniors competed in the Mnookin-Brown scholarship contest. This scholarship judged students on the basis of their human relations attitudes, in other words, on their prejudices or lack of prejudices.

Yes, this has been a most remarkable class, the class of 1961.

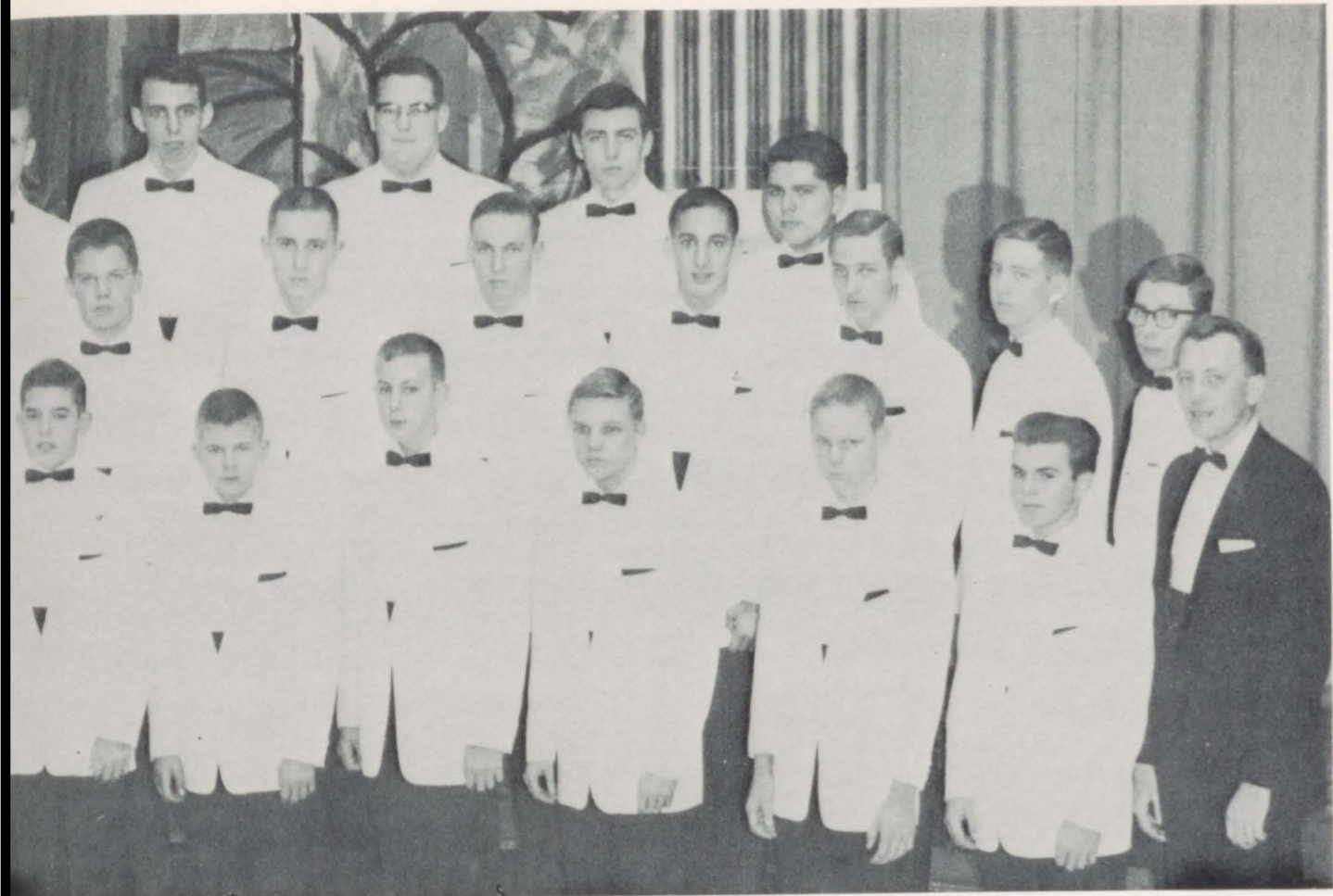

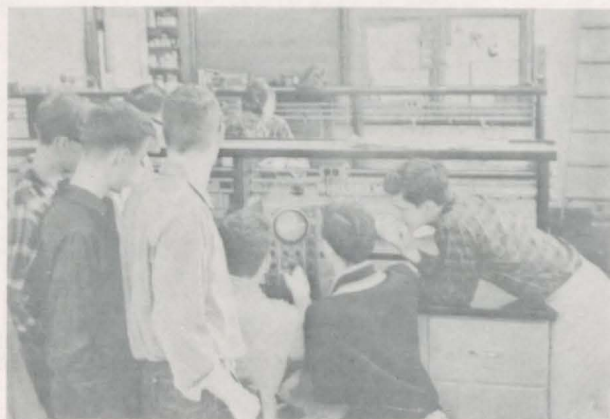

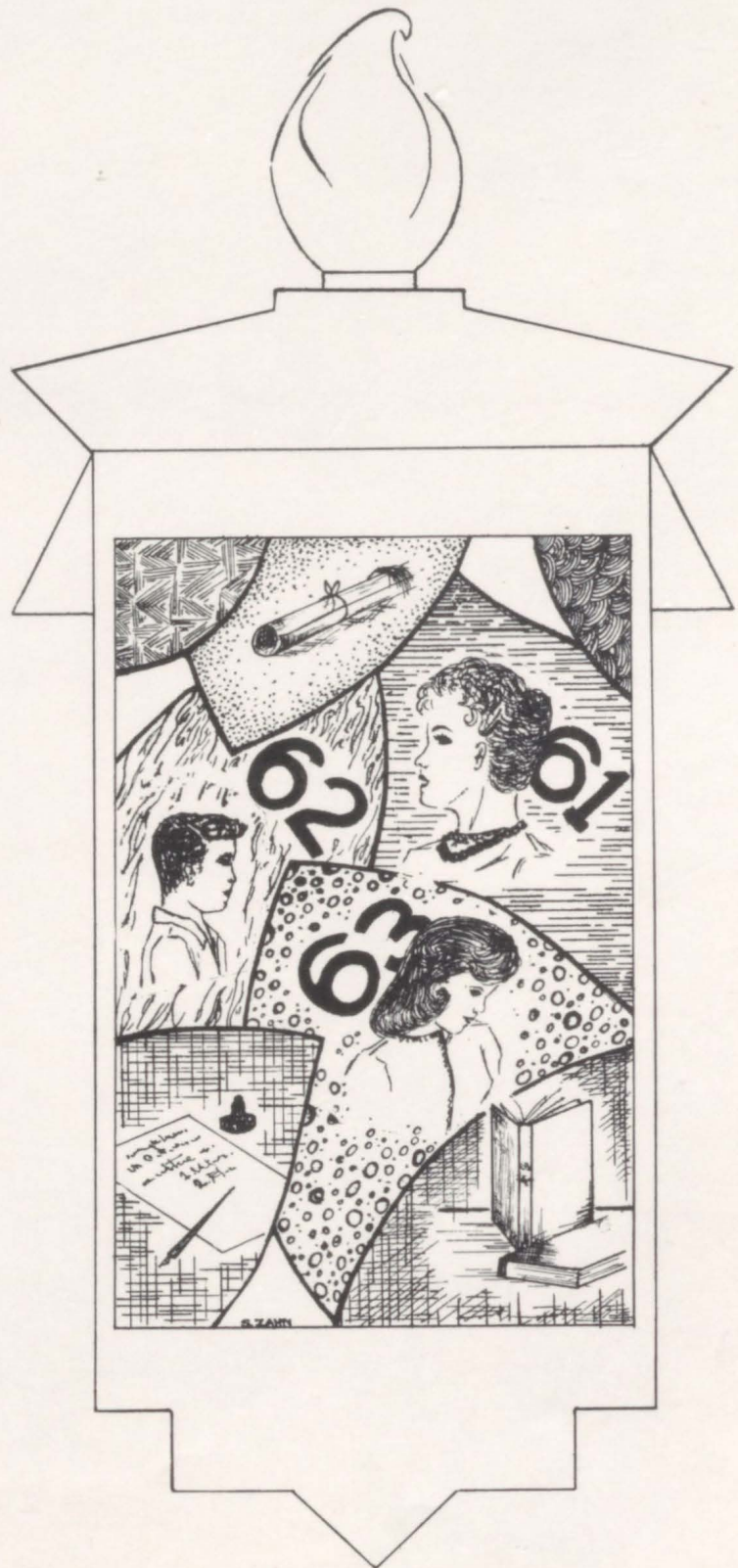
International Relations Club

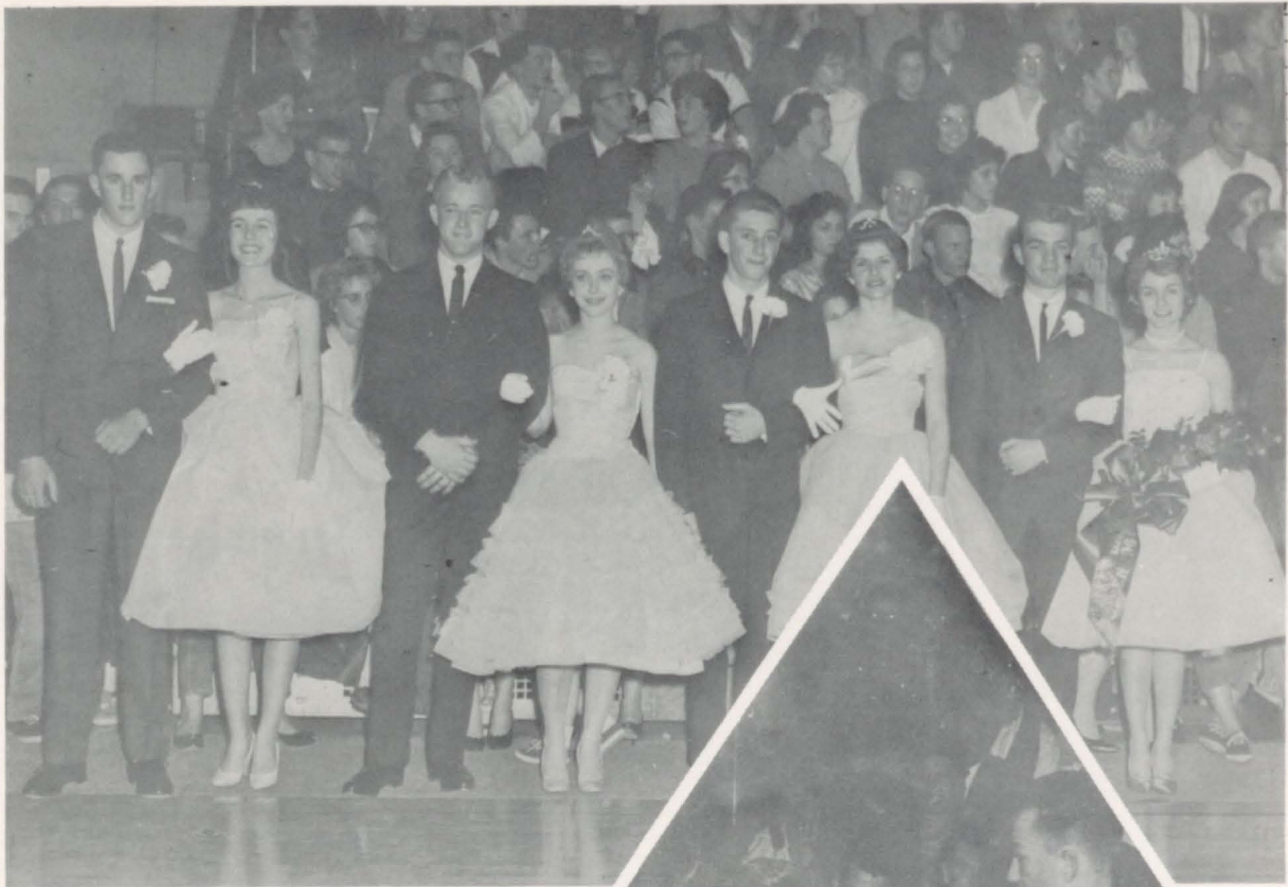

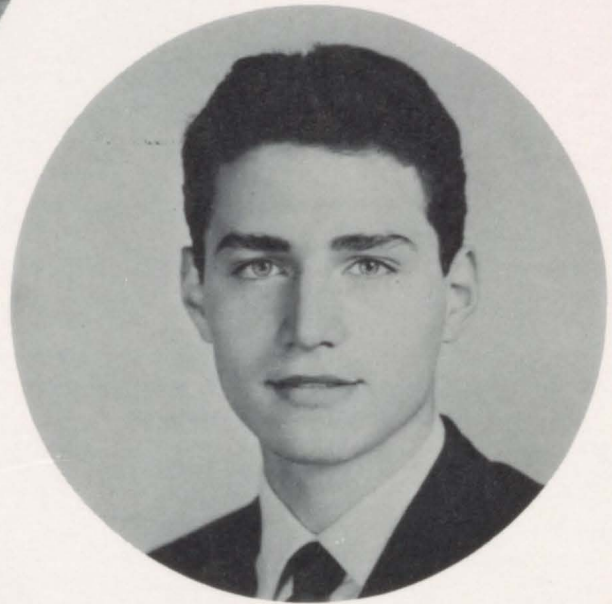

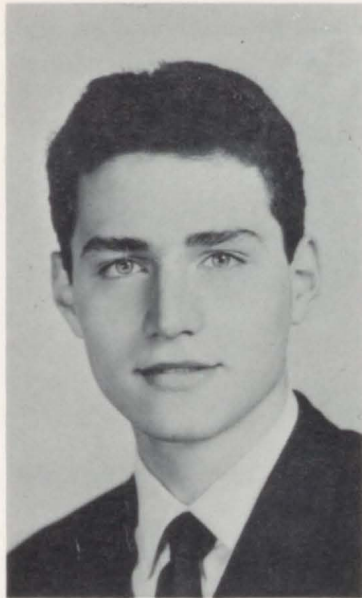

Nicos Views American Life

A year of living with an American family, of attending an American school, of sharing everyday's life with you, has passed. Now, as the time to say good-bye comes, I look back. America is a second home to me because I really got to know her through you.

It is hard to realize how wrong sometimes a person can be until he sees for himself. We in Greece usually think of America in terms of gangsters and Cadillacs. This year has taught me how wrong we are. When I return to Greece I will do my best to inform my people what you are really like, and I will be more than willing to defend your reputation when it is unfairly attacked.

I wish to thank you, my friends, for making possible my being one of you this year. You shall live on in my life. I hope my presence here has been of some benefit to you and I hope in the years to come, you and I can help to build world peace.

We are not going to promote any better world understanding just by reading about other countries. Instead, let us meet each other. At home we have often been badly hurt by the Turks; yet on my trip over to America, some of my best friends were from that country. Today, I no longer know what the word "enemy" means---Aren't we all basically the same?

American Students Abroad

Early in the fall of 1960, the juniors at Raytown High School, who were second-year language students, were asked if they would be interested in going abroad during the summer of 1961. This program is under the sponsorship of the American Field Service (AFS), which brings foreign students to the United States as well as sending American teen-agers abroad. Since Raytown had no representatives in foreign lands last year, interest this year was rather low. However, four candidates: June Owings, Ann Thompson, Scott Vorbeck, and Mary Jane Williams made application to the local committee. This committee, composed of administrators, teachers, students and laymen, interviewed the candidates and agreed to have them apply to the New York office.

The AFS office can place only as many American students as there are homes available in other countries. There are about 1,500 families who have agreed to house a foreign student this summer, compared to 970 last year. Eight thousand candidates were considered this year by the New York office which eliminated all but 2,500 in the first screening. On February 6, 1961, Raytown was notified that Ann Thompson and Mary Jane Williams had qualified as semifinalists.

From our fine relationships last year with Birthe Jacob of Germany and with Nicos Tsemanis of Greece this year, R.H.S. students learned that this program is a wonderful instrument in the establishment of better international understanding. It is especially hopeful that our own good will ambassadors can be sent forth this summer.
