
SEARCH FOR KNOWLEDGE



OUTSTANDING SCIENCE SCHOLARS





Cardinals Win Conference


The Cardinal football team had a hopeful outlook for the 1987 season. During the summer, five players journeyed to Texas Christian University to learn a new wishbone offense.






by Injuries and Inexperience
















FRESHMEN BALLERS!


J.V. Wrestlers Grapple For

Students were treated to a rare five day weekend as cold weather and snow brought about a harsh winter.




