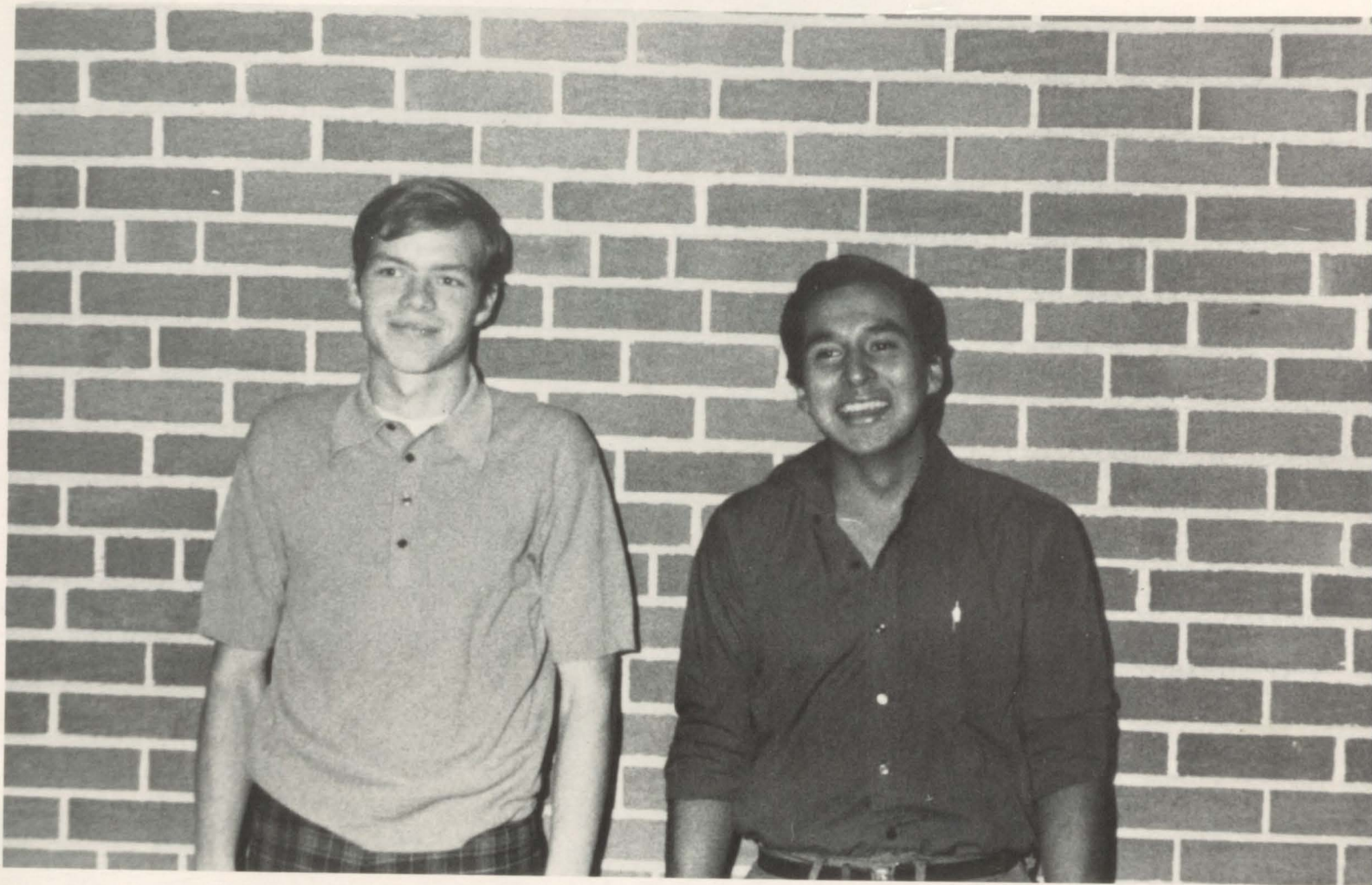
Your spirit is just incredible! Before I came here, I really did not expect that school life would contain so much fun besides the work.

triumphant year for girls' sports

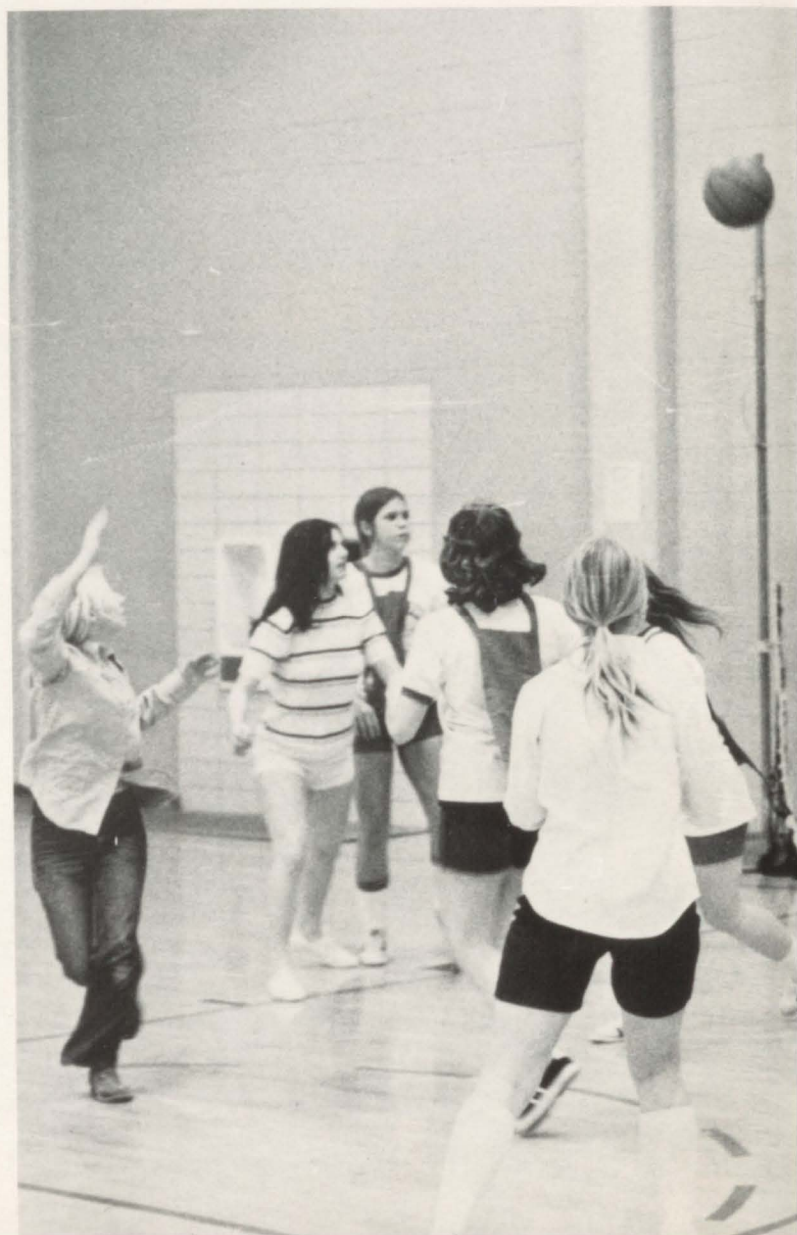

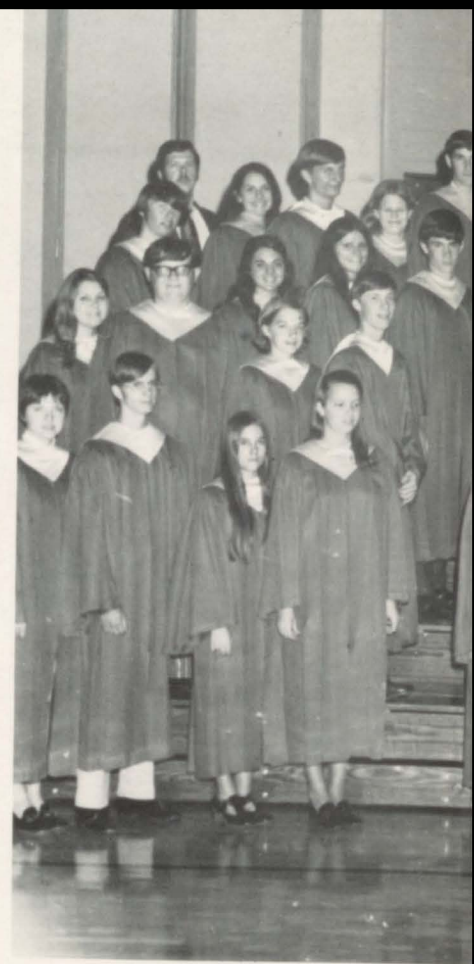




singing southerners

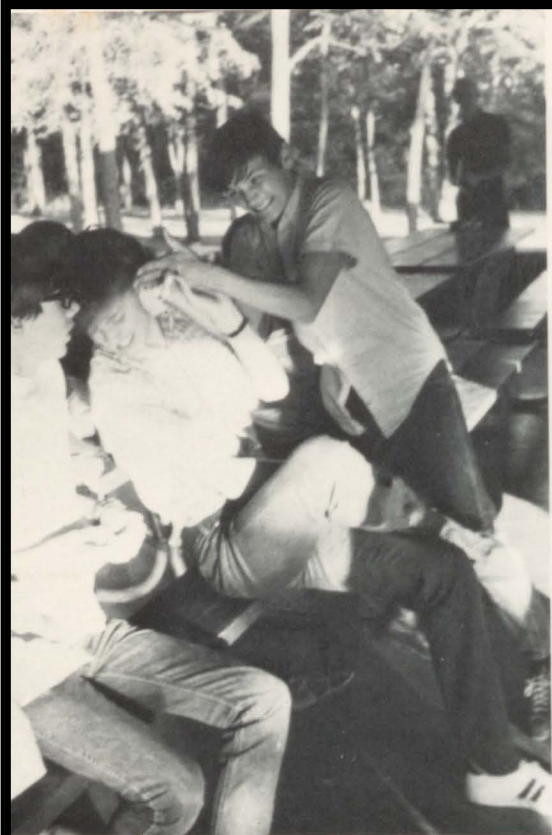
jazz lab band

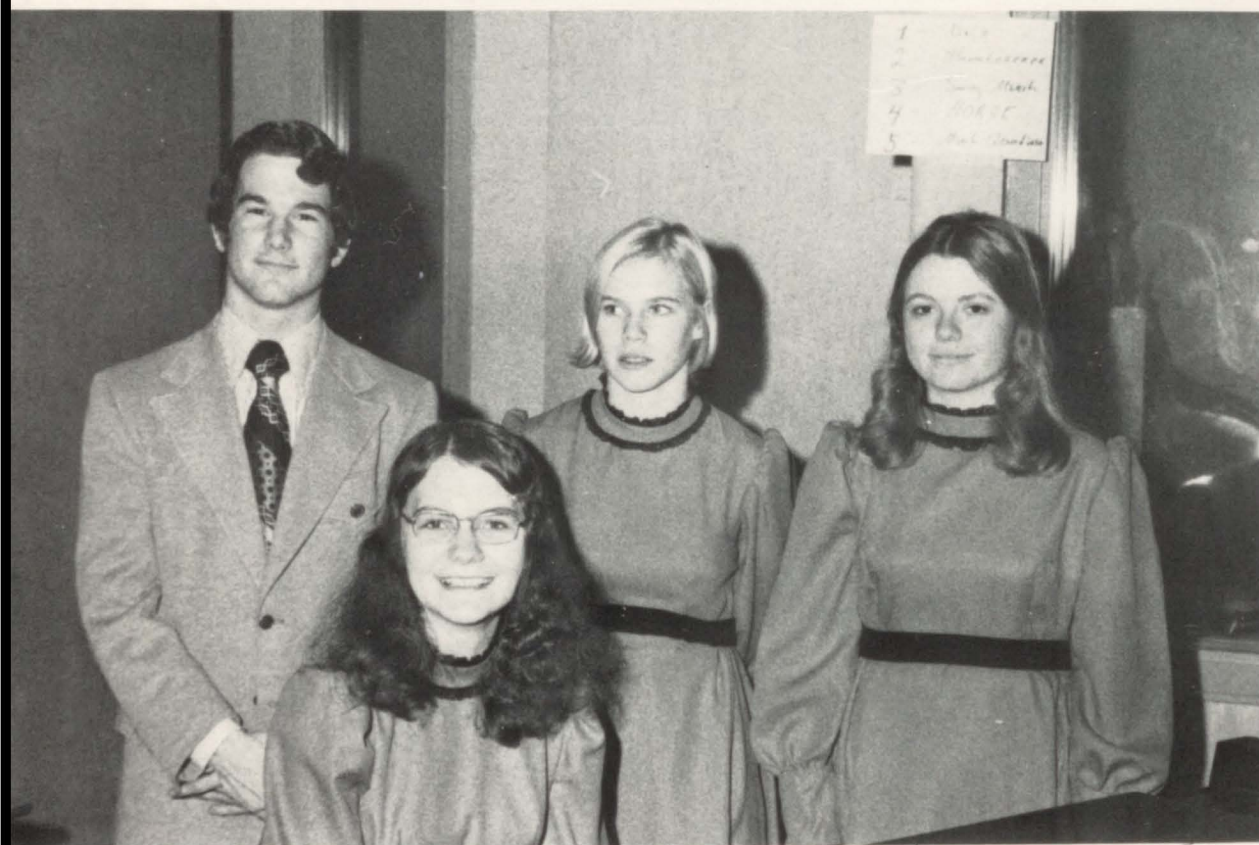
concert band

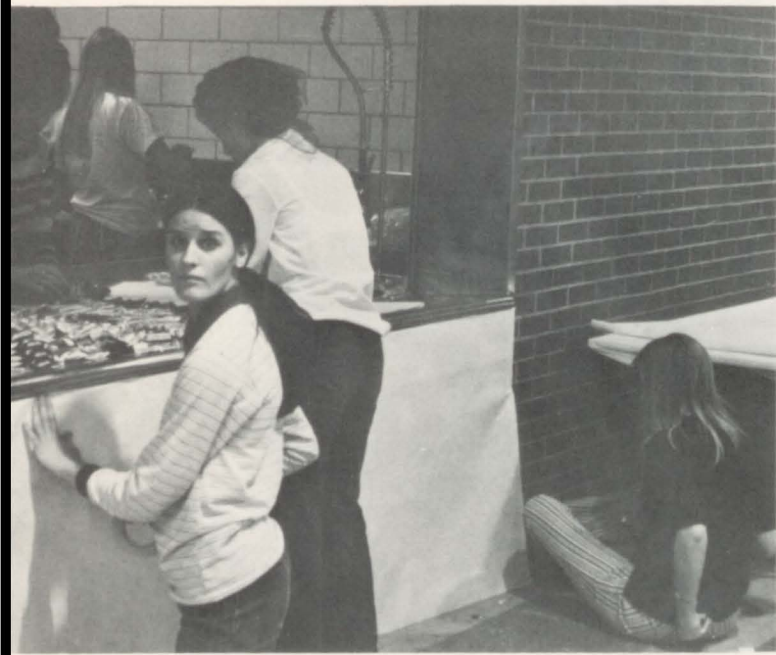

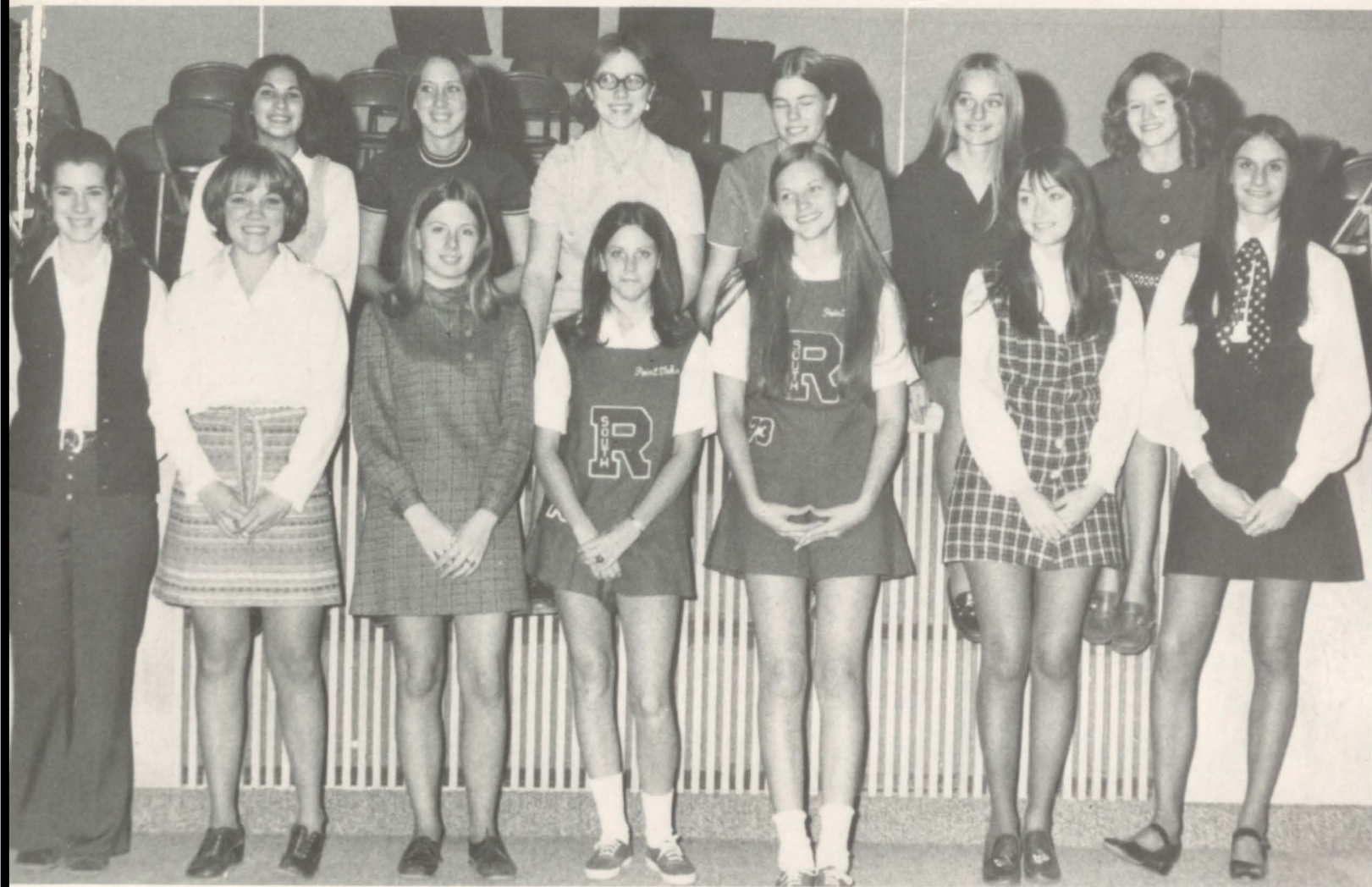

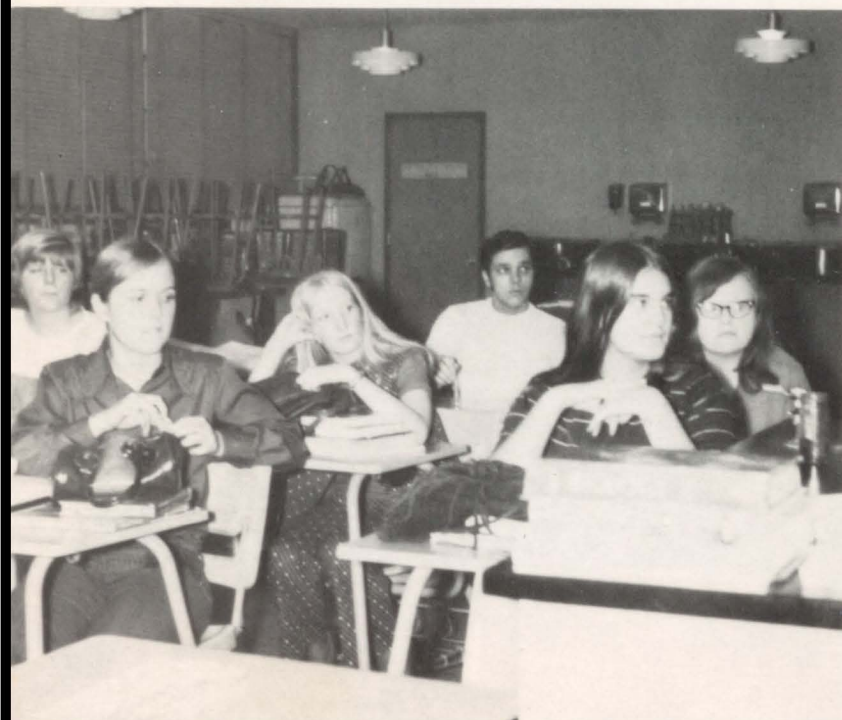

earth defenders

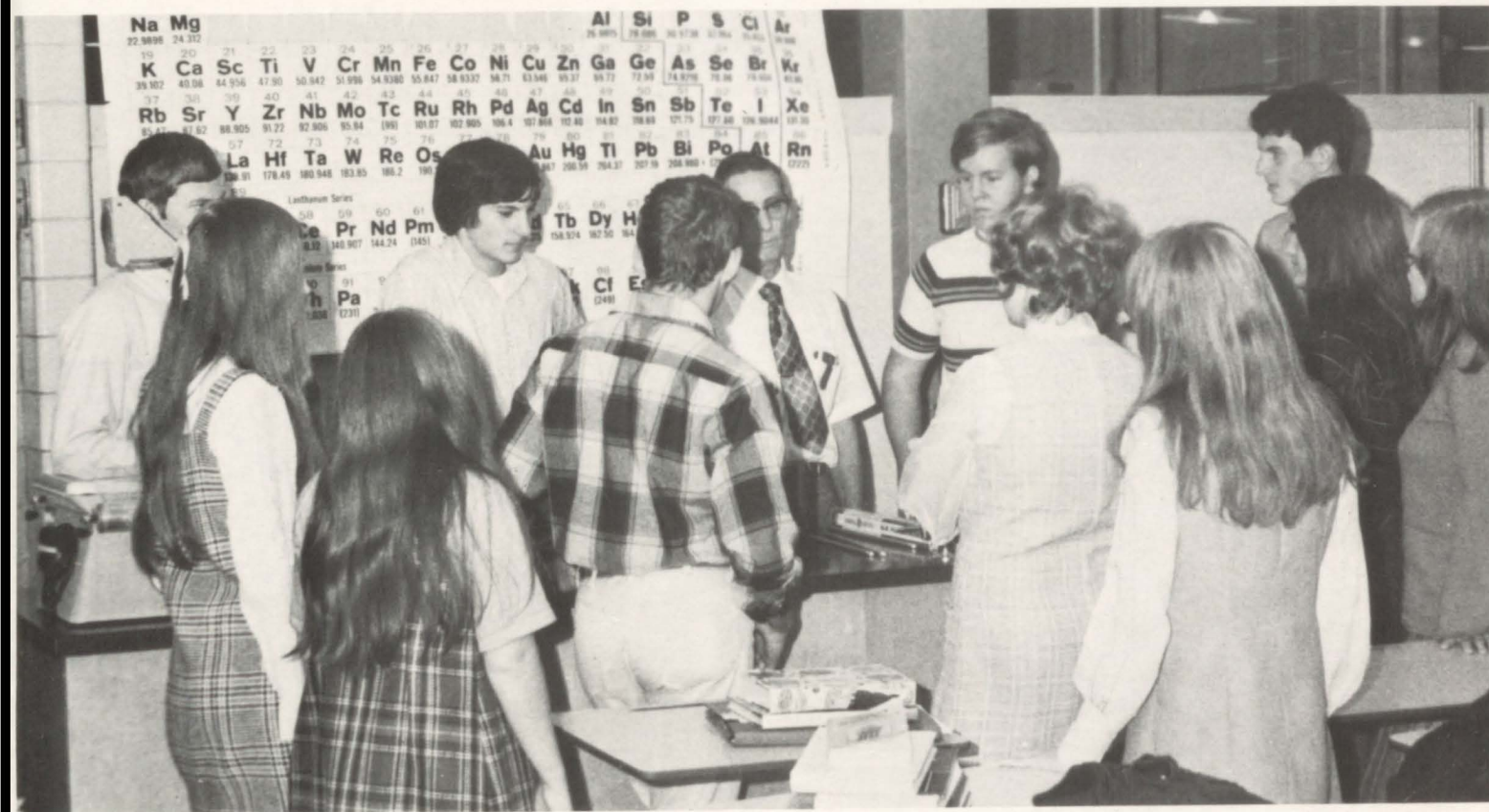

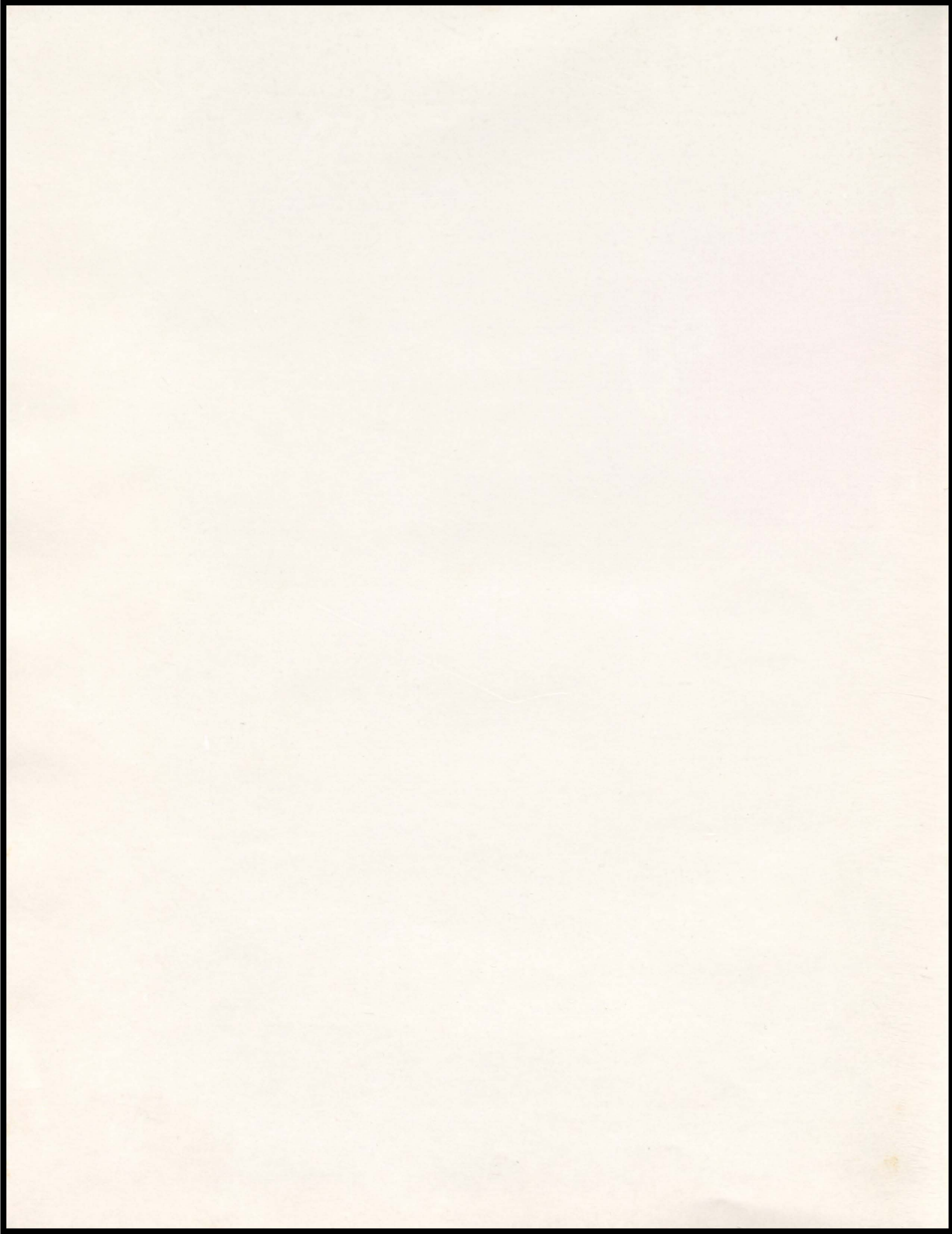
