Fitness Craze

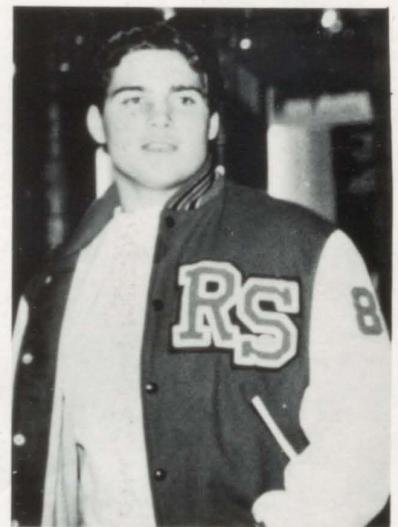

Although muzak interests vary from new wave, hard rock and soul to jazz, easy listening and country, everyone agrees that you can't live without it!

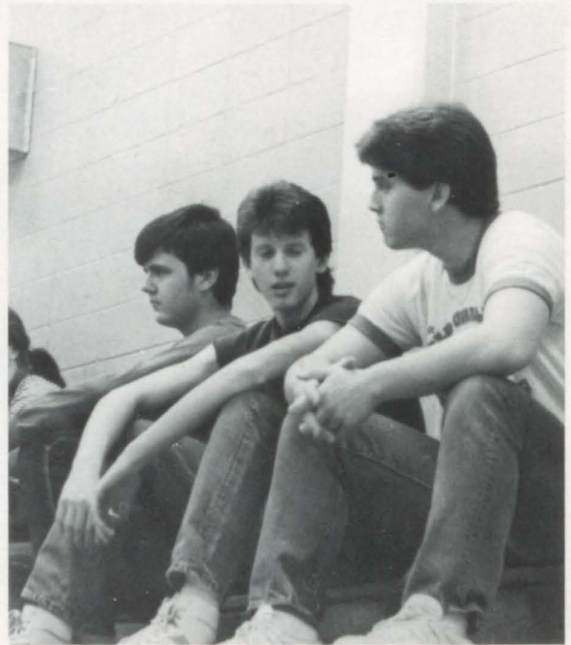

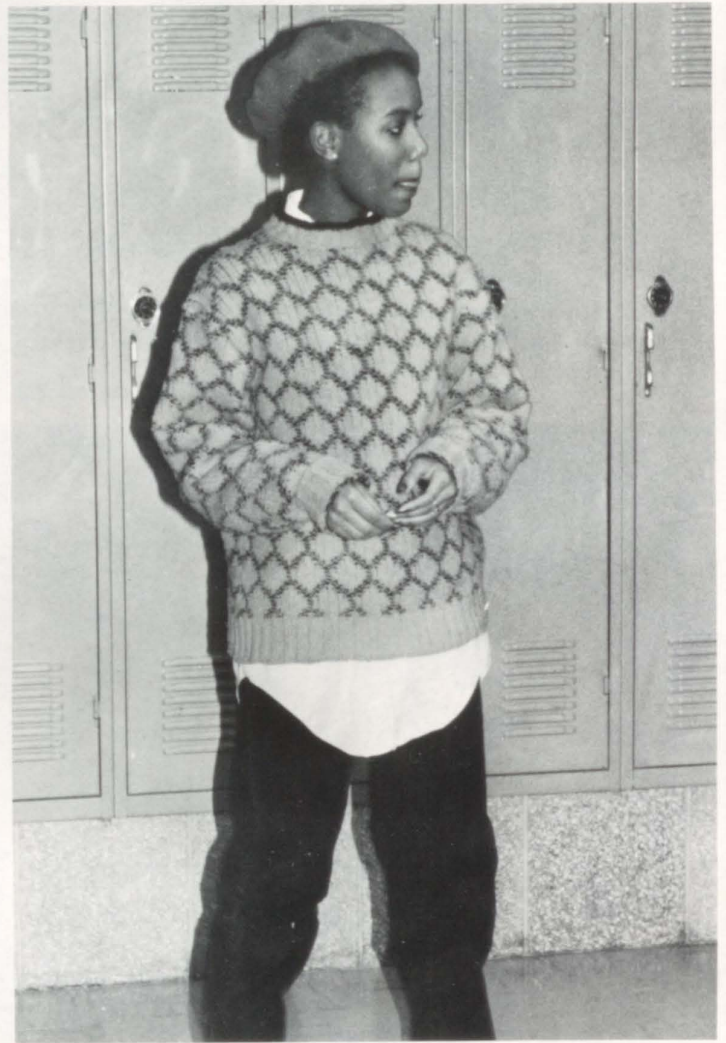

parents and teachers participated in the Fun Run. The most popular activity was the all school tug-of-war. The winners received a pizza party.



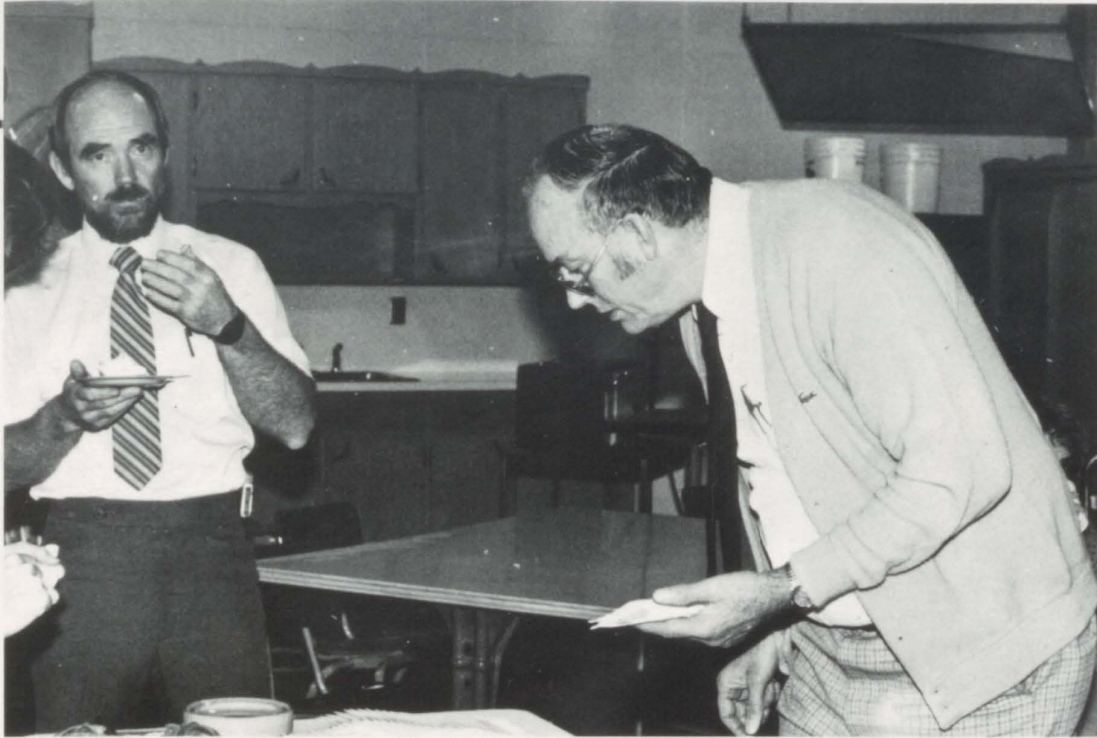

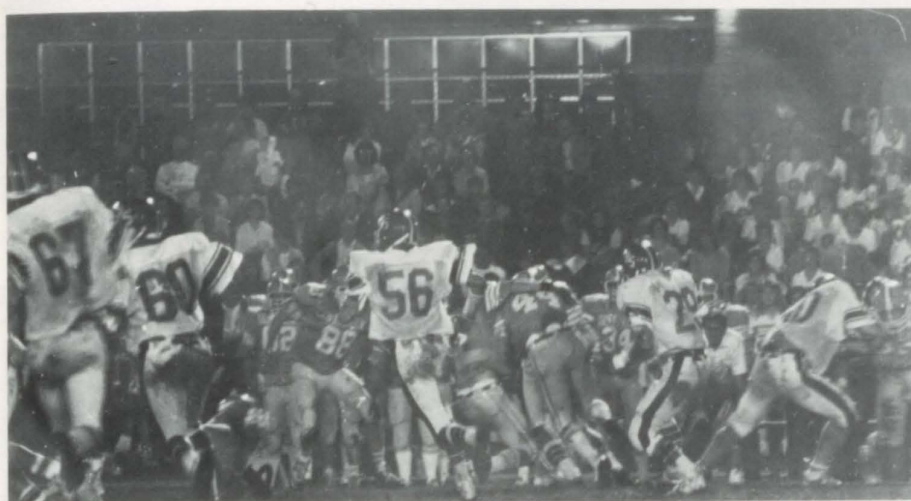

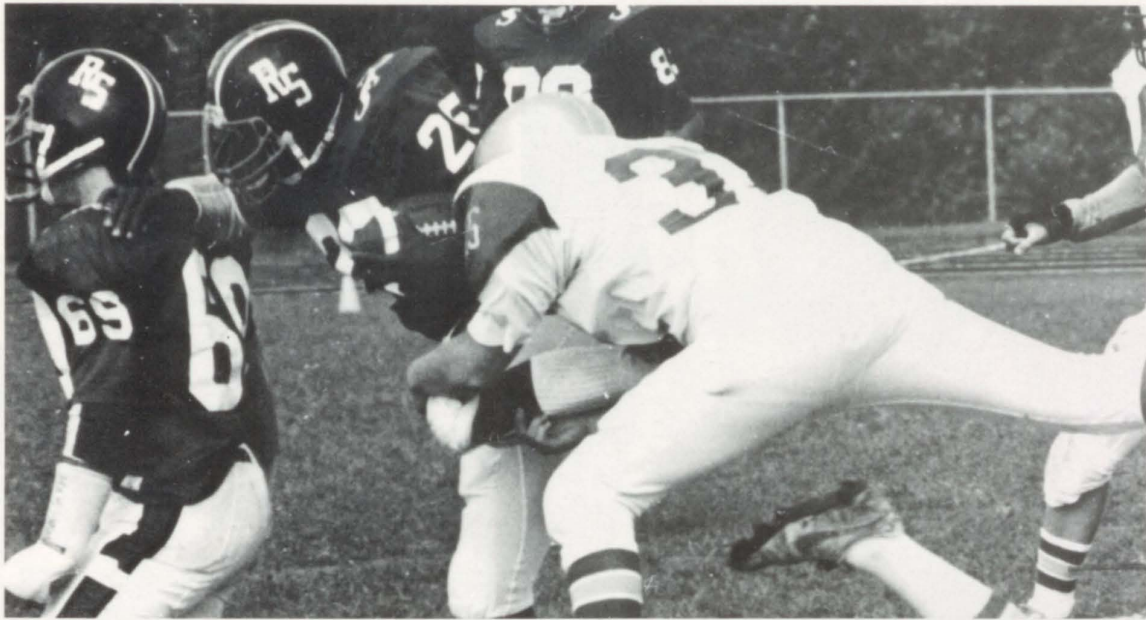

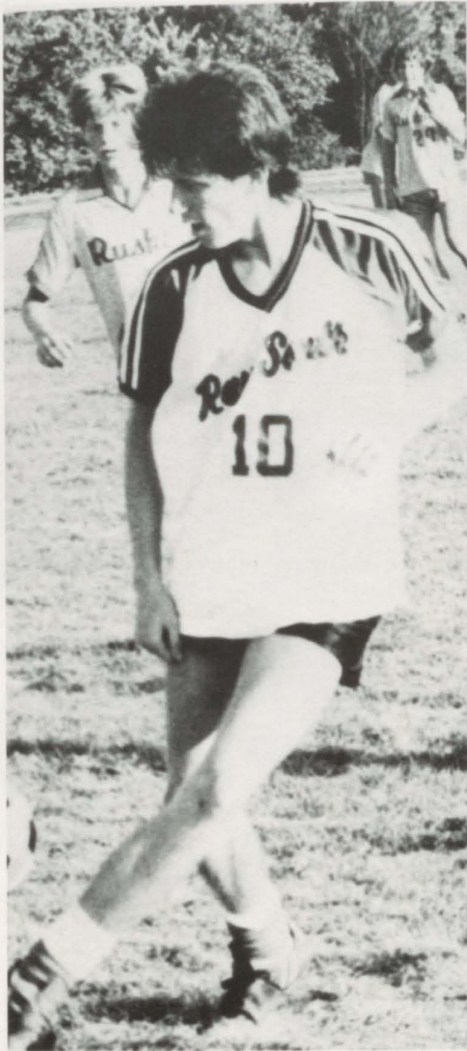

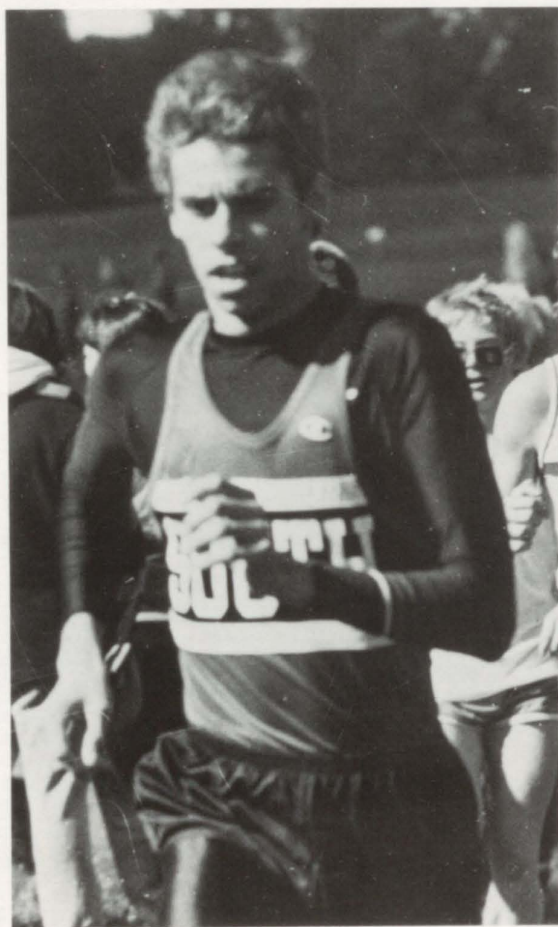

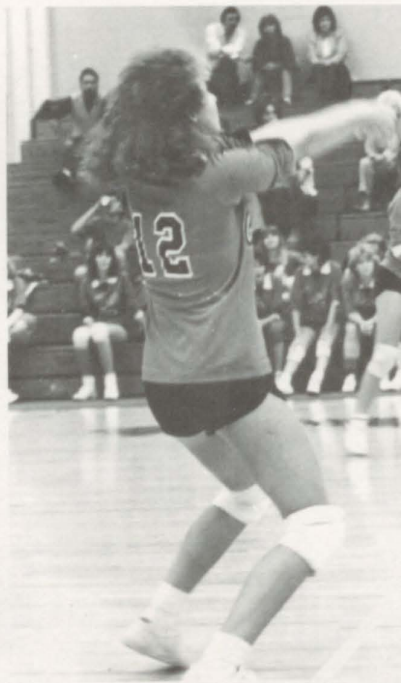

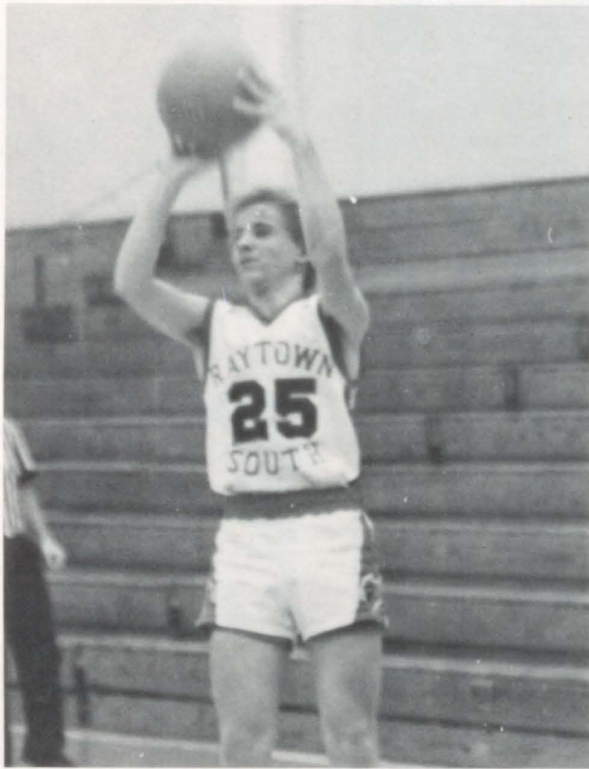
