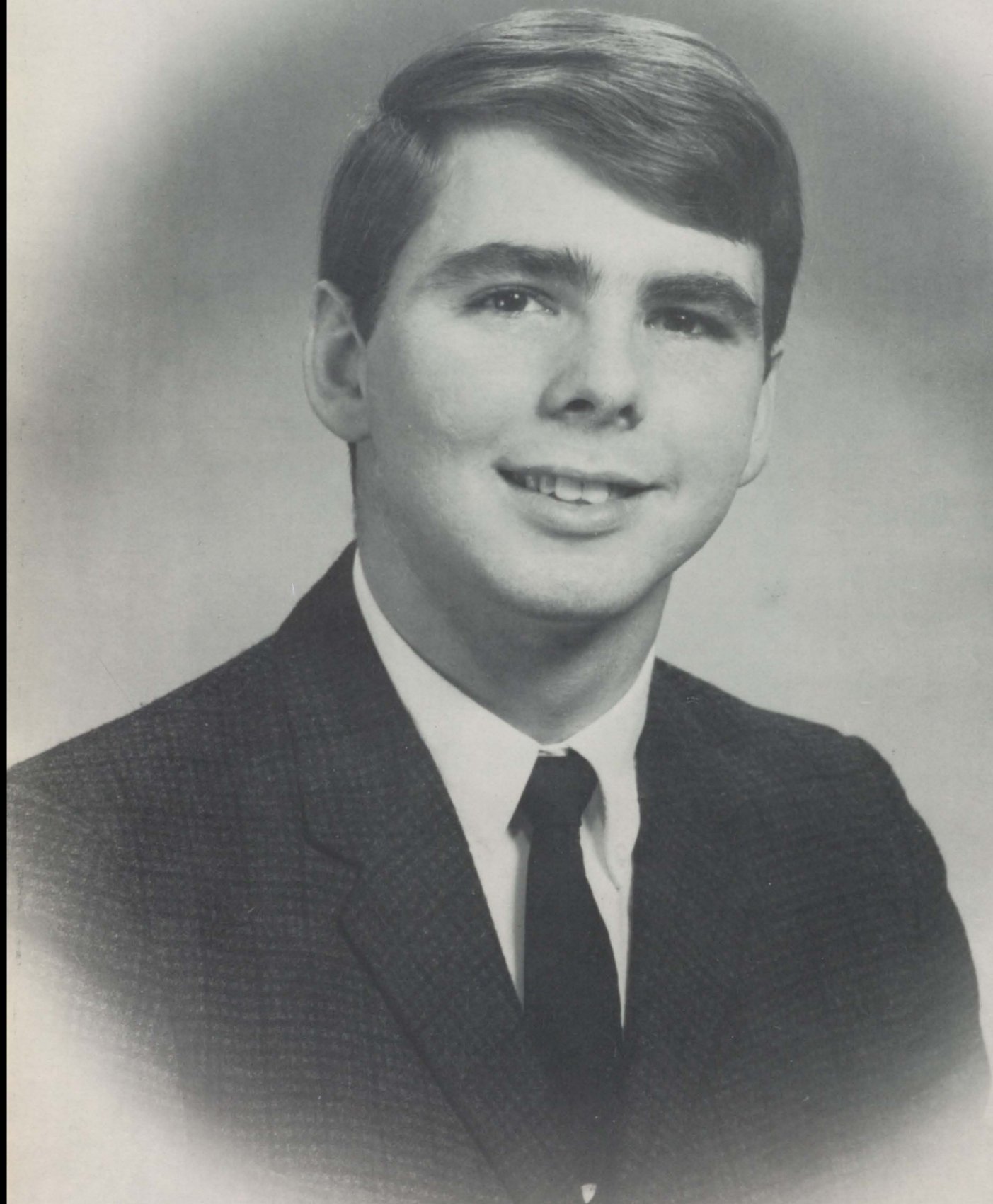

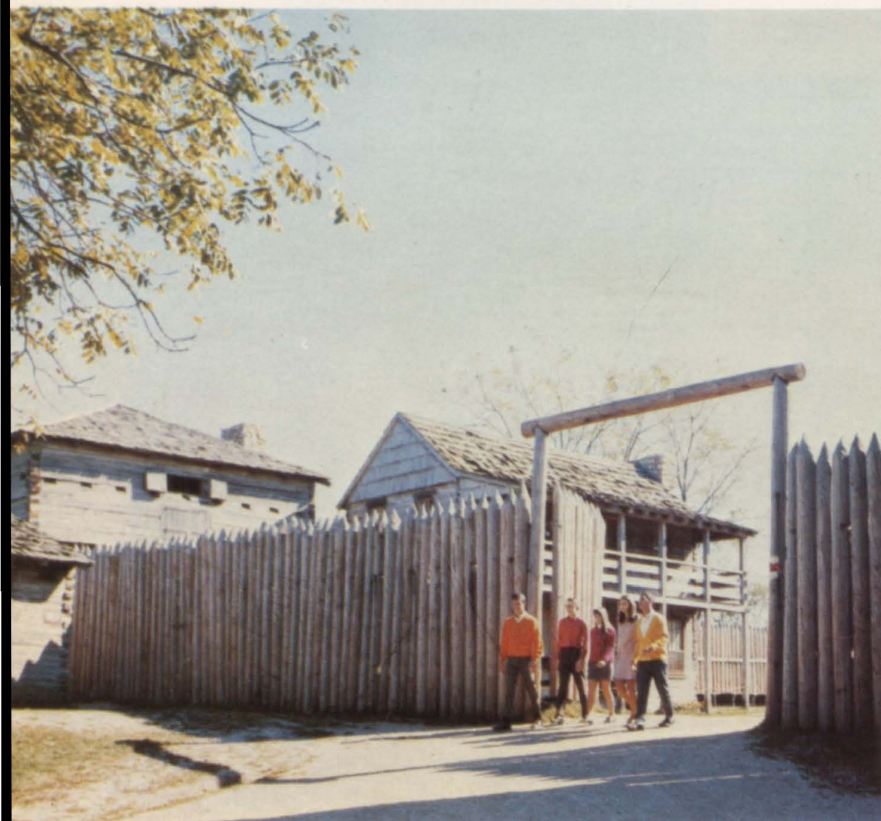

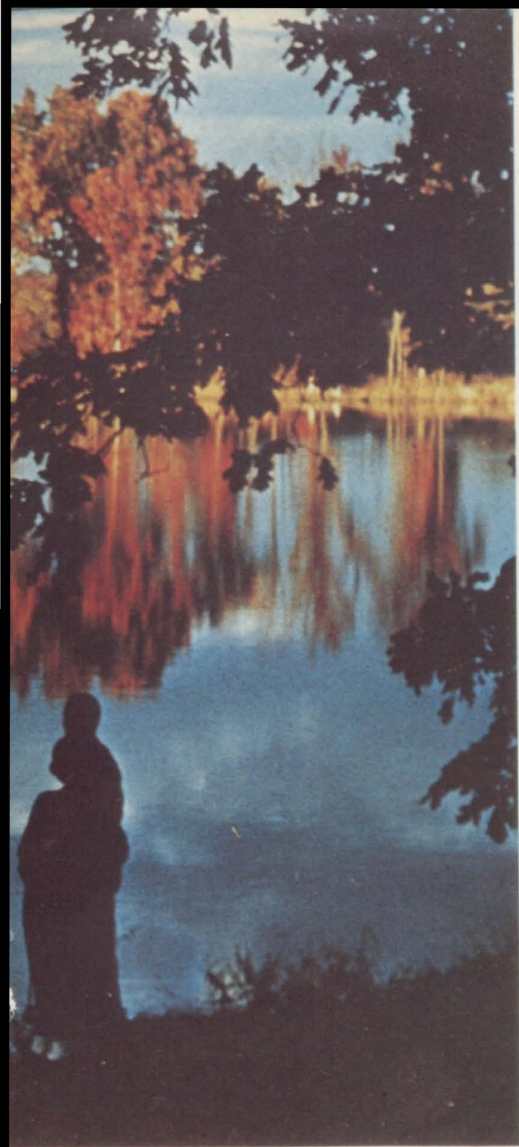

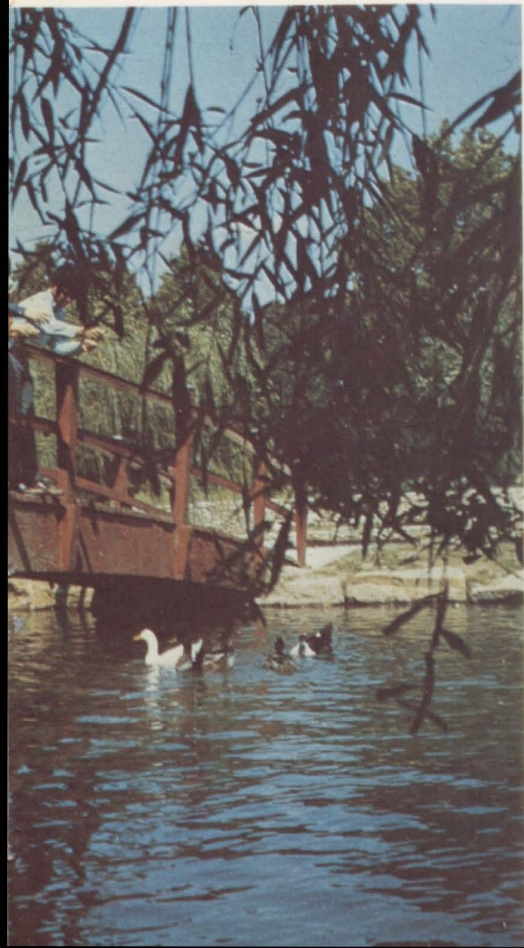

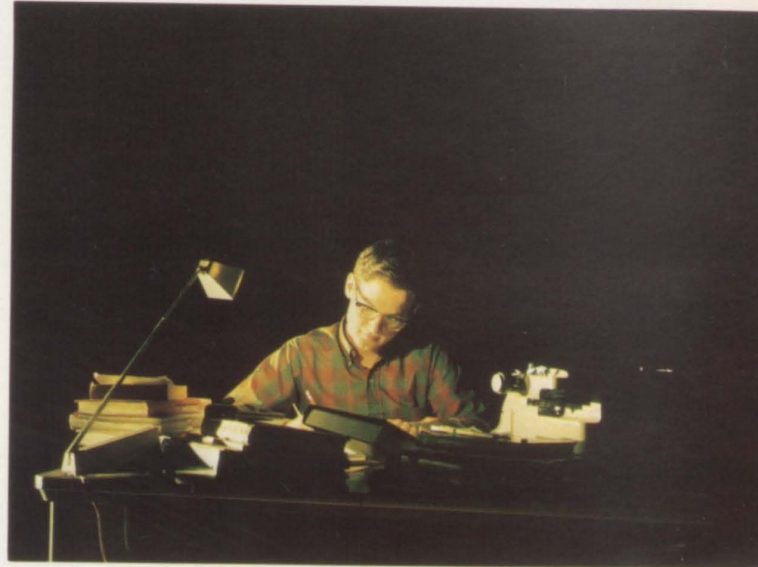

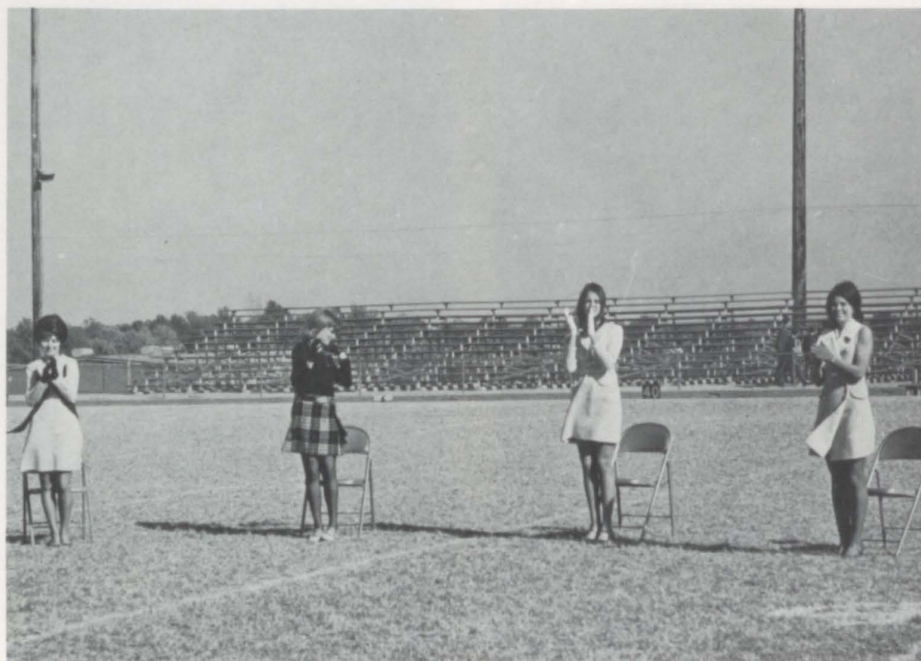

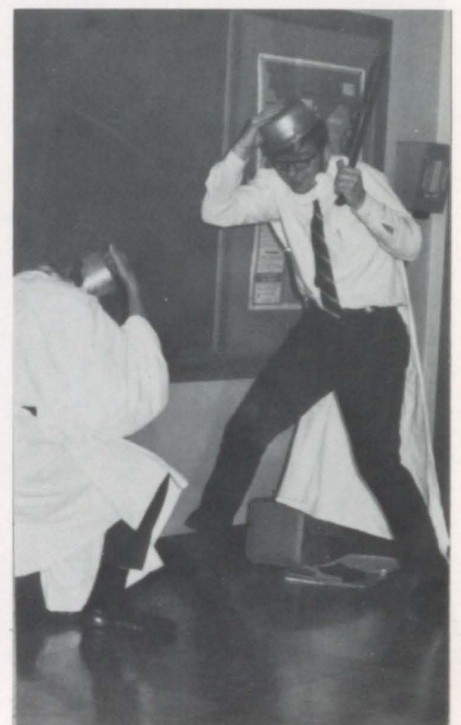

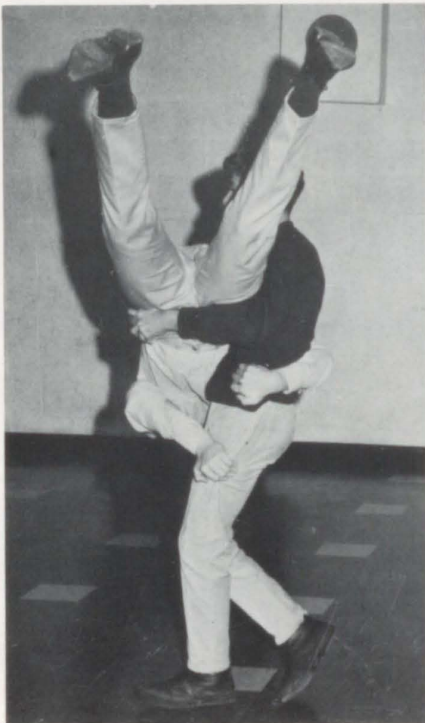

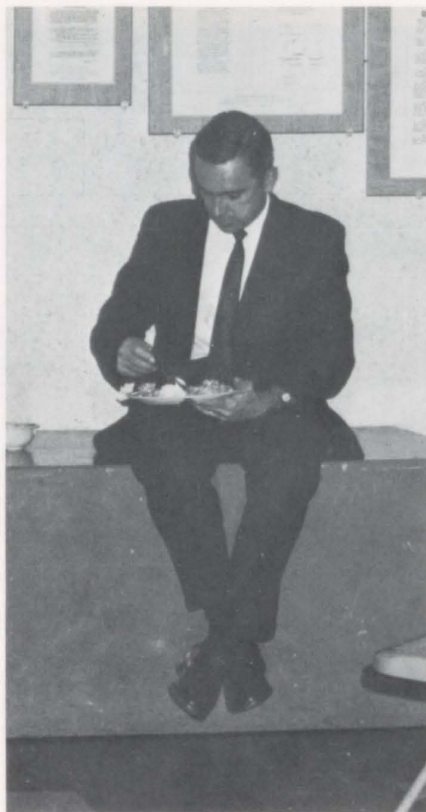

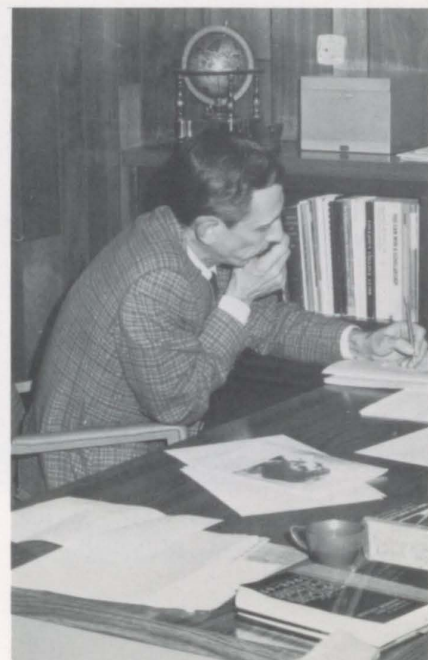

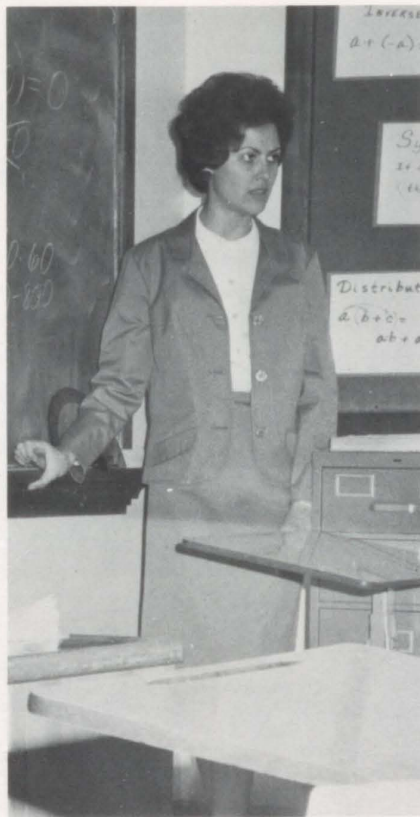

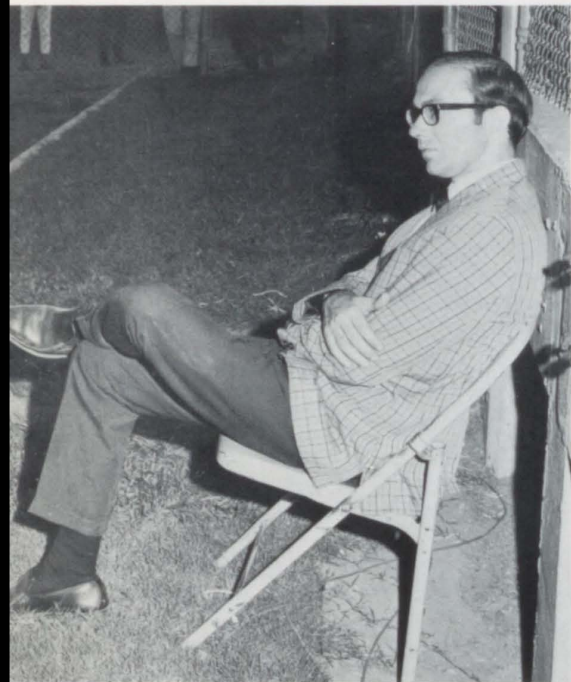

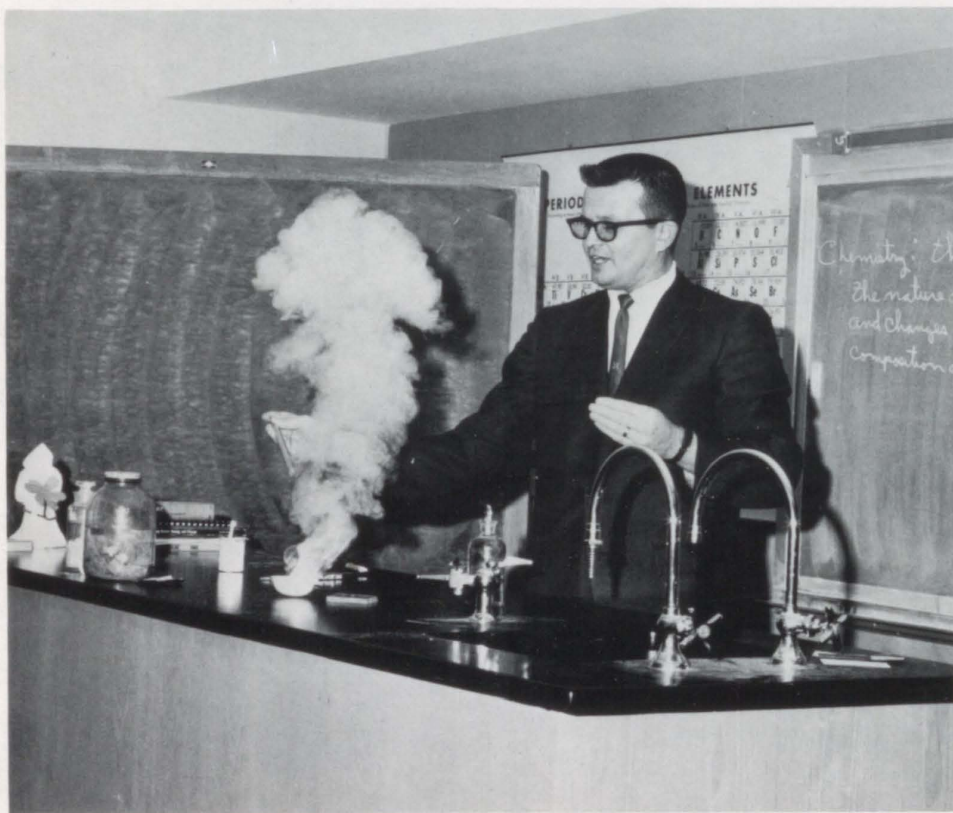

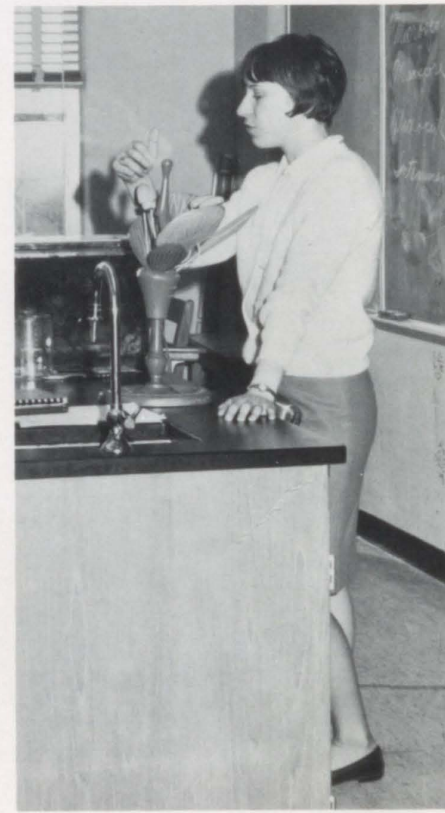

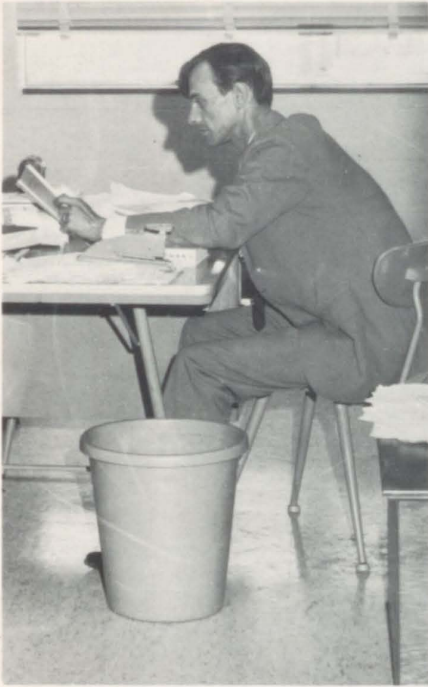

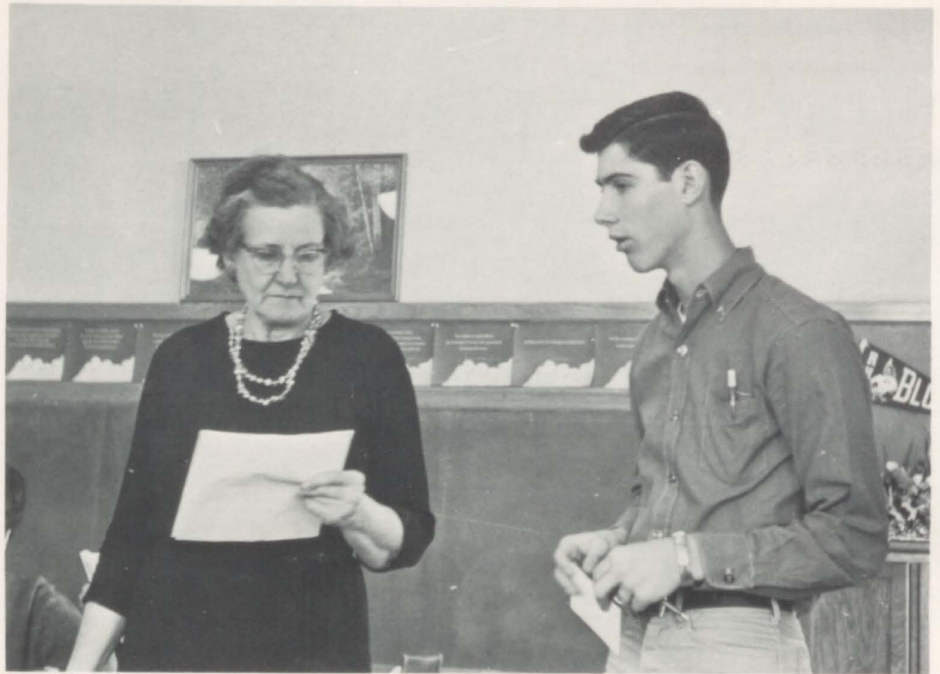

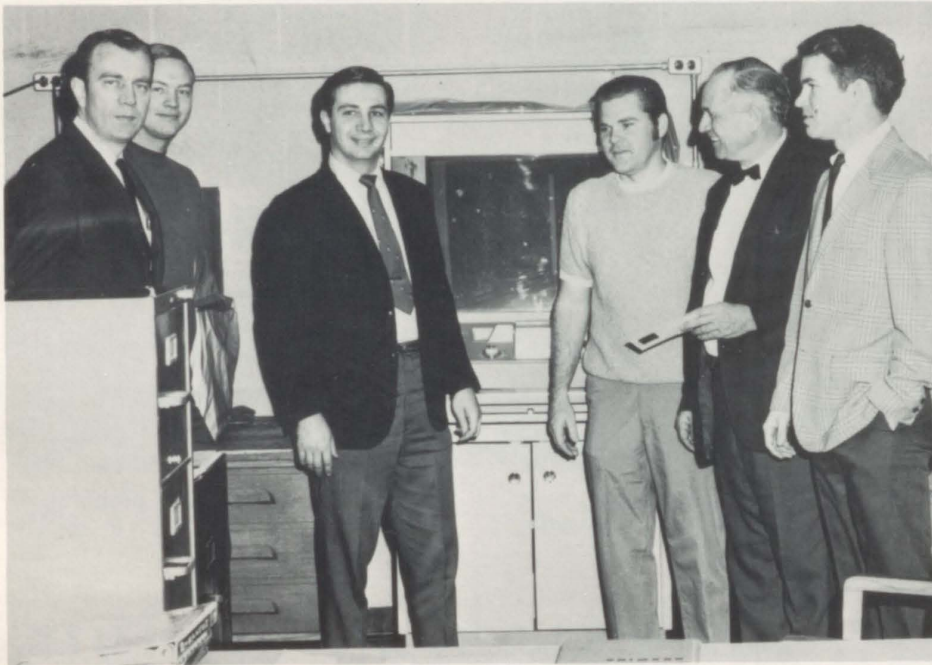

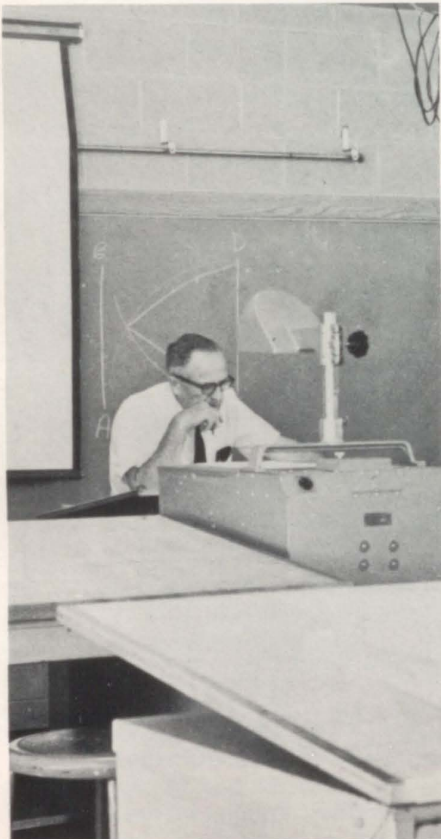

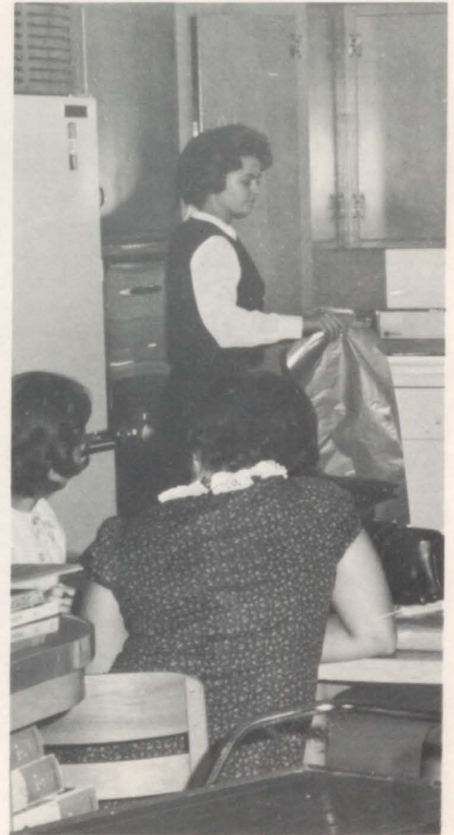

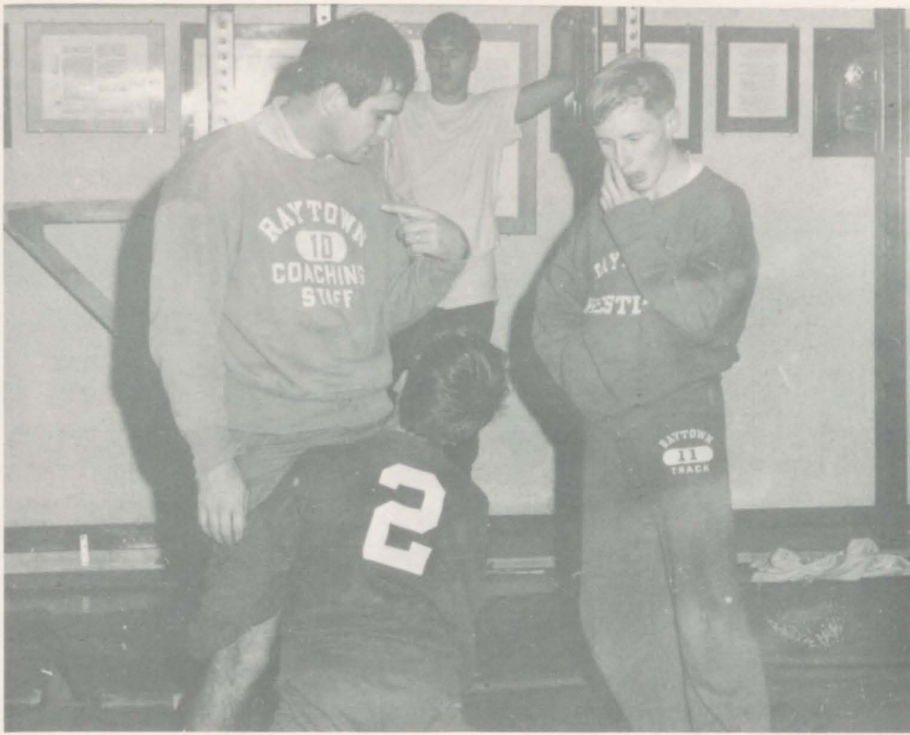

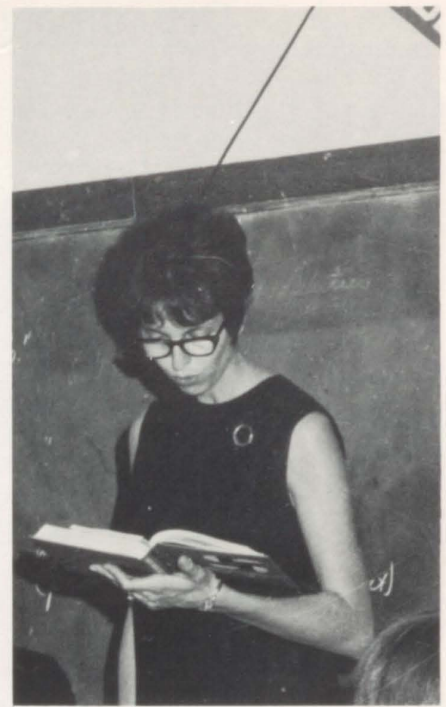

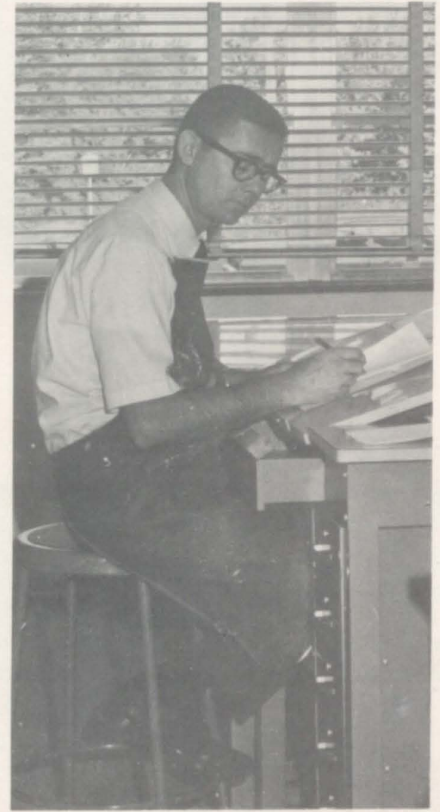

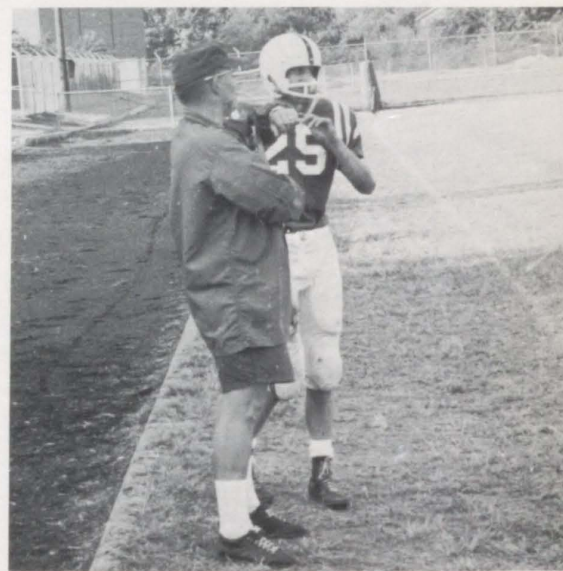

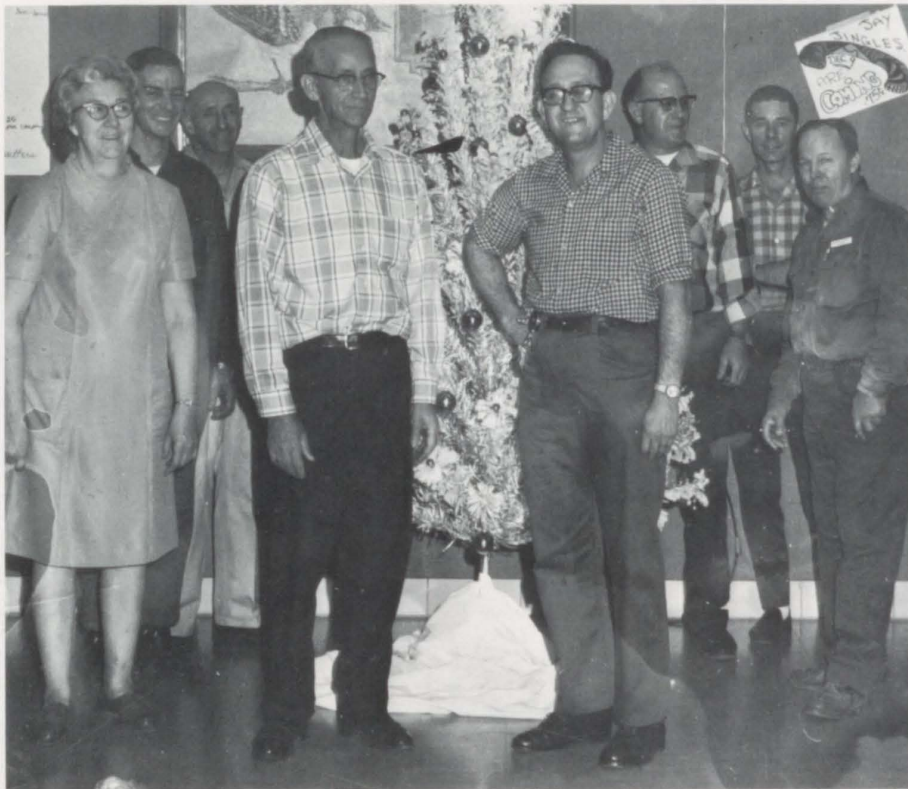

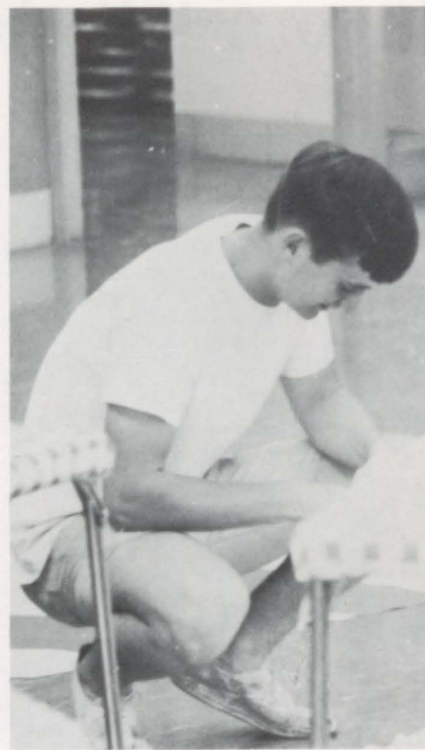

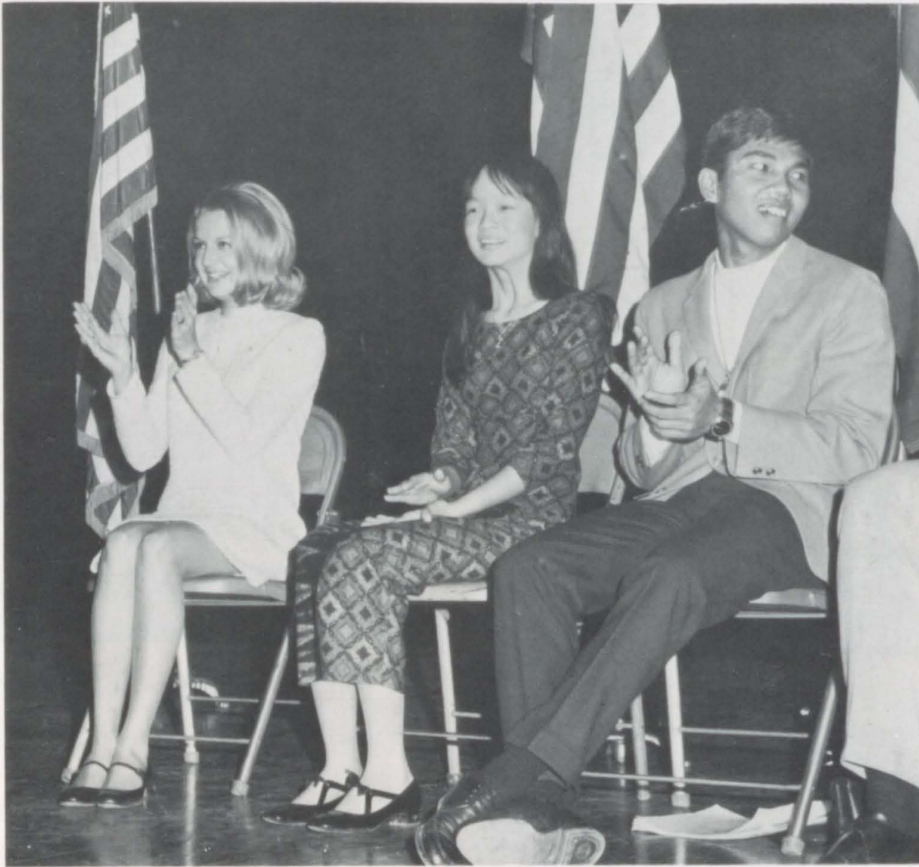

A NFL Speech Tournament Held

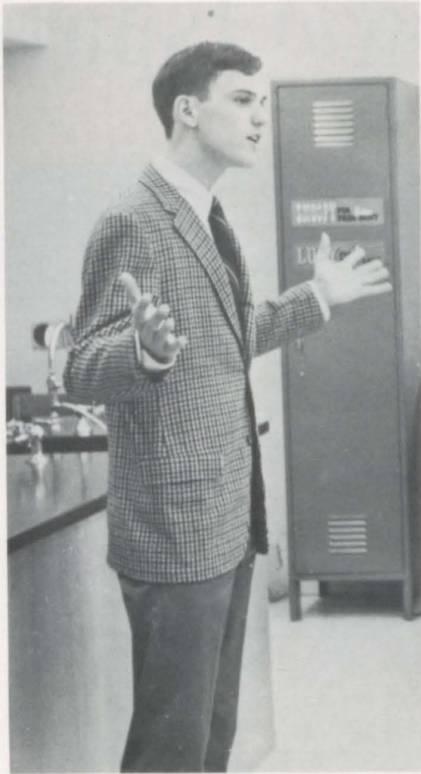
Demonstrating the use of the new radio equipment the speech department

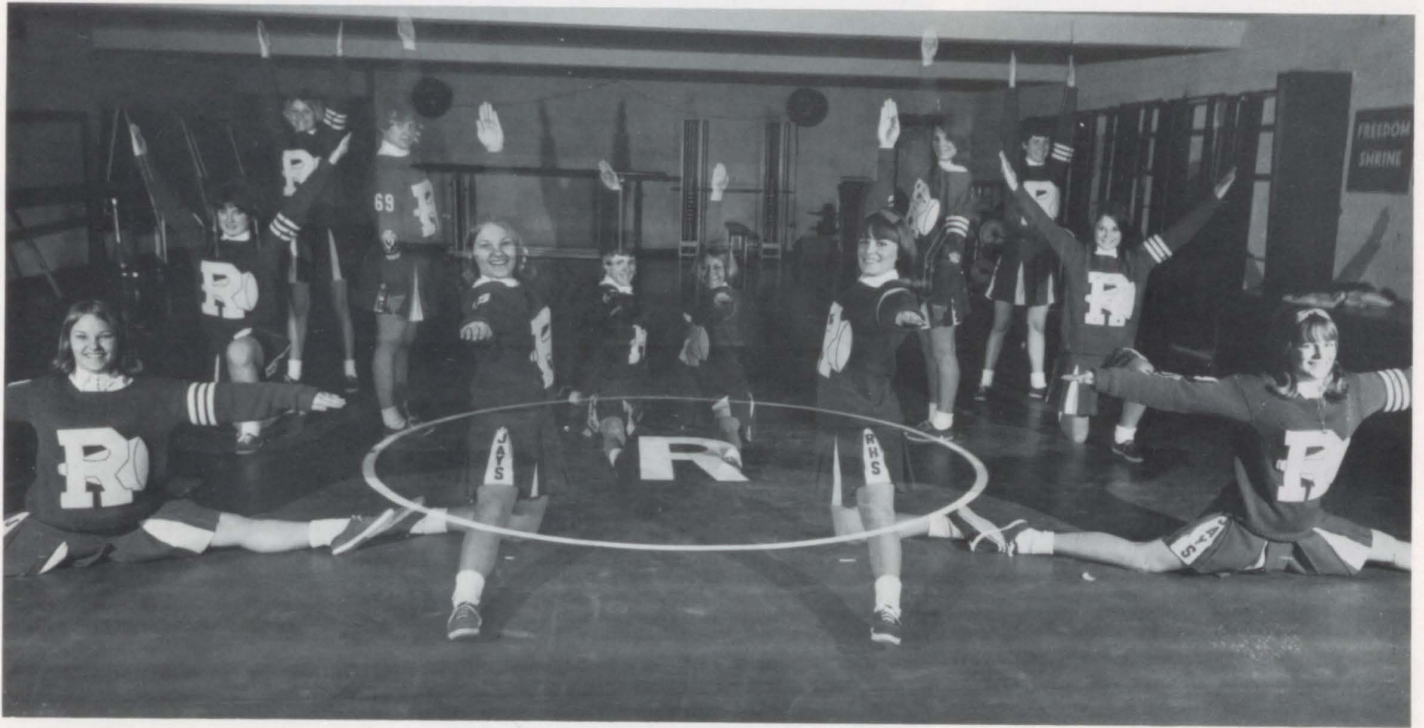

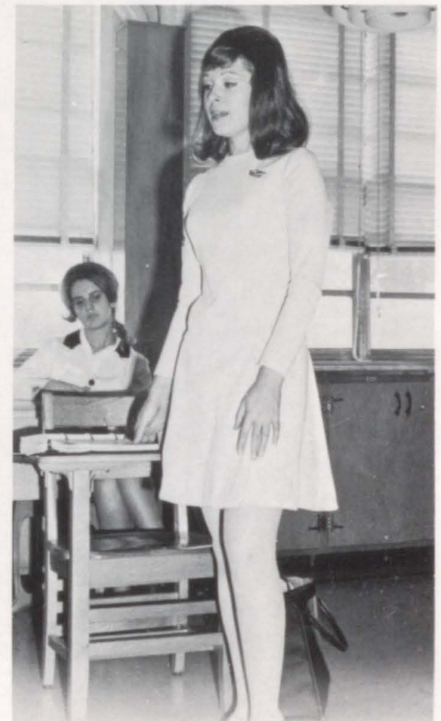
Fashion Show Sponsored by FHA

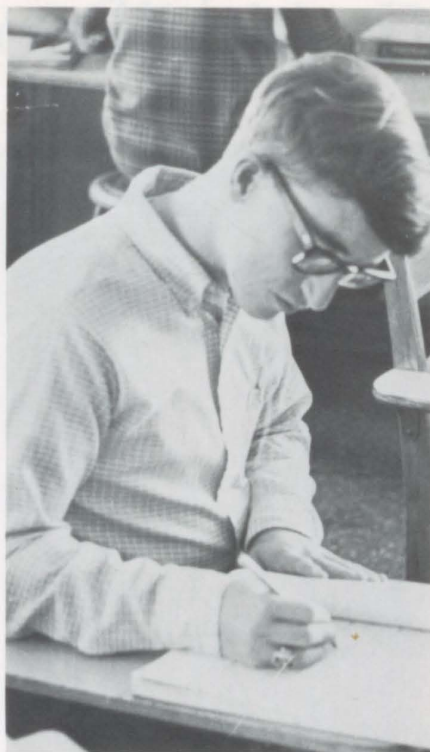

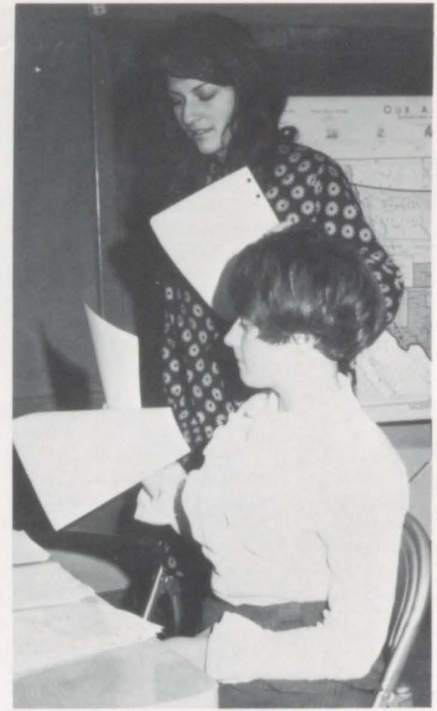

Tradition — a Christmas Formal

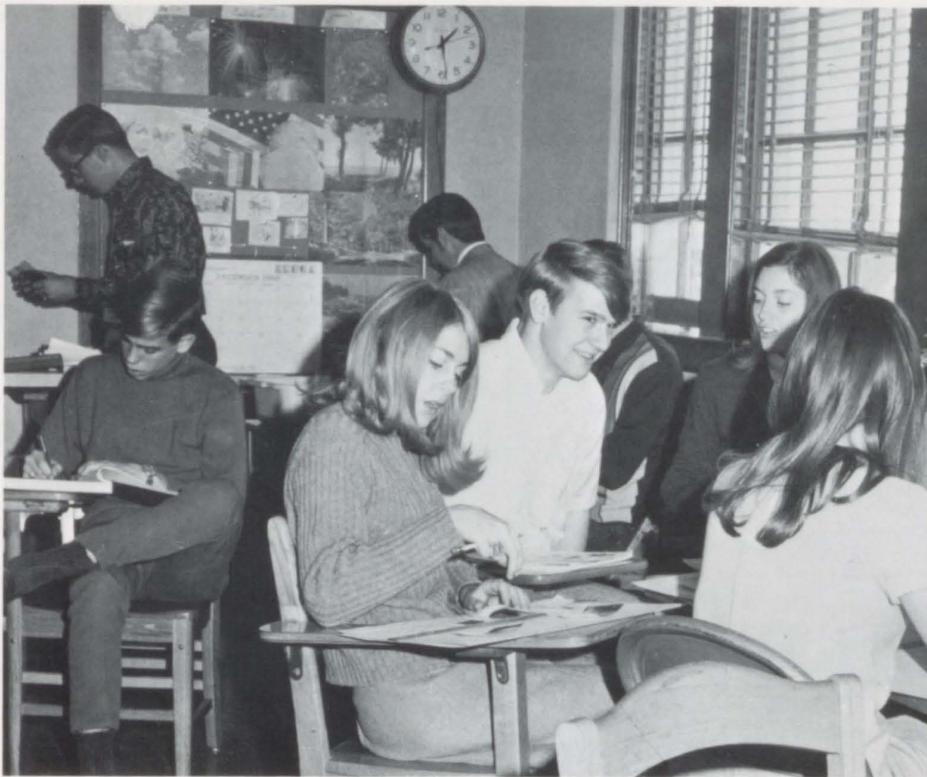

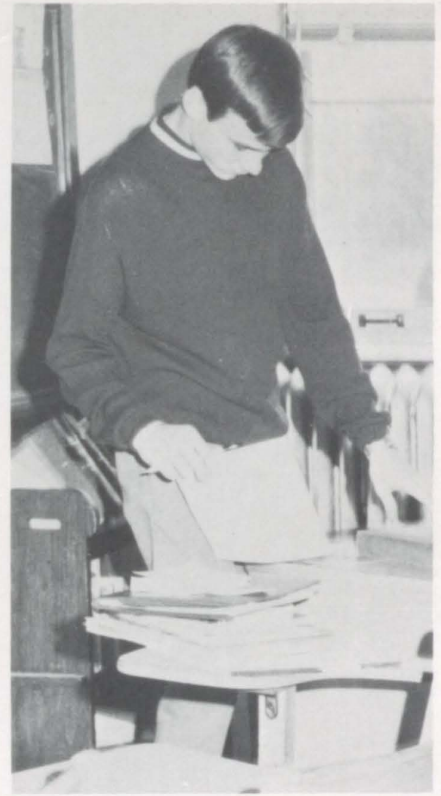

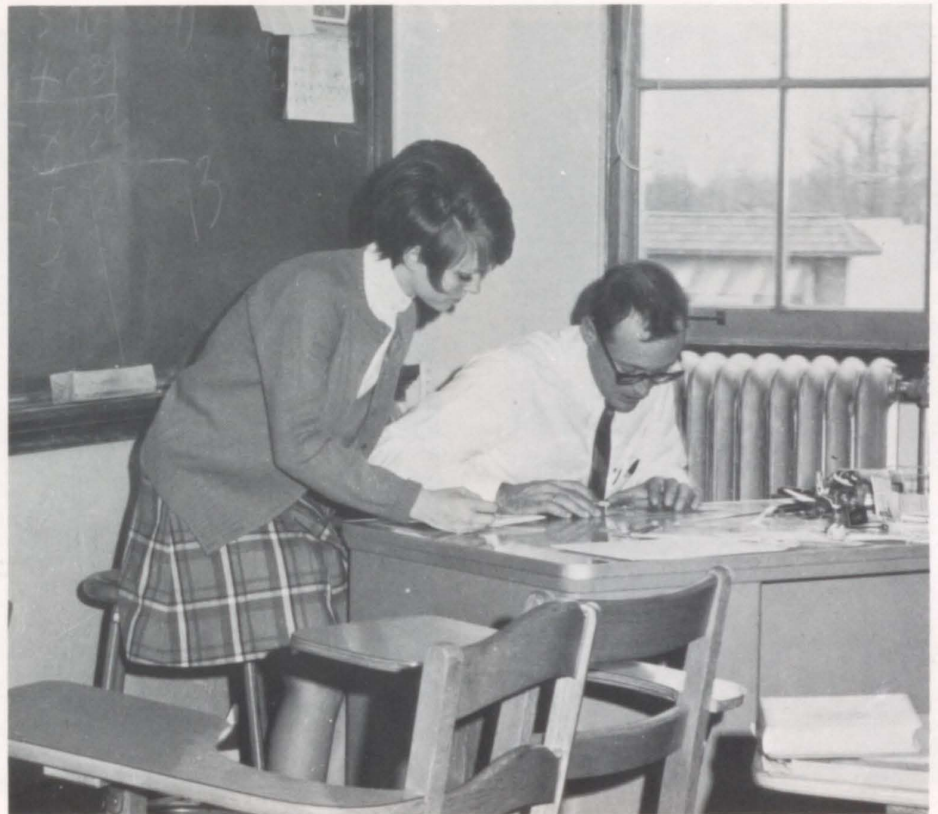

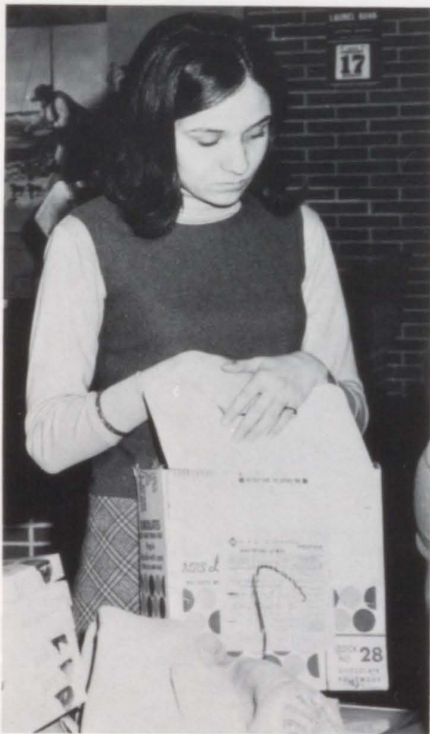

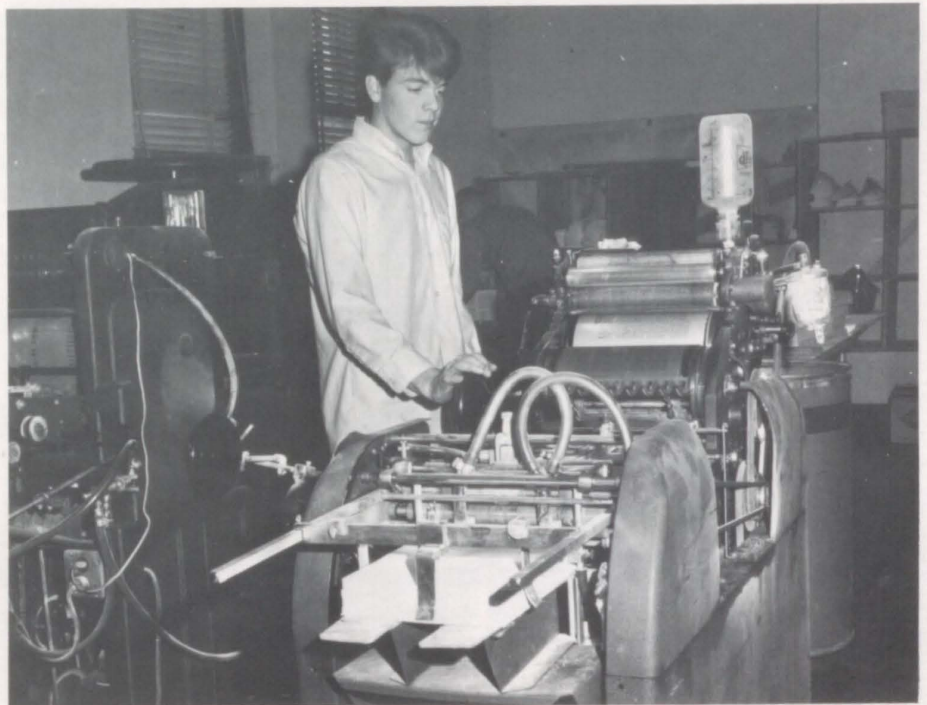

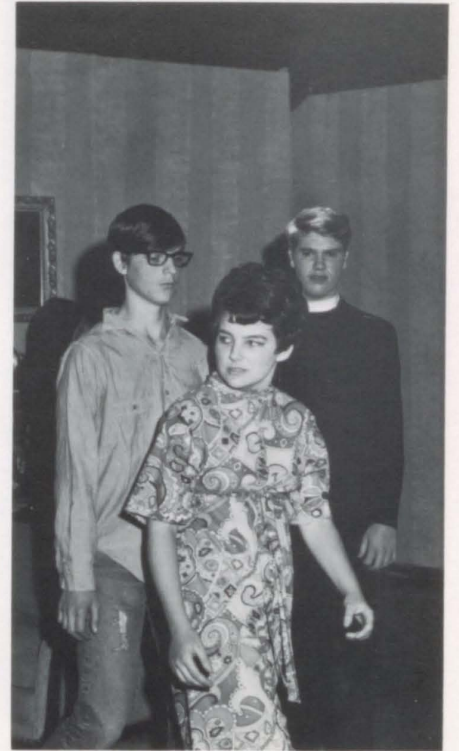

Both the boy's and girl's glee elect officers. The president of girl's glee this year is Patsy Hamby, and the president of boy's glee is Jay Overstreet.

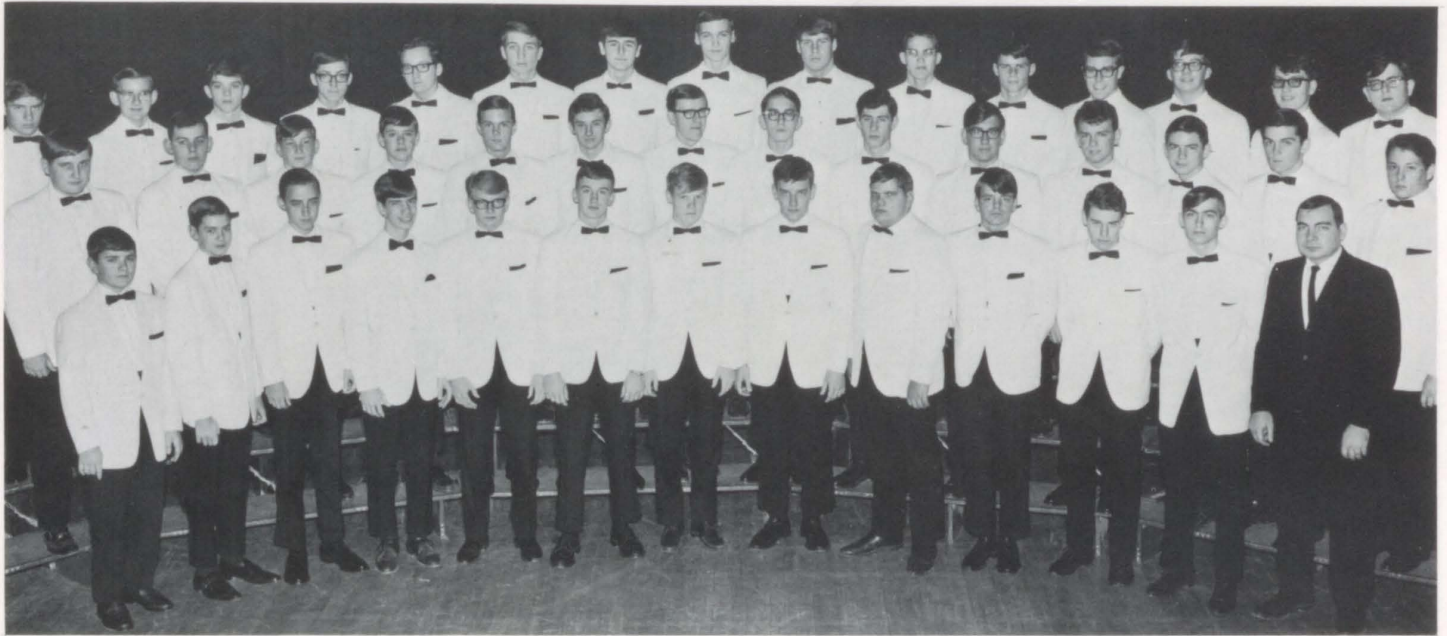

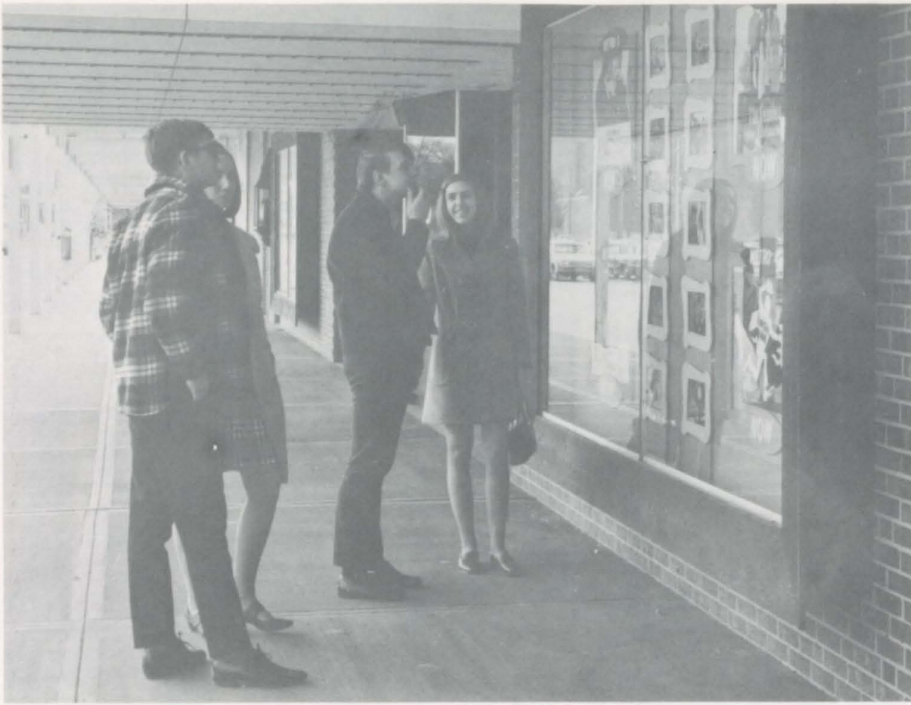

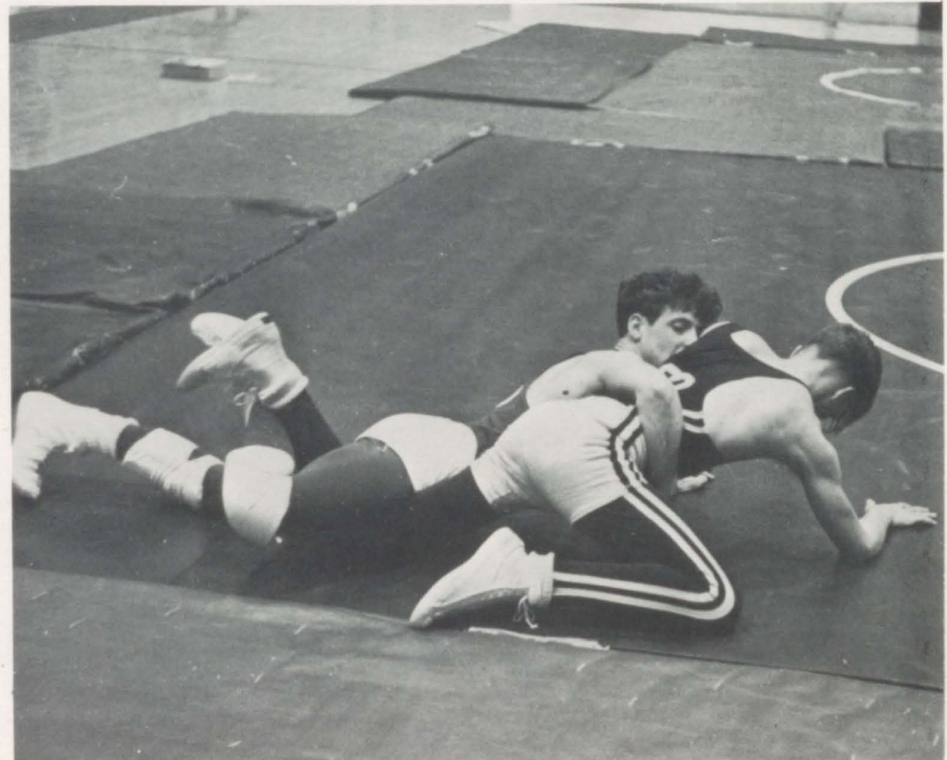

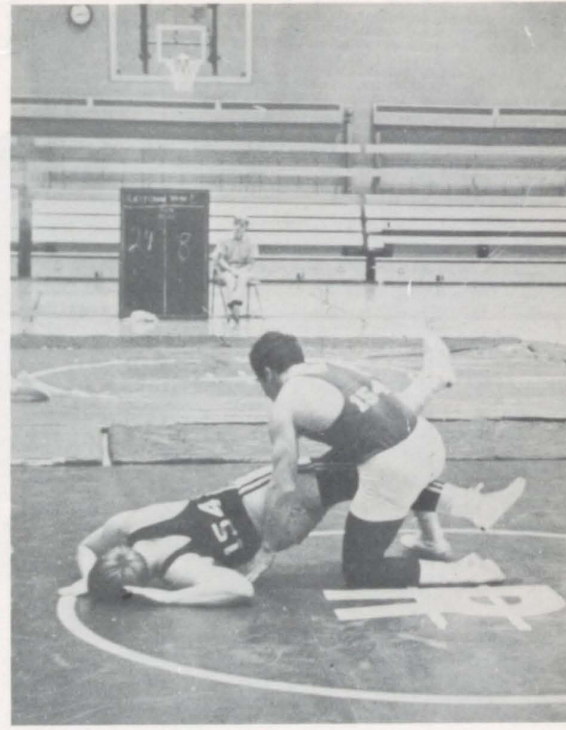

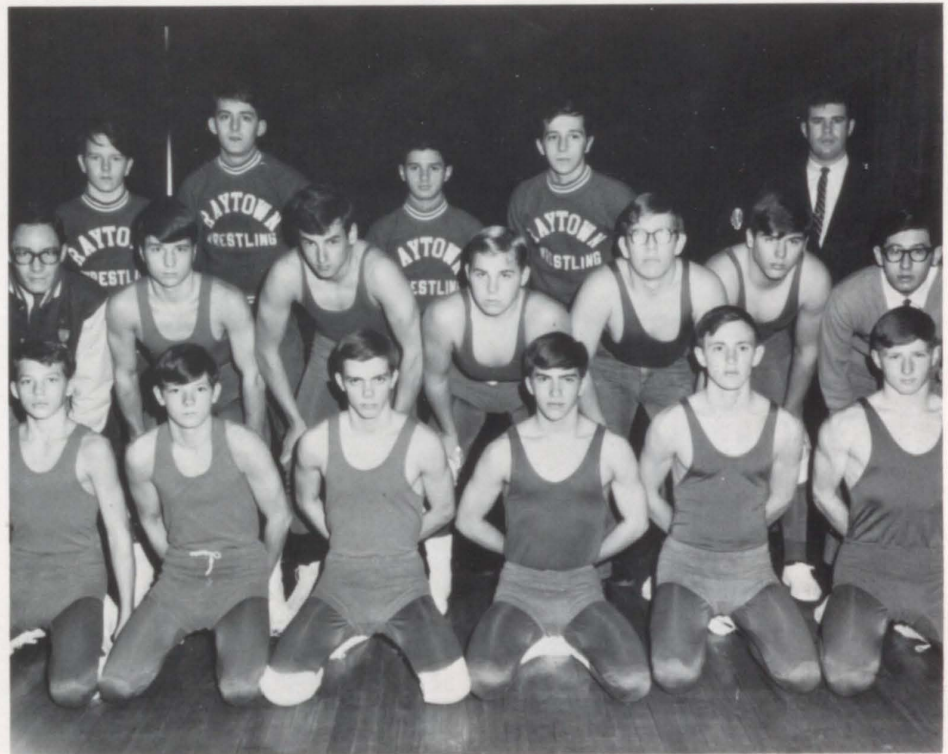

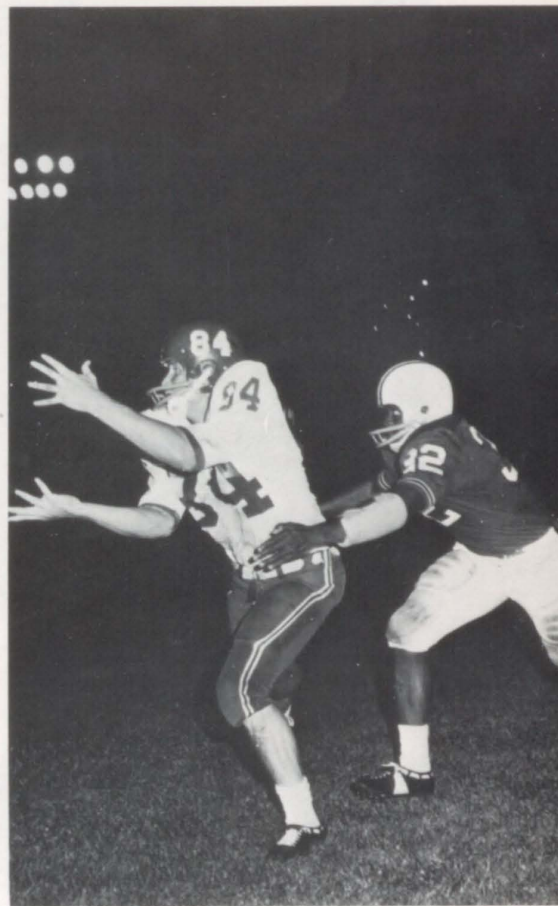

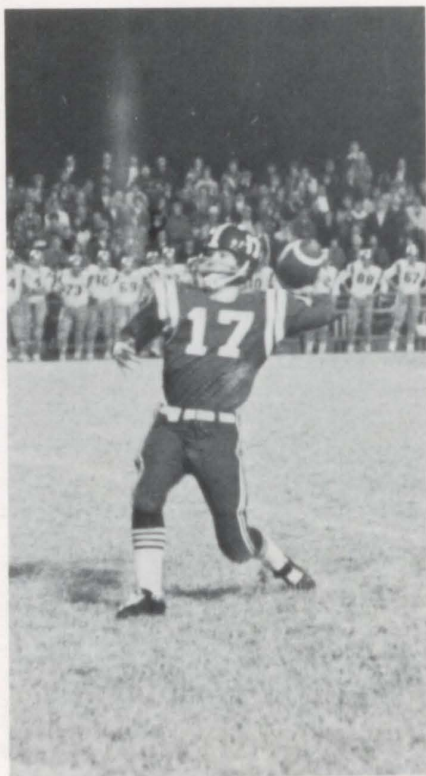

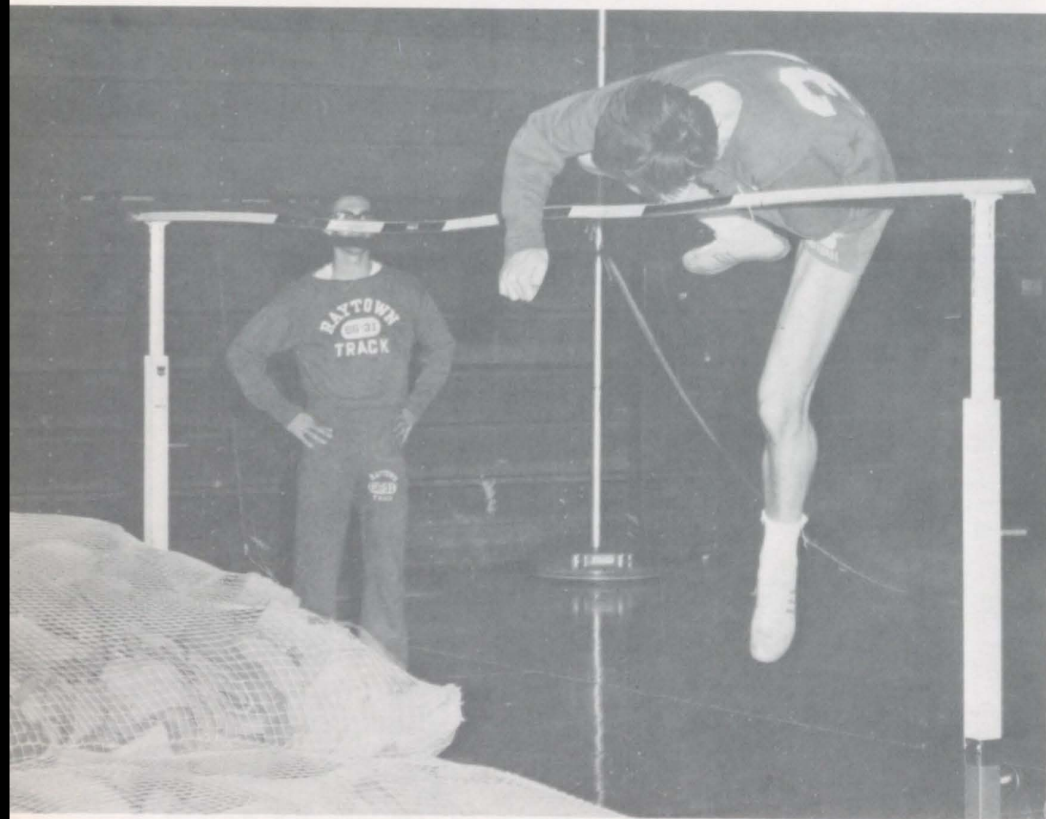

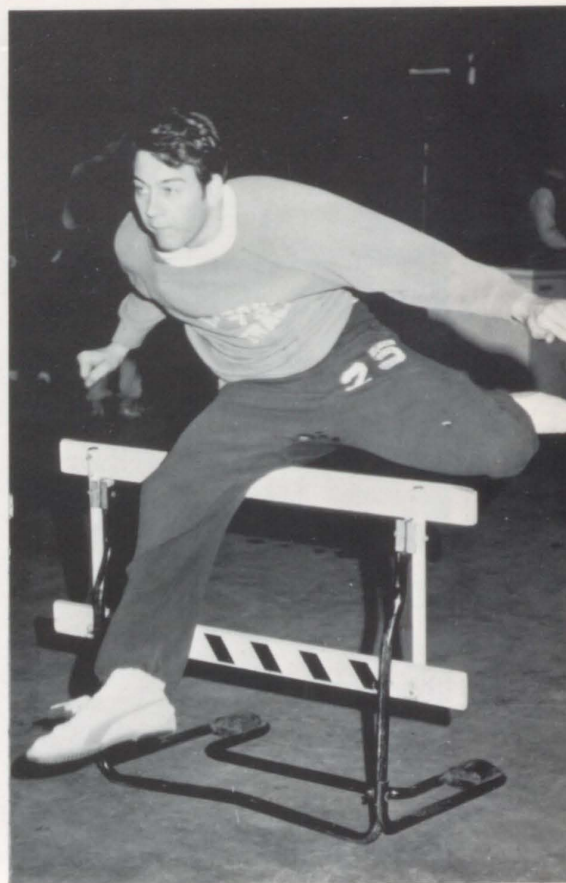
Leading the 1969 conference race was the Raytown track team. This season the trackmen sped past Suburban Eight competition to place themselves as one of the top ranking teams in the area.

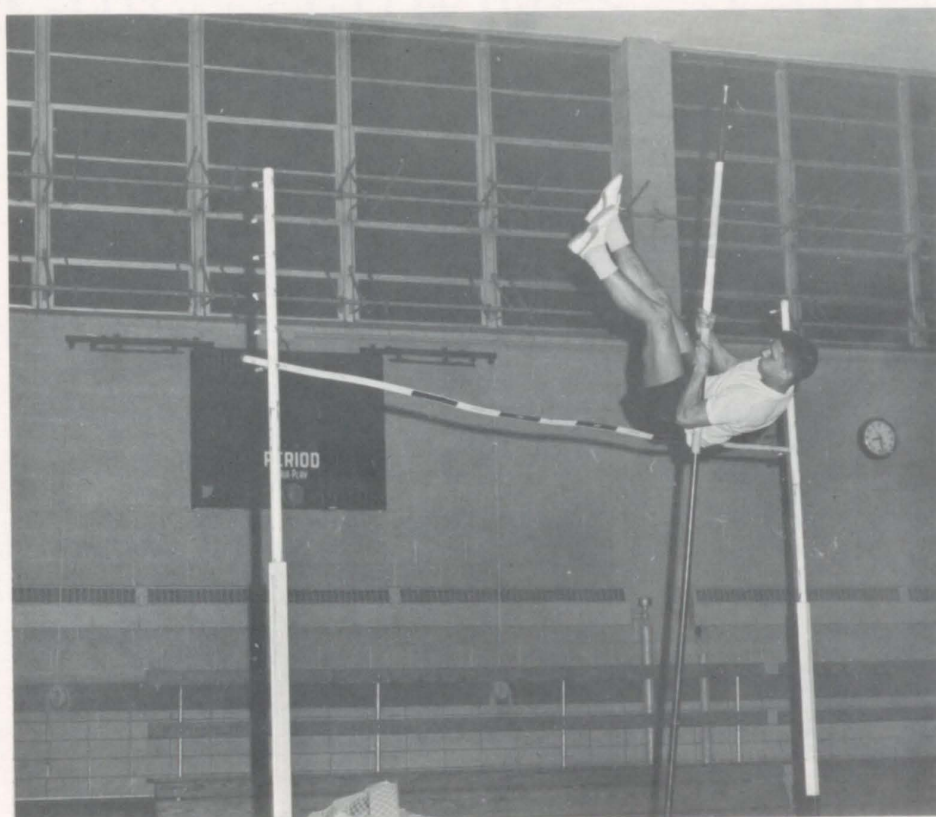

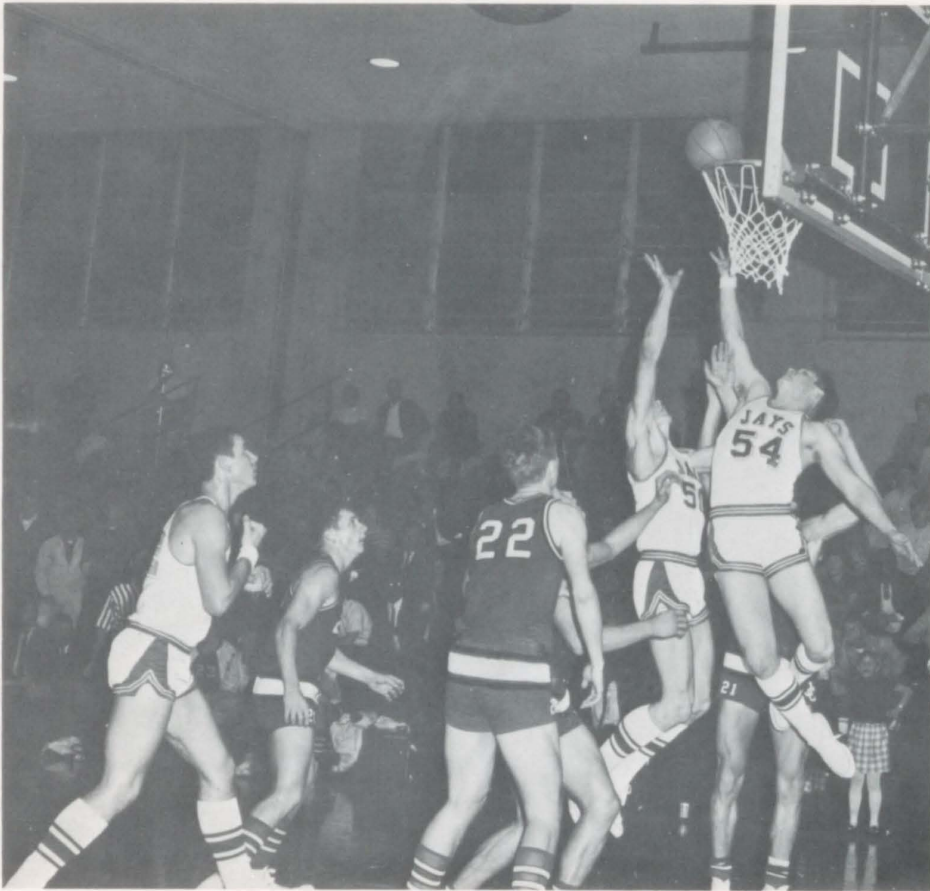

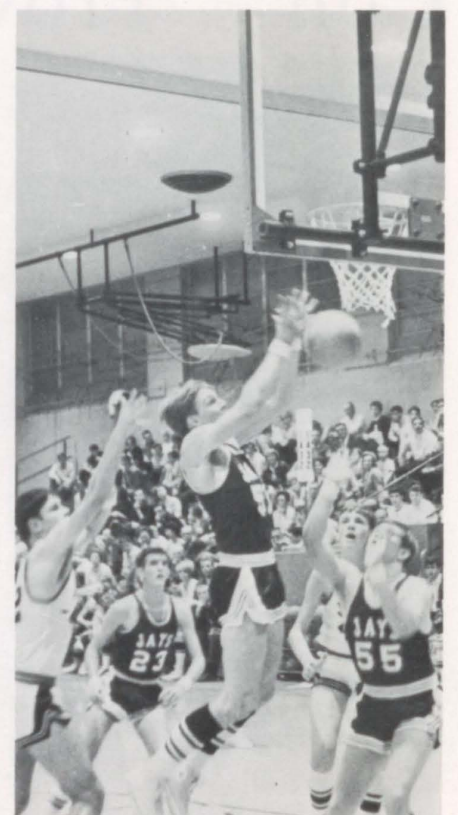

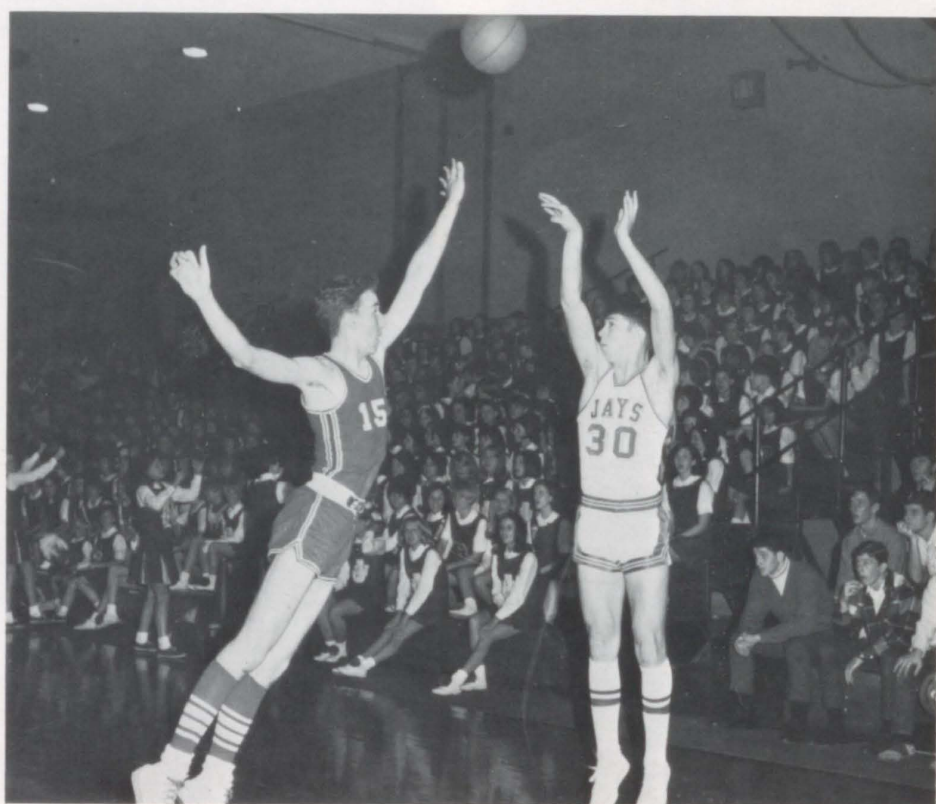
